Finally, on the kids' side, we are partnering with CCA in their Star Tournament next year by sponsoring a \$5,000 scholarship for Flagler County kids entering, catching and releasing fish in their tournament. There are a bunch more odds and ends that we can talk about later but these are the biggies.

As you can see, we have been busy listening and doing, based on what you told us you wanted. You also told us you wanted a dues increase, so you'll get that too. Dues for 2020 will be \$70 per family. This is our first increase in fifteen years, and I hope you all see the value in your membership.

That's it for 2019, and with no meeting in December, Pat and I wish all of you a safe and loving holiday season.

December Fishing Forecast Captain Jim Britton saltytalesfishingcharters.com

Gather up your fiddler crabs, clams, oysters, or shrimp – December will be a great month for targeting large sheepshead. To catch these "striped bandits," try fishing deeper areas with plenty of submerged structure (oysters, rocks, or anything else which encourages crustacean growth). Use a small stout live bait hook and just enough weight to hold your favorite bait on the bottom. Another tried and true tactic, for attracting sheepshead, is to pull your boat up to a bridge or dock and scrape the barnacles and other small crustaceans off the pilings. Once you have created a chum slick drop down a bait and be ready for the bite! Other inshore faire, in December, will be an increased number of sea trout and bluefish in the drop-offs along the Intracoastal Waterway. For these fish, try free lining a shrimp along current breaks caused by a significant change in water depth. Also, check out your favorite flat for sight fishing opportunities for schooling redfish and black drum.

In the surf, anglers can expect the whiting bite to continue. Also be on the look out for increased numbers of flounder, redfish, black drum and sheepshead. Sea Trout and their cousin, weakfish, will be caught using hard plastic baits as well.

Offshore anglers should take advantage of days with light winds to get out to the near shore wrecks or reefs to target amberjack, cobia, and triggerfish. Also if weather allows, traveling a little farther should produce some grouper in the 80 to 100 foot range. A trip to the ledge will still see anglers rewarded with wahoo, dolphin, and black fin tuna.

During this holiday season remember those less fortunate and help when and where you can by donating your time, money, or even just some kind words and a helping hand. Tight lines and hopefully everyone will fish their way into the new year!

SPEAKER: Adam Morley

Our speaker is Cpt. Adam Morley, native Floridian, who with his wife, Jeanne, own Genung's Fish Camp in Crescent Beach. He got his Captain's license as a teenager. Eight years ago, he and his wife started a recycling company. He has a boat called "The Litter Gitter" Matanzas River Keeper that goes from Flagler/ Palm Coast to the St. Augustine inlet and is part of the Water Keeper Alliance, which keeps a body of water clean. He is the Cpt. of Eco Tours that goes out 12 times a month taking 4-6 people on board. The trip is free, but you work it out with sweat equity by helping clean up the waterways litter. He said people are amazed at how much litter is out there, you may not see it right away but when you do, you don't forget it. On one of his tours, in a creek, in 2 hours, they loaded the boat with trash. In 3 years of clean up, he has removed 12 tons of trash. The Litter Gitter is his newest boat and he is able to expand his range now. Since April, they have picked up over 8,000 lbs. To buy his boat, the Community Foundation for N.E. Florida gave him a grant of \$10,000.00 and he said they are looking to give money away. They are looking for waterway projects to help out with. He said you can check Google Maps to see the debris that is in the waterways and that if we use these plastics, we are all at fault. He demonstrated how a regular plastic bucket starts to photo degrade and it breaks into smaller pieces that absorb metals, the toxins from the plastics, go into the plankton that the fish eat. Every week, a credit card's worth of micro plastic is in the air, water and food. Chemicals become a problem and cause a health issue. Waste is not an intentional trash, it comes from unintentional trash, like overflowing garbage pails, animals get into it and spread it and the wind can blow it into the waterways, along with litterbugs spreading it. Eleven states still have a glass deposit tax, with a 98% reclaim rate. Online shopping can contribute by putting a small item in a bigger box or boxes, causing extra waste materials. Classic recycling is not working, need bigger solutions, look for reusable plastics, the cost may be more to the consumer. He said his company is in partnership with Waste Pro, they single out the aluminum & wood for recycling. He thinks we could do a whole lot better at cleaning the water at the water treatment plants before putting it back into the waterway. Need to be proactive on the waste that goes into the landfill and sort it out better, so more items can be recycled first. Question was asked if he goes to schools to educate the children. He wants as many people all ages to be aware of this issue. At Genung's if you bring in your own bait container for dead shrimp, you get a rebate from them. In Volusia County, they are working on a patent for plastic alternatives for straws, for in the future. This is a global issue!
