### July Fishing Forecast

Capt. Jim Britton saltytalesfishingcharters.com Even though we will have some brutal heat heading our way, a look back at last years fishing log makes me anxious for July to get here! For inshore fishing, this time of year, get out early and rig up several top water plugs. I usually have one "walk-the-dog" (zara spook jr.) style plug and one "chugger" (storm chug bug) ready to go. Redfish should go crazy for these plugs on the flats and fishing deeper areas should produce nice trout. These same plugs can also be used later in the day around bulkheads or docks for some fun ladyfish and jack crevalle action. If you can not get out early, try the same tactics around dusk for similar results or fish after dark for the busy trout and snook (catch and release only as the season is closed) bite around dock lights.

Offshore anglers will continue to find schools of dolphin. Looking for the

telltale signs (birds or weed lines) in 130 feet or deeper should be the keys to filling the fish box. Bonita and blackfin tuna may also make their way into the trolling spread. Bottom fishing reports are looking promising also. Mangrove snapper from 5 to 15 pounds are being pulled off of many different wrecks and reefs. The reefs will also hold the normal residents like sea bass, trigger, porgy, grouper and amberjack. As of time for print, there is still no decision on when the Atlantic red snapper season will be and for how long. Let's cross our fingers for an opening by the end of this month!

For those looking to fish nearshore July will be a great month to continue targeting kingfish, cobia, tarpon, and shark. These same species should also make their way within casting distance of the pier. Surf and pier fishermen will also be able to target pompano, flounder, whiting and bluefish.

Remember sun protection and hydration, tight lines!



Club Meeting Minutes 06-05-18

**7:00 PM Quick Tips** – speaker was Commander Steven J. Brooks from the U.S. Coast Guard. Topic of discussion was boat and water safety.

Meeting Called to order at 7:30 PM by President Chuck Gleichmann

**Pledge of Allegiance**: presented by Pat Gleichmann **Passing of May Minutes**: Minutes of May 01, 2018 meeting were passed, motion was made by Dean Roberts and seconded by David Genk.

**Treasurer's Report**: Gary Fisher said the bills are paid and the money is in the bank. Gary said the Spring Classic tournament is our principal income and to show up for the free club tournament weigh ins to participate in the raffles and 50/50's. Even if you win the show up bonus of \$25.00, you get a 42% return on your investment of your club membership, you get lunch and a chance of winning other prizes. Support your fishing club.

Welcome Visitors/New Members: We had 11 guests/new members at tonight's meeting.

Announcements: Chuck Gleichmann announced that one of our sponsors, Eric from Boaters Exchange, was at the meeting. Boaters Exchange will be involved in our Guys and Dolls Tournament. Chuck Gleichmann also told us about the fishing trip, he and Walt Huresky took a few weeks ago to Belize. They fished from 7-5 PM, one day they fished for snook, and one day it was for tarpon in the morning and bonefish in the afternoon. It cost around \$1,500.00 a person, which included your hotel room, 2 days of fishing and airfare. Action Belize is the name of the company they went through. Chuck Gleichmann said they are looking into putting together a trip for next May 2019. Chuck G. gave us a CCA update – The CCA has a handout paper at the back table regarding reduced redfish catches, there may be more regulations coming - please take one. On Sunday, in Sebastian, one of the redfish that was donated at the Spring Classic was the first fish caught. The person that caught it was not registered in the CCA Star program and could not claim a prize for his catch. The redfish was released. Please sign up for the program, the cost is \$10.00 and the prizes are well worth it. All 18 fish donated are still out there waiting for someone to catch them.

Spring Tournament & check presentation: Chuck Radloff, Mike Crotts & Bill May were the chairmen on this tournament. Mike thanked the many volunteers who helped out. Chuck R. said the tournament is a lot of work in the beginning and towards the end, it becomes fun. It takes a lot of people and we appreciate all their help. A check in the amount of \$7,000.00 was presented to Ernie Morris of the Disabled American Veterans. He thanked the club and said they are looking forward to continuing to work with us in the future. He also told us that the van they have broke down and they had to use their organization's money to fix it and our donation would help with putting that money back into their savings account. As a reminder, Chuck R. said the Spring Classic is our only paid tournament now.

### REPORTS:

Weigh Master Report & member fishing reports: Rita Waddell said it has rained the past few days and the fishing

has not been that good. In the Lady Angler part for our Year Long standings, Dana Syens is in 1st place, Diana MacDonald in 2nd place and Claire McIntire in 3rd. For the Male Angler of the year, Aby Moghanaki is in 1st place, Bruce Bachman, Jr. is in 2nd place and Tim Miller is in 3rd place. Nineteen out of the twenty three species of fish in this tournament have been weighed in so far. The Fish of the Month for May was Bluefish and Jeff James was the winner with a 3.1 Bluefish. June's FOM is Any Snapper. Results for the Yearlong Tournament have been updated and you can get a hard copy at the front table.

Old Business:

**Bottom Trip**: Tim Miller said they had a good trip that day. The boat they had from last year was upgraded to a bigger one, mostly small fish were caught, Dana Syens was the big winner with a 36 ½ lb Cobia. Tim said they will have the bottom trip again in May for next year.

Surf Fishing: Roy Lawson & Diana MacDonald chaired

this tournament. Diana was absent tonight. Roy told us that the water was dirty, all that attended the weigh in said they had a great time and Roy thanked all the volunteers that helped them. He said he will see us again at next years Surf Tournament and he hopes the water will be better then. Coast Guard Commander Steven Brooks, did the Quick Tips portion of our meeting and he also addressed the members and told us that there are 11.9 vessels that are registered in the U.S. there has been 46 million dollars in damage done to those vessels and the death rate went up to 9%. The leading factor in the fatal accidents with alcohol involved is because of heat. The Coast Guard offers boating safety classes, you can get together with West Marine and they can hold classes at the store if you get 15-20 people. Operator inattention causes many accidents and boaters not wearing their life jackets. There have been 198 drownings with 122 kayaks and canoes involved. If you operate a vessel, you are required to follow the law. The police need a warrant to pull you over, but the Coast Guard can pull you over and board your boat. The Coast Guard will also give

free vessel examinations.

**June Kayak Tournament**: Miguel Pandich and Tim Loftus are the chairpersons for this tournament. Miguel gave us all the information on the tournament, it will be held on June 9<sup>th</sup>, you can launch from anywhere and the weigh in will be from 2:30-3:30 PM at Bings Landing. Raffle prizes will be a Manley Rod and rod and reel donated by West Marine. Details are in the June Chum Line.

Guys and Gals Tournment: Andy Block is the chairman of this tournament. Flyer can be found in your June Chum Line. Teams will consist of two people, it can be a man and a woman, or a kid (either gender), if you have a two man team-one person must be dressed in drag and both team members weighing fish must come to the weigh in.

Tournament will be held on June 23, 2018, you can fish from anywhere, no boat required, start time is 6 AM, Weigh in is from 2-3 PM at Bings Landing. Guests must fish with a member, cost is \$20.00, paid in advance. This event is free to members. If you come to the weigh in only, we ask guests to give a \$10.00 donation for the food. Sign up deadline is

June 20. Raffle prizes will be a Manley rod and a pink rod and reel donated by West Marine. Boaters Exchange is splitting the food and beverage bill with us. Volunteer to help at the tournaments and you will get to know the other members of the club, Andy said.

**Kids Clinic:** Capt. Mike Vickers along with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, The Flagler Sportfishing Club and Fish Florida are again hosting the 9th Annual Free Kids Fishing Clinic on July 14, 2018 from 9 AM-12:00 noon. Ages for kids are 5-15 years old. Mike told us that the first clinic held had an attendance of 100 kids, this clinic started out with a few tents and they worked out of cardboard boxes. Now it is the largest kids clinic in the N.E. and they have 200 kids in attendance, with their parents. We teach the kids to fish and they go through 6 stations to learn casting a fishing rod, conservation, habitat, knot tying, proper fish handling and how to throw a cast net and at the completion of the stations, each participant will receive a "Good Angler" Award and a free rod and reel. The kids will receive bait and they can fish off the docks. Fish Florida this year only could provide 115 rods, but West Marine, CCA and our fishing club kicked in to make it 200 rods. The club will provide water and hot dogs for the kids. Please bring a non-perishable food item, it will be donated to the Food Pantry in Bunnell. There will be no fishing trip on boats this year for the kids. This is all about us giving back to the community. There are posters and flyers at the back table, please take one and post it at a business that will allow you to do so.

### Any Other New Business

Chuck Gleichmann made an announcement that Salt Strong gave us a raffle prize worth \$100.00 for a membership in their Salt Strong Insiders Club. Chuck Radloff announced that he is having a sale on the Spring Classic tournament shirts, now marked down to \$15.00 each.

### Break for 10 Minutes

Guest Speakers: Bill Moore, Jeff Rafter and Peter Bessette Bill Moore started off by telling us how to night fish from a boat on a canal or on the Intercoastal waters. You will need a life vest, a towel, a good pair of pliers to deal with the catfish, insect repellant, a light-you can use a head lamp or he uses a short flashlite that he puts in his mouth to see the hook and you could also use a spotlight and make sure your boat running lights are working. He uses artificial paddle tails, favorite one is a 3" by Storm. Paddle tails move, he bumps it along and throws it under the docks. Fish spook more at night. Trout are under the dock and they stay in the same spot, then attack the bait. Redfish will spook and leave. Don't upset the water or make a lot of noise. Don't get on people's docks to get a lure that might have gotten hooked on the dock. For night tournaments, he will go to the places he normally fishes until 10 PM. When using a spinner lure, the current will move it and the fish will hit it. Put the hook in the mouth of the shrimp and through the head, but avoid the black spot on the top of the head for live shrimp. Throw under the dock and let the current work it and bring it back to you. He may put a bobber on but would rather free line it, he uses a 12 lb fluorocarbon leader. He creeps up to the dock by using his power pole, and in a full moon, he can move around more.

Jeff Rafter talked about surf fishing at night. He said that he and Bill have about 60 years of fishing each. Some of the advantages of night fishing are that in June, July and August it is cooler, and you don't have to share the beach with swimmers, surfers or any sun worshippers. He just takes 2 rods, a chair and a beach cart and goes to Matanzas or Marineland. He said you have to relearn how to fish here, it is different than what you may be used to. The tarpon bite is better at night, for bait he uses crabs, clams, sand fleas, shrimp and fish bite strips. Fish a beach you have fished before, go and check out the beach at low tide because everything looks different at night and consider your safety. Prefish at low tide and look for run outs, get a fictional reference, so you can find it at night. Take a light to change hooks, tie rigs, you can use a head flashlight. If the current is running north, cast your rod in a near slew and you won't get your lines tangled. Fish before full darkness, when the moon is full, the tide runs harder. Fish clean water, you catch catfish in dirty water. He doesn't use the sand spikes at night, he positions his beach cart with the poles against it, his feet in the sand next to the pole, so he can feel the vibration of the pole. Also, take a small cutting board to cut your bait and use a lure if the bait isn't working, you can use big plugs. He takes along a buff to wear so the no see ums will not bother him and he also uses only Sputnick 3-4 oz sinkers with a 9 foot rod. He also brings a lantern, uses reflective tape or a 3" glow stick on his rods. He places the lantern in the sand below the rods and it makes it easier to see the reflection of the rod moving, you can also put small bells at the top of the rod. Bring a slime rag and a few other rags. Pre-tie your rigs and bring a few pliers. You don't need to cast far at night, the fish can be right at your feet. He fishes the first two hours at dusk until around 10 or 11 PM.

Peter Bessette fishes the back country at night in the canals, he will go south to 100 to Matanzas. There are flounder and trout in the canals but the water right now is dirty. He uses paddle tails with a ½ oz jighead and casts halfway to the sea wall. He looks for action – water breaking – and he uses the dock lights. Keep a log on what dock you catch fish at, he doesn't anchor, uses a trolling motor, he goes on both sides, up one and then turns around. If using a live bait, he will use a jighead and put it through the head of the bait and it will bounce. You can remove the tail on the shrimp for scent and put it on the hook backwards, so it looks like a bait in distress. He uses a top water, a bigger skitter walker M417 for trout and you work it real slow and it falls, if you work it real fast, it stays on the top and you can use live mullet.




