Even though we will have some brutal heat heading our way, a look back at last years fishing log makes me anxious for July to get here! For inshore fishing, this time of year, get out early and rig up several top water plugs. I usually have one "walk-the-dog" (zara spook jr.) style plug and one "chugger" (storm chug bug) ready to go. Redfish should go crazy for these plugs on the flats and fishing deeper areas should produce nice trout. These same plugs can also be used later in the day around bulkheads or docks for some fun ladyfish and jack crevalle action. If you can not get out early, try the same tactics around dusk for similar results or fish after dark for the busy trout and snook (catch and release only as the season is closed) bite around dock lights.

Offshore anglers will continue to find schools of dolphin. Looking for the telltale signs (birds or weed lines) in 130 feet or deeper should be the keys to filling the fish box. Bonita and blackfin tuna may also make their way into the trolling spread. Bottom fishing reports are looking

promising also. Mangrove snapper from 5 to 15 pounds are being pulled off of many different wrecks and reefs. The reefs will also hold the normal residents like sea bass, trigger, porgy, grouper and amberjack. This year the red snapper season is early and short! Offshore anglers have a 5 day season, July12 - 14th and July 19th and 20th. The wrecks, reefs, and live bottom areas will be crowded these days be courteous and be safe!

For those looking to fish nearshore July will be a great month to continue targeting kingfish, cobia, tarpon, and shark. These same species should also make their way within casting distance of the pier. Surf and pier fishermen will also be able to target pompano, flounder, whiting and bluefish.

Remember sun protection and hydration, tight lines!

John Mount picked up the weigh-in slips this month and the fishing seems to be getting better. Karen Dougherty is still in first place in the Ladies category for the Year Long

Tournament and Rick Lay is still in first place for

the Men's Division. Nineteen of the 23 species on our Year Long list have been caught so far in the

men's division and 14 of 23 have been caught in the ladies division. Red Snapper open season will be open July 12-14 and again July 19 & 20th. The club will be holding a special red snapper tournament during this time, there will be more details about it at the July 2nd meeting. If you catch one, weigh it in, there will be a bonus prize for the heaviest fish.

OLD BUSINESS:

Bottom Trip: Tim Miller said he wanted to make sure all of us knew that Bill May got the biggest porgy fish. There were 43 anglers on the boat out of Ponce Inlet. They had great weather and calm seas, if you did not sign up for this trip, you missed a great outing. They caught cobia, porgies, and many big red snappers. The captain of the boat put them on fish and all who went thoroughly enjoyed the trip. **Surf Tournament:** Norm Manley was absent, so a report was not given.

NEW BUSINESS:

Kayak Tournament: Bill May is running this tournament out of Genung's Fish Camp in Crescent Beach owned by Adam Morley. It is on 6/08/19. Genung's has kayak rentals and a kayak launch, and the weigh-in will be held there from 3-4 PM. The fish will be redfish and spotted trout. There will be a \$25.00 show up gift card. Amy is in the back, selling

raffle tickets for the prizes. Matt McClellan, owner of Sunrise Paddle sports has donated the cooler that will be raffled off. There will be no plastic bottles allowed on the property, so bring your own non-plastic bottles and water will be served out of a cooler jug.

There will be a flyer with more info in the July Chum Line and more info will be available at the July 2nd meeting. Kids Clinic: Chuck Gleichmann and Dana Syens will be co-chairing the clinic this year. It will be held on 7/13/19 and it will be held at Herschel King Park this year. The parents and kids in conjunction with the FWC will go through the stations that are set up and when the kids complete the stations, they will get a free rod and reel. Last year we had about 250 kids, they also get free hot dogs. We need many volunteers to help out!

Any Other New Business:

Bill May said he will be running the Oct. club picnic this year and wanted to know by a show of hands how many people would want a whole roasted pig or chicken and pork. The show of hands was evenly divided, so he will make a food decision going forward from this vote and let us know at a later date. He also told us that West Marine will be holding a fishing seminar on 6/11/19, from 6 – 8 PM at their location, Carlos Garcia will be speaking about targeting redfish and refreshments will be served. Tim Miller gave us a pier report that on Sunday, 6/02, kingfish were caught off the end of the pier because of bait pods of pogies being around. One of the kings weighed 18 lbs.

Break for 10 minutes SPEAKERS:

Hanna Hart – FWC, Biologist at Division of Marine Fisheries Management

Capt. Shane Stover - Fishing Guide for offshore and inshore fishing

Hanna Hart: Told us what they do and how they evaluate in her division. They have two specific commissions with seven members. They are appointed by the governor and they go to the commission meetings to tell your point of view on specific topics to do with fishing rules and laws. The director is Erik Sutton. The rule makers are the people. The staff is mostly located in Tallahassee, they have four regional biologists, the north east region is our region and she will take our concerns to Tallahassee. They benefit all species. Tripletail and sheepshead have undergone some rule changes lately. Their management is more flexible but snook and tarpon are regulated by state and federal management. There are many challenges in regulating recre-

ation and commercial fishermen. They evaluate by using scientific data. The staff assessments are made for the fisheries and they get input to make recommendations to the commissioners. These concerns are brought to three meetings (1) review and discussion (2) Draft rule – that the public can support or not (3) Final public hearing – it is not always in this order, it can take a couple of months to a year to make decisions. They need to hear from the public if the fisheries are doing well or not. In Dec. 2018 & 2019 public hearings were held on sharks, it is now a requirement to have a shark fishing permit if you are 16 or older and there is no exemption if you are over 65. You have to take an online class to get the permit. Chumming is prohibited from shore, you have to use a circle hook and use a cutter for the line. If interested in attending a meeting on any of these public included discussions, check their website for a meeting near you. She asked if anyone had any concerns that she could take back to her office staff. Jim Britton said he would like in the NE region to have no over slot fish. Some others wanted the FWC to change the rule where Volusia Co., you can only have one redfish and in Flagler Co., you can have two to read the same that in both counties you can have a transit law for two redfish, to make it more uniform. Also mentioned were stricter rules for oversize fish and 13-14" size for flounder.

Capt. Shane Stover: Shane told us he hunted and fished in Florida. He is an offshore and inshore guide. He told us how to catch red snapper by using a 7-9 circle hook, use pogies for bait, you can also use sardines and pinfish. He said Kingfish are all around now, use 40-60 lb test. The water around the beach is murky, use mullet for bait, it works great. He invited the members to come up front and he had a table set up with kingfish rigs that he was going to show them how to tie these rigs and give them more information on catching kingfish.


