August Fishing Forecast

With the dog days of summer approaching, I recommend anglers do the same thing many of us did when we were young: hit the beach! Whether in a boat, on the pier, or from the surf, fishing should be busy. From a boat the targets will be tarpon, kingfish, sharks, and large jack crevalle. All of these species can be found behind the shrimp boats as they dump their by-catch. When the shrimp boats are not active just run the beach looking for poggy pods (there will be plenty to choose from). Once a pod is spotted it will not take long to discover if there are fish underneath, so slowly approach and have live bait ready or use your favorite large artificial bait.

Anglers looking to get in on the action from the pier can also get shots at tarpon, kingfish and sharks in August. Pompano, flounder, bluefish, and drum will be found around the pier and from the surf as well.

Offshore anglers will be targeting kingfish and an occasional wahoo by trolling over wrecks and reefs. If the “smokers” are not around, drop an anchor to load up on black sea bass, snapper (so far this has been an excellent summer for mangrove snapper), and grouper. Further out dolphin and tuna will be found from 135 feet of water out to the ledge.

The inshore bite will remain much the same. Get out early and target redfish along grass banks at higher tides and along oyster bars or sand bars at the lower tides. Trout can be found along the banks of the ICW and under docks. And don’t forget to target flounder in creek mouths or bends on an outgoing tide. For yet another way to beat the heat – give night fishing a try. Free line a shrimp under dock lights for trout or fish deeper for redfish and flounder.

No Quick Tips Tonight

Attendance: 107 people

Meeting Called to order at 7:30 PM by President, Chuck Gleichmann

Pledge of Allegiance: presented by Pat Gleichmann

Passing of June Minutes: Minutes of June 04, 2019 meeting, published in the Chum Line were passed, motion was made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Peter.

Welcome Visitors/New Members & Sponsor's: We had 7 guests/new members at tonight's meeting.

Announcements: Chuck G. said that Cpt. Tim Jarvis is our speaker tonight. He will talk about fishing the docks. Check back tables for sign ups for the tournaments and Kid's Clinic volunteers. There are Kid's Clinic posters on the back table, take them and post them at any businesses, restaurants or establishments you go to.

REPORTS:

Finance Report: Gary Fisher said that the director's made a decision to raise the bar for our tournaments and nicer prizes are being awarded. The members responded by buying more raffle tickets and we are getting more revenue from the tickets. We use the show-up ticket if prizes are not given out. Show-up for our weigh-ins to win. We had a great Spring Tournament. Bills are paid and there is money in the bank.

Weigh Master Report: This will be Chuck Radloff's first report as our new weighmaster. He said that many wish they won the election and there was No Russian interference involved. Leaders for the Yearlong Tournament are Karen Dougherty for the Ladies and Bruce Bachmann for the Men. Bruce Bachmann

got a 51 lb. King Mackerel and won a \$50.00 gift certificate for the Fish of the Month in June. Bill May, (in case you did not know) got a porgy on the Bottom Trip that weighed 4 lb. and had to hire a U-haul trailer to get it home! The Fish of the Month for July is Flounder. The Red Snapper season will be open for fishing July 12-14th and July 19-20th, and for our tournament, you can keep one fish per angler and no size limits up or down, there will be prizes for 5 places. Weigh in at our stations, the pier is open until midnight to weigh in fish.

OLD BUSINESS:

Kayak Tournament: Bill May said that he caught a giant Porgy last month on the Bottom Trip. The Kayak tournament was held on June 8th at Genung's Fish Camp. 25 people signed up for it, there were 24 people at the weigh in, he had food and great raffle prizes, Dean Roberts won the fishing rod. Bill said it is great to go kayak fishing. The next Kayak Tournament will be August 24th and it will be run by Peter Bessette. Details will be in the August Chum Line.

Guys n Gals: Rita Waddell reported that it was a very hot day and attendance was down for the tournament. 43 people signed up and there were 43 people at the weigh in, 26 people fished in the tournament. There were six spots on the fish prizes that were not won by anglers, so a show up ticket had to be picked. No one dressed up this year, so those prizes were drawn using the show up tickets. We will do it again next year and hopefully have some participants dressing up. Rick and Allison sold tickets.

Over Nite Tournament: Tim Miller said this tournament will be held on July 26th & 27th. You can start fishing at 6 PM on Friday night and weigh-in will be on Saturday from 10-11 AM at

Bings Landing. You can fish on Friday night into Saturday, or on either one of the days, just get your catch to Bings by 11 AM to be weighed. There is no check out. Prizes will be for five species, top two weights in each species, equaling 10 winners. Heaviest Combo-2 of any of the five fish. If no winner, there will be a draw on the show up tickets. There will be raffle prizes, a 50/50 and food provided. Need helpers for this tournament, there is a sign up sheet in the back. The pier will be open until 12 midnight on Friday and it will reopen at 6 AM in the morning on Saturday. If you try to fish for the combo, you will receive the most money. Flyers are at the back table and in the Chum Line.

Kid's Clinic: Chuck G. said this event will be held on 7/13 at Herschel King Park. This is a big club event and we will need a ton of volunteers. We are doubling the amount of instructional areas to help kids and adults to get through the lines. The kids will get a knapsack with a Fish Florida tackle box and a fishing rod, a free hot dog with chips and a water. Please sign up to help. Capt. Mike Vickers and Chuck Gleichmann started this event 9 years ago. There will be plenty of jobs for you and a lot of fun. It starts at 9 AM and ends at noon. Need volunteers to set up tables, give out volunteer shirts, etc. you should get there at 7-7:30 AM for set up. There will be coffee and donuts in the morning and bring a non-perishable food to be donated to the food bank.

NEW BUSINESS:

Amy Krisanda made an announcement about buying life preservers through West Marine, she asked if they would give us a discount and she needs to get 50 people, so give her your name and phone number. Amy was a police officer with the Westchester County Marine Unit and she is a Coast Guard approved boat captain.

Red Snapper Tournament: Details are mentioned above in the Weigh Master's report and there is a flyer in your July Chum Line with all the information.

Revised Dates: We had to revise some dates on our Schedule of Events, so please check on our website for the revised copy of our events, so you do not miss anything that is up coming.

Any Other New Business:

Member's Clinic: Walt Huresky said this clinic is for New and Old members, it will be held from 8:30 AM – 1 PM at the Hammock Community Center on August 10th. There will be eight experienced people to cover a variety of subjects to help you become better anglers. There will be coffee, donuts and juice, we will be in an air conditioned building and you will get a lunch. Flyer will be in August's edition of the Chum Line with all the details.

Presentation of Spring Classic check to the DAV: Rita Waddell, announced that the check presentation will be at the August meeting. We would like to have as many people as we can at this meeting. We will be making a \$12,000.00 donation to the DAV. At our Spring Classic, the CCA gets the live fish that the anglers donate and the anglers get an extra prize for making the donation. Question was brought up by member, Bear Carter, about conserving the fish and he asked if the club has considered doing a catch, photo, release program, as a way of entering them without taking them and not eating them? Chuck G. told him we have been investigating doing CPR. The sport is probably going towards this in the future. It is a large investment to the club but probably within five years, it will be a Catch, Photo and Release program. We want to be involved in that. Danny Carter mentioned that anyone who is interested in it, there is an online class that you can take for free from the

FWC to get a shark permit. Surf fishers should get it. Chris Christian said he would blast out the shark permit information by email to the members.

In the Keys, at Everglades Park, in Sept. it is a requirement to have a permit to fish there, it is free now but you may have to pay.

Break for 10 minutes

SPEAKER :

Capt. Tim Jarvis is here to speak on Fishing Docks at Nite. He started off his talk with asking what questions we had. First was how to pick what dock, he said you look for underwater or dock lights at the end of the dock, that is where you will get your majority of trout, redfish will be in the middle to the back of the dock. You start at the end and go towards the middle. For trout, use a popping cork, for bait use pinfish or shrimp. He likes to start out with a popping cork, if the cork does not work you can take it off and free line it. On the intercoastal docks he catches trout it seems the bigger trout are there. Redfish hang in structures, use a fast action rod to pull reds from the dock, use a tight line with no drag. If the tide is strong, try both sides of the dock on outgoing and incoming tides. Cast and let it go through, you may get snagged when trying for reds, they are strong fighters. If at a dock with no lights, don't spend a lot of time there, go to another one to try. He uses a ¼ oz jighead with a shrimp on it and fish the length of the dock. Set up with the current if you are fishing out of a boat and set up where it is easiest not to get snagged. Put out your anchor, fish for 10-15 min. and if no luck, move. If you have no live bait, throw a DOA or Gulp shrimp. You want to fish the lights, it will attract bait. You can chum for reds in the structure with cut up bait, use a 20-30 lb line. He calls it combat fishing when you get snagged, so bring plenty of line, sinkers and equipment. Sometimes you can see trout, but if you see catfish, keep on going. If you get snagged on top of someone's dock, try not to get on their property or on their dock, just cut the line. Pinfish are good bait for trout. Use a circle hook with a split shot, if not getting anything, just move on. Freeline shrimp through the head with the current and if using a pinfish, put the hook behind the dorsal fin on a popping cork. He uses 10-12 pound rods with a 2 ½ to 3 foot leader, you don't want too long of a line. Pick the docks and learn the tides from the fishing you do. If you are on a dock, fish around that structure. He will throw a paddle tail right into the light. The time you fish can be high or low tides, using a popping cork helps you see where your bait is at. He uses a jig head with a paddletail made by ZMan, and he superglues it, so it looks like a lure and it will stay as it is. He fishes the bottom for redfish. He catches a lot of trout on a Meridean lure, it sinks real slow. He also uses a New Penny Gulp bait and also catches a lot on the watermelon color. When you cast and it goes past the light, re-throw it. Fishing at night on a full moon- he goes three nights before and after a full moon. Bring bug spray with you! The moon should be directly above you. It doesn't matter what color the dock lights are. He said that Fish Bites do work also for bait, the white curly tail do well and the jerk shads. If you lose a fish, wait about 10 minutes and it might come back. He uses 8-10 pound braid because he gets a longer cast with it. If using 20-30 pound braid, have a mono leader on it.
