May fishing forecast

It seems that our spring is finally here in full effect! The forecast will be much the same as April, plus more. By "more," I mean we should all be catching **more** fish, plus expecting **more** species.

On the beach, anglers can expect more blue fish, more pompano, and more Spanish mackerel, as well as, the usual whiting and occasional redfish and black drum. From the piers, the bite will be much the same. However, as the month progresses be on the lookout for a shot at a kingfish and tarpon.

Inshore Anglers, it is time to dust off your favorite topwater plug. Hit your favorite flat, early in the morning for some exciting redfishing, or target creek mouths and drop-offs for speckled sea trout. After chasing the topwater bite, anglers can target flounder as the day warms up. For the flatties, target deep holes with

moving water using a ¼ ounce jighead and a small mullet or mud minnow.

Offshore Anglers should not have to travel far for some exciting battles. Kingfish and cobia will be found on the beach and on the wrecks and reefs (make sure to have some pitch baits ready on some spinning gear). While fishing these waters, be on the lookout for sailfish as they too move in with the warmer water. Deep water analers will be greeted by more dolphin. Recent reports have most bites coming on ballyhoo rigs. Small pink and white skirted baits are working also. An occasional wahoo or blackfin tuna may still find its way into the spread also.

Good luck on the water and remember - fishing is fun, have a blast!

Meeting Called to order at 7:30 PM by President Chuck Gleichmann

Pledge of Allegiance: Presented by Pat Gleichmann

Passing of March Minutes: Minutes of March 05, 2019 meeting, published in the Chum Line were passed, motion was made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Norm Manley.

Finance Report & Renewals: Gary Fisher said he is the worst treasurer the club has ever seen and you should vote for someone else! He told us that the membership renewal rate is 65-70%, we are missing around 30%, so please renew your dues. He is taking credit card payments for the Spring Tournament. You have to be a paid up member or you do not get the \$5.00 discount on the entry fee. At the sign up at the Captain's meeting he is using Pay Pal and will use online for renewals. The bills are paid and there is money in the bank.

Welcome Visitors/New Members: We had 19 guests/new members at tonight's meeting.

Announcements:

Chuck Gleichmann said to see the people in the vellow shirts and ask them any questions you may have about the club. Our speakers are very knowledgeable. We have professional guides, and to seek out the people who can help answer anything vou need to know. On Sat., April 6th Boaters Exchange will have their Expo, there will be food and beverages, fishing seminars and vendors at this event. It will be held on May 11th, have your feet in the sand, facing East at 6 AM. Weigh in will be at the Betty Steflick Pavillion across from Hidden Treasure, under the 100 bridge. One of the raffle prizes will be an 11' surf rod worth \$350.00, another prize will be a sand spike and more. Norm said there will be fish in the ocean. Signup sheets are in the back of the room, only eligible fish will count. Lunch will be served at 1:30 PM, check flyer in the Chum Line for prize info. Norm said, next month's speaker will be Noel Kuhn.

Any Other New Business:

Chuck Gleichmann said our speaker tonight will be Dan Smith who is an excellent fisherman, an author and he does a column in the Home News and has been around since 1968. He reminded us that there were raffle and 50/50 tickets for sale and election ballots in the back for any nominations you may want to make. Break for 10 minutes

SPEAKER: Dan Smith has been fishing in these waters for over 40 years. He is originally from Louisiana and was raised in New Iberia. When he was 10 years old, he started fishing with a cane pole. He told us that when you catch a lady fish, cut it up and use it for bait. He fishes for flounder and that Matanzas in April is the capital for flounder. He fishes the state parks, Tomoka basin and wades in the

water for the flounder and he catches 40-50 by wading and using artificial bait. In 2014, he caught 104 flounder. Look into the water at the bottom for flounder, they want a bottom that is colored like them. They like some current, but not a strong current. They wait for the bait fish to come and they hide from the birds that will eat them, by using the bottom color to conceal themselves. He walks out 3-4 feet and casts out, as the light comes up, flounder start moving out. Dolphins eat the flounder, the dolphins come in a line and they let you know where the flounders are. He uses chartreuse color shrimp tail jigs and it is like candy to the flounder. Flounders are smart, if you hook a flounder, it might come off and he won't let you hook him again. They won't hit the same color jig again, so you have to change the colors. Flounders also like sand eels. Flounder are like dogs, they will walk back to the bank until they see the shoreline, then it will flip and try to go the other way and he can unhook himself. Use live finger mullet for bait or cut ½" wide strip and put a hook in one end of it. Flounder won't school but if you catch one, stay in that area. People that don't like the taste of some fish, do like to eat flounder. At Ponce Inlet, by the doggie park and Tomoka State Park and the west end of any bridge that meets the shore is a good place to catch flounder. In 2014, he caught 8-10 flounder on top water bait. They will imitate tarpon and come right out of the water. Grand Slam makes his baits for him, flounder like a light color. Always throw your bait into the current and let it drift back to you, he got a snook that way, he was using a 10 pound test, no leader but the snook broke off. His baits are on the Grand Slam website, listed as Dan Smith's Special Edition Bait. 50/50 Winner: Was Bob Cyr and he received \$270.00.

Attendance tonight was 132 people Meeting adjourned at 9:15 PM


