# June Fishing Forecast

Offshore anglers, willing to brave the heat, should find a nice variety of species. Bottom fishermen will be able to target grouper, trigger, and black sea bass. Reports from local wrecks and reefs look promising for these species. Nice sized flounder should also compete for baits dropped down to these same areas. Trolling lures or ballyhoo along weed lines will produce nice numbers of dolphin this month. In the absence of weed lines, try to locate flotsam or a congregation of birds.

Nearshore waters will still be holding bait pods. The usual suspects, cobia, kingfish, sharks, and tarpon, should be lurking below the bait – ready to attack anything resembling an injured pogie. Fishing from the piers or the surf, during June, will yield bluefish, flounder, pompano, and whiting. Larger live baits may also tempt free swimming cobia or kingfish from the piers, as well. Inshore anglers will see a continued increase in the amount of sea trout and snook available. The best bite will be pre-dawn and early morning fishing. On higher tides, work grassy edges with your favorite topwater or subsurface plug. When the water is lower search drop-offs or under docks by

drifting a live shrimp or small baitfish for these ambush predators. If redfish is your target, fish around oyster bars during periods of high water, and try fishing the banks of the ICW when the tide drops out. With kids getting out of school, June is a good month for targeting ladyfish and jacks also. While these fish are not good table fare, they can be a lot of fun, and can be caught from shore or in a boat.

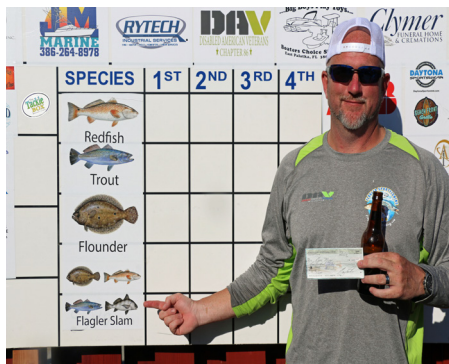

## Club Meeting Minutes 05-07-19

**Meeting Called to order** at 7:30 PM by President Chuck Gleichmann

**Pledge of Allegiance:** Presented by Pat Gleichmann

Passing of April Minutes: Minutes of April 02, 2019 meeting, published in the Chum Line were passed, motion was made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Bob Cyr.

**Welcome Visitors/New Members:** We had 8 guests/new members at tonight's meeting.

### **Announcements:**

Chuck Gleichmann asked if everyone got their ballots for the election of officers tonight. Bill May told us there were 30 seconds left to vote and again announced what positions were being voted on. Tim Loftus, store manager for West Marine let us know that on May 14 at 6 PM, there would be an Inshore Fishing Class to be held at the West Marine store in Palm Coast. He has flyers in the back with all the information on them. Tim Miller is at the back table signing up people for the Bottom Trip and there is a signup sheet for the Surf Tournament also.

### **REPORTS:**

**Finance Report and Renewals:** Gary Fisher said that at this time, we have 282 active members, we are at the best we have ever been for this time of year. If you have not renewed your membership by now, any fish you have on the Yearlong Tournament list will not be counted. Gary said we have gone to online credit cards for renewal, he is working on the system and it has some growing pains. If you got double billed he apologizes for it. We had a successful Spring Classic this year, there were 128 anglers that fished the tournament, we had online applications and 83 prepaid anglers. We had a lot of volunteers and sponsors. Support our sponsors, we really need them to run our free tournaments, events and to offer better raffle prizes. We are in good shape and are getting an audit done. The bills are paid and there is money in the bank.

**Weigh Master Report:** Rita Waddell said that between the Spring Classic and the everyday anglers, the boxes for the weigh in slips are full. Rick Lay is in the lead in the men's division and Karen Dougherty is in the lead for the lady angler. The fish of the month for April was Spotted Sea Trout and the winner was Shane Moore who won a \$50.00 gift card. Rita told us that all good things must come to an end and it has been a 3 year journey for her as Weighmaster and she thanked everyone for their support. She wishes Chuck Radloff all the best as our new weighmaster.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Manatee Zones:** Deputy Jeff Turner, who is in the Marine Unit of the Flagler Sheriff's Dept., spoke to us on this subject. The automatic screen was not working tonight, so we had to make do with the curtain on the

stage. He had to read some of the writing on the power point for us, but explained the different areas that were affected and what areas you had to be careful in. He said you had to be aware that the dates for this were from May 1st – Sept. 7th, 2019. Slow Speed-Minimum Wake means that the boat does not plane when going through these areas. The boat should be settled in the water, in idle speed. Which means you have it at enough speed to control the boat and not up on plane. There is contact information on their website and you can ask him any questions on there that you might have. If you would like a business card, ask him for one. His email will be put up on our club website and you can correspond with him that way also. He also said while you are out on the water, if you see something, say something, call the Sheriffs office at (386) 313-4911. He said the zones in Edgewater and Port Orange are confusing and you can check online as to what they are. There are no "no wake" zones by Marineland. **Spring Classic:** Dana announced that she and Rita, surprised a lot of people with the results of the Spring Classic. They appreciated all the help they got from the volunteers, sponsors, Ernie Morris and the people from the DAV. Some of the sponsors that helped make this happen were *Rytech, West Marine, Mark Wilhelm from the DAV provided custom made rods* that he made and they were donated for the raffle prizes. Thanks so much to all the people involved in this great event. Chuck Gleichmann added that the ladies did a great job in running this event.

**Election Results:** The results were an involved process and they were not actually announced until after the break. The results were: *President: Chuck Gleichmann, Vice President: Dana Syens, Treasurer: Gary Fisher, Sgt. at Arms: Ron Gorney, Weighmaster: Chuck Radloff.* Bill thanked everyone for their participation, they had to count through 131 ballots. Bill said he has a list that he will give to Chuck Radloff of weighmaster helpers that will give him a hand. Chuck Gleichmann said we need volunteers to help out with tournaments, data entry, quick books and to let us know if anyone is interested in helping out, even if you don't have any skills, you can still come join us. He also thanked Rita Waddell and Pat Gleichmann for their service in being Weighmaster and Sgt. at Arms.

**Bottom Trip:** Tim Miller said the trip is on May 18th at Ponce Inlet on the Critter Fleet boat. He still has spots available at the cost of \$85.00 for members and \$120.00 for non-members. He will open the non-members availability after the break. There will be 2 gift certificates for future trips on the Critter Fleet and this year there will be 2 weekends that will be open to Red Snapper fishing, so you can try to schedule a trip during those weekends if you win a gift certificate. You can bring food, (the galley will not be open), beer,(no

glass bottles), bait and poles will be available on the boat, you cannot have braided line on your pole, you may bring 2 poles and a small cooler. The boat will leave the dock at 8 AM, call Tim if you are running late. He will be having the drawing for spots on the back of the boat at 7:30 AM, but he said the middle of the boat seems to be where the biggest fish have been caught. So far, he has 41 people signed up, he would like to get to 50 people, but the boat can hold 65 people. Call Tim if you want to go.

**Surf Tournament:** Norm Manley said this tournament will be held this Saturday, May 11th, starting at 6 AM on the beach with your toes in the sand, facing east, on any beach you would like to fish. The weigh in time will be from 2-3 PM and held at Betty Steflik Pavillion, under the 100 bridge across from Hidden Treasure. There will be raffle prizes consisting of some gift certificates, 2 sand spikes, a sand crab rake and a custom made surf pole. Food will be served at 2:30 PM.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

*Election Results were posted above.*

**Smoke Off Results:** Andy Block said this is our 5th Annual Smoke off. Judges were: Mike Crotts, Noel Kuhns and Joe Barefoot. Andy thanked Sean Barnett and Jodie Von Gal for helping set up the smoked fish and fixin's. **Winners were:** *3rd place, David Genk with smoked redfish-prize: a bag of smoking chips, 2nd place, Tim Miller with smoked pompano-prize: a club logo embroidered towel, 1st place, Mark Heffley with smoked black tip shark-prize: a club logo embroidered vinyl apron.* So, go get some fish and dip, Andy told us!

**Break for 10 minutes**

**SPEAKER:** Noel Kuhns was introduced by Chuck Gleichmann. Chuck told us that the last time we had Noel as a speaker, one of our members who had never really surf fished much before, fished our last surf tournament and after using the tips he got from Noel, ended with a winning fish. So, pay attention and you too can catch a prize winning fish. Noel said he was honored to speak about his passion for surf fishing, which also is his hobby and his business. In this month's Coastal Angler, there is an article and a picture of Noel, Jeff Rafter and Jeff's granddaughter. He said he had been teaching surf fishing for 8 yrs when his grandson told him he should be a surf fishing guide, so he became one. He was taught by a champion that holds the world's long distance title. His reels are made by Abu Garcia and are called Akios reels, which in Japanese means new beginnings. He started his talk off by wanting to find out what questions people had that he could address for them. Some of the questions were about using a double drop or a single drop line, he said double drop is better. He said the tides do make a huge difference on the beach and the wind can ruin your day at the beach. Other issues to be addressed were moon

phases, mono line vs braid line, and water clarity. He told us if you are pier fishing, to fish away from the pier because the pier only has 100 yards. He also addressed sinkers, seaweed, floats and beads and spinning vs conventional reels. He advised in the morning to throw one rod short. If the water is deep in the trough, put the bait right there. For your bait, he advises to match the hatch, do not put bait on that will be bigger than the mouth of the fish you are targeting. Use shrimp because all fish eat shrimp. It can be fresh dead shrimp preferably, fresh killed shrimp or frozen shrimp. Put the live shrimp on ice to kill them in a Tupperware container. When targeting pompano and whiting, they eat sand fleas, calico crabs or clams. Use a pair of scissors to cut the shrimp into 3 pieces, cut off the fan on the tail, he uses a 2 outt circle hook and put the shrimp on, side to side on the hook. When cutting up a crab, use scissors to get to the knuckles of the crab. Take off the claws, pop the shell and that is where the knuckles are, use a half a blue crab. Pompano come in Feb or March, then come back through in Nov./Dec. months. To get sand fleas, you need a warm afternoon when they will come closer to the surface when it is cold outside. If you get a catfish sting, use hot, hot water for 45 minutes, heat will kill the poison. When using two different baits on a 2 hook rig, just remember to hook them up so whatever bait swims lower, you would put that bait on the bottom hook. That way, you will know what bait caught a fish and what bait did not. Like a shrimp swims in the middle or on the top water, but a sand flea will burrow into the sand, so the shrimp should be higher on your hooks. Don't use blue crab at the beach when the mullet are running. When the current is too strong and your heavier sinker is not holding, switch to a Sputnik sinker, it has wires that you set and it will hold in the sand better. He usually fishes using a 3, 4 or 5 pound sinker. If the water looks like Yoohoo or chocolate milk, go someplace else where the water is cleaner. If the weatherman says the wind is 20-30 knots, don't fish. He doesn't pay attention to the moon phases, instead he pays attention to the tides. He mostly uses monofilament line and only uses braided line for throwing lures. He uses a white bead on his line and if the water is dirty, he uses a chartreuse one.

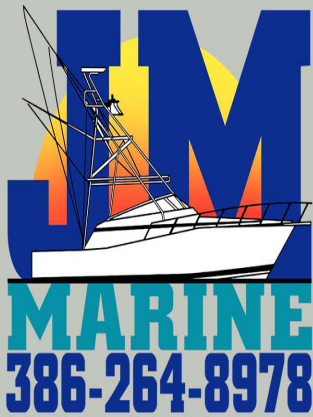
