February Fishing Forecast

Hopefully, February brings a break from the strong winds we have been experiencing. We have also had to endure some cold air and water temperatures. Unfortunately, these cold- water temps have had an affect some of our snook, catfish, and bait population.

As far as the inshore fishing goes, the trout bite keeps getting better. Try fishing deep holes on an outgoing tide by jigging with just enough weight to reach the bottom but not "hold "the bottom. Artificial baits, live baits, and fresh dead baits will all work with this technique. For the redfish (enjoy the clear water while we have it!), try sight fishing your favorite flat (a mid-afternoon outgoing tide will provide the warmest water opportunities). Just like hunting – stealth is essential! For the inshore slam, you can also target nice sized flounder this month. My favorite flounder bait is a red ¼ ounce jighead with a mud minnow.

Flounder is an ambush predator; therefore, target them by slowly dragging the minnow through holes or around structure.

In the surf, bluefish are eating anything thrown near them! Hard plastic baits, any shiny metal with a hook attached, or live or dead bait – as long as it is moving they will check it out. Black drum and whiting will also be available by fishing shrimp or cut bait on the bottom. Local pier fishermen (Flagler County residents will still have to travel) will want to fish the structure with sand fleas or fiddler crabs to take advantage of the sheepshead and black drum population while the water temperatures are still low.

Offshore anglers will want to take advantage of any days where the wind is not howling. The rewards for making it to the ledge will be large wahoo! Fast trolling dark lure combinations including black, red, and purple should allow for a full fish box. On the bottom, anglers can expect to find big schools of large trigger fish and some large cobia on the wrecks and reefs.

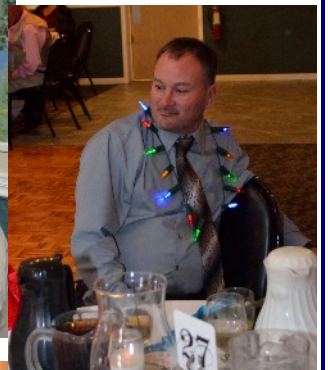

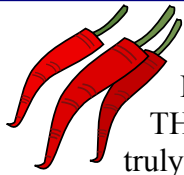

Meeting Called to order at 7:30 PM by President, Chuck Gleichmann

Passing of November Minutes: Minutes of November 07, 2017 meeting were passed, motion made by Diana MacDonald and seconded by Tim Miller.

Treasurer's Report: Gary Fisher said that the 2017 year finished with a cushion in our checking account. The 2018 budget has been published in the Chum Line. He gave the club members a promo of the Chum Line, that you can contact people you know that have a business and for \$100.00 for the year, they can put a copy of their ad or business card in the Chum Line. Bings Landing weigh in station has lost our box for the weigh in slips, so if you weighed in any fish at Bings and do not see your results on her sheet, let her know and give her a copy of your weigh in slip. These results will be finalized by Feb. 2, 2018, if there are no errors. Two club records were set in 2017, C.J. Johnston for Mackerel and Gene Morrow for Tuna. 10 Minute Break

Tommy began the evening by telling us how boats are built today as opposed to 15 years ago. In the 70 & 80's, builders added fiberglass and that added strength to the boats. Adhesives and glues have also changed when it comes to mounting the engines. The mounts for the engines have been replaced with lighter weight materials that are better. Toggle bolts are used now, it is a pair of zip ties on a stainless washer. 3M makes sealants, bonding adhesives and compounds and you have to make sure you use the proper products. 3M's 4200 is a less aggressive product to use and it has UV protection. Rodney is the owner of the company and he works in the service dept, he teaches the young mechanics. His advice is to pick a time of year to maintain your boat and engine. Fiberglass needs true bolting. You can get a rust ring around the cleat – stainless – not stain free – hole was driven by a metal drill, so it has metal in it, you must blow it out and make sure it is clean from the metal in it. The way to get rid of the rusting is use a rubbing compound polish for stainless. You need to open up the bilge and dry it out to avoid mold and mildew. Open the hatch when you are storing it, air it out. A rigging grommet acts like a chimney, open up the center console to let moisture out of the boats. For engine maintenance, put a 50 watt light bulb in there to help dry it out. Try to do your

service maintenance between Nov – 1st of Feb., after March, it is hard to get an appointment for servicing. If you store your boat, cover it and open every hatch in the boat under the covers, you will have less mildew and electrical corrosion. If you have cushion mildew, use Magic Eraser on them, but don't use it on shiny areas, it is an abrasive product. Don't use bleach on cushions, it will rot the stitches. If you can afford them, use AGM Batteries, he has some that are four years old in his boat. They are lead acid batteries, it is best to get rid of batteries after 3 years, as preventive maintenance. Clean the terminals on batteries every 3 months, solid tight, use nuts not wing nuts. Use dielectric grease, air corrodes your battery. You don't need to use too much of the grease, rub it on the battery posts to help the energy go through it and also use it on your fish finder, put some on the plug or turn off the battery to prevent having corrosion. Be careful with the products you use to wash the boat. If boat is washed with acids, it will affect the stainless and you should use gel coats that protect it from the sun. Wax and polish as much as you can. These were some great tips for our boat owners.

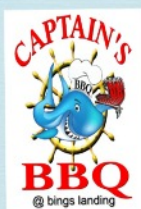
