November Fishing Forecast

Offshore anglers will find plenty of hungry bottom fish this month. Dropping squid or frozen sardines down to the wrecks and reefs, in 80 to 100 feet of water should yield some nice grouper and sea bass. For larger bottom fish – beef up the tackle and drop down live bait, such as pinfish or mullet. Red grouper should start to stack up in areas with patchy hard bottom in more than 100 feet of water, also. On nice days between the windy fronts, a trip to the ledge may prove to be well worth the time. Trolling in November should be hot for yellowfin tuna and large wahoo!

While the area was spared major effects from the storms this year, the high winds and heavy surf seemed to shorten the fall mullet run. As the weather starts to turn cold, surf (and pier) fishing should heat up. Black drum, bluefish, flounder, and redfish will all be following the plentiful bait. Large sheepshead will also be moving into areas that have barnacles and oysters attached to structure. Pompano, whiting,

and large croakers should also make a nice showing this month

Inshore fishermen should start scouting out their favorite trout holes this month. As the water temperature drops, larger trout will get more active as they recover from their breeding season. Topwater plugs or live bait under a float will help bag your limit of trout. Redfish will fall prey to similar tactics. The flounder bite has really picked up this year also, look for this to continue in November. Using a live mullet on a fishfinder rig or artificial soft plastics should work well to entice these fish to bite. Also inshore, black drum and sheepshead will be thick on structure in water more than 8 feet deep. I like fishing a 1/4 ounce jighead tipped with a small piece of shrimp for these notorious bait thieves.

Good luck on the water, and remember to submit pictures of your catch!

Chuck G. also introduced, Tammy and Tony Black from our sponsor, Rytech. Rytech handles water leak damage and mold remediation. Please call them if you have any of these problems. Chuck G. welcomed Deborah McGriff to her new position as Quartermaster.

SPEAKER:

Our speaker is Associate professor, Jimmy Liao from Whitney Labs. As a background, Jimmy was born in Brooklyn, NY he has been with Whitney Labs for the past 11 years. His son was born 2 months ago and was named Kai which means ocean. His subject tonight is Fish Behavior – he showed us some pictures with redfish. He is involved in a research program with the local redfish population. He has picked his research subject to be redfish, maybe later he will research snook or pompano. They don't know too much about the habits of the redfish, where they go, why they are here and what they do in the inter-coastal. Most of his work is in the lab. They are taking a new direction and going out in boats tagging fish, trying to study them and do experiments in the lab. One picture was showing fish in turbulence, the red areas showed clockwise direction and the blue areas showed counter clockwise spin in the water. They try to understand relevant motions of reds in a tank. Ms. Petersen is tagging a bull redfish, with a large tag, that resembles a Fitbit. This is to help them understand how the fish are moving. They have Go Pro cameras and they look at the video for fish turning and then check the Fitbit. In the picture red traces of fish are moving along. They want to build a library of fish motions and when they swim away. If you can recover the tag, you can look at the data. They are using a video now but if they can get the tag back it will be better to understand the pattern of movements and what drives it. There is no data on redfish in northeast Florida, some

snook, but no info on reds. The cost of acoustic tagging is \$400.00 for each tag and the battery life is 2 years and it pings every 2 seconds. The receiver part has a battery that lasts for a month, \$3-4 thousand dollars for the receiver. At this time, they only have 6 receivers and if the fish swims by the receivers they can get data on them. This is state of the art equipment. Some receivers are in St. Augustine and some in Matanzas. They had to pull out the receivers during Hurricane Dorian. In the Keys, divers pick up the receivers but you have to pay the divers to get them. After a month, the receivers start getting a growth on them and should be cleaned. The receivers and tags need numbers of how far they need to be apart to read the tags. Every 50 meters or so, he dropped down the receivers. They are targeting over slot redfish to tag and so far 10 bull reds have been tagged. He wants help in tagging them in St. Augustine Inlet. On their research boat, they have a hose with fresh sea water, a neoprene sling to keep the fish wet, insert the tag and it only takes a few minutes. Then they release it back into the water. At the Bridge of Lions they tagged a 32" fish to see when the fish come in and go out. If you are able to help Whitney Labs researchers out with slot redfish they you have caught, you need to be in their boat or have your boat around where they are in the water. Contact the Professor at Whitney Labs and find out when their boat will be out and if you can help them out, let him know. They usually fish for 3 days, please spread the word they need equipment like bait and a future sponsor. They are currently working out of a boat that one of the professors donated, but they could use more boats. Their program is called the Redfish Tagging Program. The tags are placed on the dorsal fin. Jimmy also said if some of the local guides can help them find bull reds, it would help them out. Please speak to him if you want to sign up for his program.
