Currently, the new regulations reduce catch limits (6-5 in Flagler County and 4-2 in Volusia), 15-19 inches in length and no trophy fish over 20 inches. The FWC rep listened intently and the revisions will be voted on in October. Chuck Radloff, our weigh master attended the red snapper informational input session in St. Augustine and we will keep everyone informed as the new guidelines are developed. FWC is considering a longer, better planned 2020 Atlantic red snapper season. Maybe, we will finally have some good news there.

September Fishing Forecast Capt. Jim Britton saltytalesfishingcharters.com

Fall is finally here! As the heat index finally drops away from 100 degrees, the month of September provides two noticeable events which will influence inshore and surf fishing: the fall mullet run and flood tides.

As the mullet run begins, anglers will find bluefish and Spanish mackerel in the inlets and following the large schools in the surf. Target these toothy fish with a well constructed artificial, such as a Gotcha plug or a suspending Mirrolure. A live mullet on a fish finder rig, fished from the pier or in a beach run out, will be the key to landing nice sized flounder and redfish. Pompano can still be found in the surf, as well, by using sand fleas or a small piece of Fishbites artificial bait.


The fall mullet run will get many species of fish stirring in the river also. Jack crevalle, ladyfish, bluefish, tarpon, and trout will all be found chasing the mullet schools traveling the ICW. Target these fish with a suspending hard bait, soft plastic jerkbaits, or a gold spoon. But for me, the start of fall means flood tide fishing! Consult your tide charts to find the days

with the highest high tides. On these days, plan to search your favorite grass bank for tailing redfish. During the flood tides redfish and sheepshead will move up into the grass and feed on the snails that are on the grass blades. Bring your wading shoes as anchoring the boat and walking out may be the best approach (remember to do the "stingray shuffle"). Target these fish with a live shrimp, your favorite fly pattern, or a small artificial crab.

Offshore anglers should enjoy a more active bottom bite this month. Grouper will move onto the shallower wrecks and reefs (70 to 90 feet). Triggerfish, black sea bass, and even the occasional lionfish should be available also. Remember when anchored up to free line a live sardine to entice cobia and amberjack that will be lurking around these same areas. Sailfish can be targeted by trolling skirt and ballyhoo combos or kite fishing live bait throughout September also.

Chuck R. told us that the copies of the Yearlong Tournament standings are on the back table. Leader for the Ladies division is Karen Dougherty, leader in the Men's division is Bruce Bachmann, Jr. August Fish of the Month is Any Snapper but Red Snapper. July FOM was Flounder and was won by Ravi Puran, it weighed 5 lbs, 5 oz. In June, the winner of the FOM was Bruce Bachmann, Jr. he won a \$50.00 gift

Kayak Tournament: Peter Bessette said this tournament will be held on August 24th, fishing starts at 6 AM from anywhere, species will be redfish and flounder. The weigh-in will be from 1-2 PM at Highbridge – Salty Dawg bait shop. The sign up sheet is in the back.

Break for 10 minutes Any Other New Business: SPEAKER:

Captain Will Niemann of St. Augustine Paddle Sports will teach the club, fishing techniques to successfully catch fish in a kayak. He told us he started fishing when he was 4 years old. You can purchase a cheap kayak, but it might not be comfortable, you can sit on the top or inside it. Hobies cost around \$1,200.00, they can have a

the fish will be looking for in that area, you can use a crab imitation on top of grasses. If they are eating shrimp, put it in their path, throw past them and bring it back to them. Use light tackle with a miro lure for trout, a heavy rod will rip the bait out of the trout's mouth. Kayaks are the boat of choice for creeks, they can float in 1 inch of water. When the flat goes to low tide, there are exit points and you can sit there and catch fish coming out of those exits. Position your bait on the ledge side. This is a good spot for flounder, if over the ledge, you can also catch reds. You can get yourself in a great position in a kayak. Cast up tide and the bait will imitate a sick or injured bait fish. 90% of fish are in 10% of the water. He had to take his fresh water skills into the salt water. He uses crappy jigs to catch trout. Remember to "Match The Hatch". Which means keep your bait the size of the mouth of the fish you are targeting. When you figure out what size bait they are keyed into, use that size bait. Mullet will be running in a few weeks at Matanzas and you can catch a tarpon. Redfish and trout are school fish and flounder is a community fish. Cast past a school of fish. Trout will be in deeper water and you can catch them with miro lures. Use chug bugs, skitter walks for your artificial bait. Drift them in grasses and over oyster beds and get the bait by the grasses. An eddy is a swirling hole indicating a deep hole and the bait sinks to the bottom. Look for bottom structures, use a fish finder or your paddle. Rig up your kayak, less is more and more is less. He carries 8 rods on the side when he fishes fresh water. If you are flats fishing or fly fishing, carry dry cloths and rain gear with you. The basic kayak has cup holders, an anchor trolley and rod holders. Put stake out pole, use PVC, put through the hole and move the loop either way to adjust the anchor trolley for the current. If you have water coming up through the stuffer holes, it means the weight in the boat is too heavy. Don't think that an oncoming boat sees you, let him pass first. PFD (Personal Flotation Device) you need one on a kayak, wear it like an inflatable and make sure to have a whistle on board. When you plan your trip think, weather, winds and tides. You want the tide to push you on your way out and when going back in, you want it to push you back. Don't paddle against the tide, it will exhaust you. Check

a flood tide above 4 or 5 feet. You present bait that

the wind, in the afternoon the winds can pick up. You can't exhaust yourself, launch closer to where you will be fishing. If you have no shade on your kayak, stay fully clothed unless you have an umbrella. Wet your shirt to cool you off if you get too hot. He uses top water lures, like a chug bug, it has a rattle in it. He walks the dog with it on the top using a skitter walk with a higher pitch. As the sun rises, he uses a miro lure, twitch the rod and it looks like it is wounded. Set up with a popping cork, fan cast your rod at high tide and keep casting in a circle to find where the fish are at. Look for the redfish schools and wait for them to come to you. You can fish silently in a kayak. Rig your hook up to be weedless across oyster beds and you won't get hung up. Cast if you see a mullet school, predator fish can be underneath them. When fishing for snook, they like to be in structures, so use a 30 or 40 pound leader. Don't use a 20 pound, because they will snap it. Use 20 pound braid line and a 20 pound mono leader for reds and trout. Question was asked about offshore fishing but he said he does not fish in the ocean. You should not go fishing in a kayak in the ocean unless you are experienced. He has lights around his kayak, but you have to be careful what color lights you use, at night time, you don't want anyone to think it is a big boat. The lights he has on the boat are legal. He said he uses fish bites, a fight club series, jerk bait or a paddle tail on a weedless set up. He uses a popping cork with a jighead that has a shrimp on it and he calls it a deadly combo. Most of the kayak tournaments are Catch, Photo and Release and you have to use a bump board. The people running the tournament give you a token to put in the photo when you take the picture of your fish. His parting remark to all of us was to "Pick up plastics while you are out there!" 50/50 Winner: Was Ann Pfeil and she received
