April Forecast

Well, it will not be long and all of the talk will be about our nearshore Cobia bite! These big bruisers should be following the Manta Rays (currently in Brevard County) north just as soon as our water warms up a little more. When these fish arrive we will see everything from 10 foot jon boats to 30+ foot offshore vessels chasing them. On busy days remember to be courteous – too many boats chasing the same ray will ensure that nobody gets a good chance to hook up. If you see another angler stalking a ray, stay back and keep alert, chances are another ray will come into the picture shortly. Artificial baits like large topwaters or plastic eels, and large swimbaits should make for a productive day. If bait is more your thing – try pogies, mullet, shrimp, blue crabs, or even a large mud minnow.

Inshore anglers can expect a steady diet of redfish, trout, and flounder now that spring has arrived. Fish deeper holes and creeks on an outgoing tide with shrimp, mullet, or your favorite artificial jig. Follow the fish onto the flats, on the incoming tides and target your

favorite shoreline or oyster bars with these same baits, as well.

Offshore captains will be productive with trolling spreads, dolphin show up in numbers at the start of spring. Skirted and naked ballyhoo have been the bait of choice. A few large wahoo are still being caught, as well. On the bottom, large triggerfish are the target for meals, but anglers will have to fight through all of the red snapper and grouper which are catch and release only.

In the surf (much like the cobia) pompano are starting to show up in good numbers just to the south of Flagler County. Therefore, it should not be long and these delectable treats will be making their way north also. Shrimp, sand fleas, clams, and even jigs tipped with Fish Bites will all work well for an invitation to dinner! Surfcasters can also look forward to Spanish mackerel and large blue fish showing up in April. These fish are a lot of fun to target with Gotcha plugs, silver spoons or topwater plugs. Remember to use a heavier leader to prevent these toothy creatures from cutting you off.

NEW (AND OLD) MEMBERS CLINIC

On March 9, 2019, we held our first clinic of the year at the Hammock Community Center featuring eight speakers and fifty-six members. We also had twenty-one guests and six volunteer helpers for a total of ninety-one attendees.

The program started with opening remarks from our Club President, Captain Chuck Gleichmann. Our first presenter was our webmaster and marketing director, Chris Christian. Chris covered benefits of club membership and why we need to support our sponsors. Chuck Radloff demonstrated cast net techniques for catching bait fish. Members and guests had a chance to try throwing the net. Our weighmaster, Rita Waddell explained our yearlong tournament rules, locations of our participating weigh stations, and how we go about weighing in tournament fish. Tim Miller, "Mr. Sheepshead," expounded on his methods of how to successfully fish our local pier and bridges. Tim brought in live sand fleas and demonstrated his Sand Flea Shuffle. Next up was Captain Drew Puskas who enlightened the audience with his methods and rigs he uses for fishing near and offshore. Captain Chuck Gleichmann followed, explaining with a sketch of our area, how and why we need to use tides, currents, and phases of the moon to catch local fish. Chuck also explained why keeping a fishing log is such an essential part of successful fishing.

After lunch, Captain Jeff Rafter explained and demonstrated how to fish our local beaches with his selection of surf rods, reels, and casting method. Lastly, Captain Mike Vickers explained his methods for using live bait and artificial bait to catch the big ones. Mike spoke from his boat which gave our audience a close up look at how to set up and what to bring when fishing from a typical Intracoastal flats boat.

Thanks, one and all, for your help as without that this Clinic could not be. Our #1 raffle prize of a Penn Rod and Reel was won by new Club member Jim Cleaves. Carol Carter won the fishing pliers, Gary Fisher won the Yeti tumbler, and Dana Syens won the 50/50.

Ernie said that the DAV handles veterans disability claims, transports vets to their drs. Appointments and helps them in any way they can. He told us that on 3/29, they will be having a casino night for Vietnam War Veterans Day, at the DAV location, cost is \$50.00 a ticket that equals to \$100.00 in funny money for you to gamble with. SPEAKER – Jason Keating from Fish Bites: Jason is from St. Augustine, he does research and development for Fish Bites. He told us he fished a tournament in Punta Gorda, and won \$150,000.00 in that tournament. He told us that Fish Bites is made out of a water soluble plastic that is made with the scent, instead of impregnating it with a scent. He said they have a 5" jerk bait that you can fish it front or backwards, it has a bounce to it under the water to attract fish. A product called the Cody Curly Tail Jig is something the trout love. He works closely with Bill Carr who is a marine biologist researcher at Whitney Labs. He said he likes the research and development area and does not want to go into the

sales aspect of the company. They have a bait called "Bob's Your Uncle Bait that means "it is what it is". Bass usually spit your bait out but this one they hold onto. He suggested that we go to their website and check on all the new products they have that really work, the website is fishbites.com and his direct email is there. He would like you to tell him the products that you Don't like because he uses that feedback to help them. Everything is biodegradable. Fast acting bait is used in colder water. They will be putting out a line of fresh water baits in the future. Some colors he suggested having are white, bright chartreuse, new penny neutral and black. He said for trout, use a paddle tail, busted lip color that is opaque with purple or fuchsia glitter in it, or white shrimp. The scent in the lures get activated when wet, they don't require liquid scents, it will hold its scent. The packages are vacuum sealed and the six plastics will last a week or two weeks, keep in a cooler. You put the bites on the hook like a chunk of mullet, cut the strips up. You can rig two hooks on your line and put shrimp bait on top and the bites at the bottom and see what the fish hit on. He fishes for two weeks at a time, through all different kinds of weather and conditions as part of his research to see how the products react and how the fish react to the products. For the plastics bait, you can put the bait in water and it will rehydrate but use spring water without any chlorine in it. He said plastics in the 4 ½ size are ready to rock!
