Recipe of the Month: The Crab Bomb By Chris Christian



Servings – **4** Prep – **10 min** Cook – **15 min**

Ingredients

- 2 lbs. jumbo lump crab meat
- 1/4 cup panko

breadcrumbs

- 2 sticks unsalted butter
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 2tsp white vinegar
- 1 tbs Old Bay seasoning
- Parsley for garnish
- Kosher salt and black pepper to taste

This is a wonderful recipe that is a knock off the famous 'Crab Bomb" Served at Jerry's Seafood in a suburb of Washington D.C. It is rich with butter and most importantly, jumbo lump crab meat. The serving size is huge, about 1/2 lb. per person.

Directions:

- Mix old bay seasoning with crab meat several hours before serving.
- Melt butter and mix with vinegar.
- In a bowl mix the crab meat with mayonnaise, panko, then season with a little salt and pepper.
- Using your hands, being careful not to break up the lumps make 4 (1/2 lb.) tennis ball sized balls of the crab mixture and place them in individual heat proof ramekins.
- Pour the melted butter/vinegar mixture over the crab meat.
- Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 15 minutes or until it sizzles.
- Garnish with parsley.

Well, it will not be long before all the talk will be about our nearshore Cobia bite! These big bruisers should be following the Manta Rays

(currently in Brevard County) north just as soon as our water warms up a little more. When these fish arrive, we will see everything from 10 foot jon boats to 30 + foot offshore vessels chasing them. On busy days remember to be courteous - too many boats chasing the same ray will ensure that nobody gets a good chance to hook up. If you see another angler stalking a ray, stay back and keep alert, chances are another ray will come into the picture shortly. Artificial baits like large topwaters or plastic eels, and large swimbaits should make for a productive day. If bait is more your thing - try porgies, mullet, shrimp, blue crabs, or even a large mud minnow.

Inshore anglers can expect a steady diet of redfish, trout, and flounder now that spring has

arrived. Fish deeper holes and creeks on an outgoing tide with shrimp, mullet, or your favorite artificial jig. Follow the fish onto the flats, on the incoming tides and target your favorite shoreline or oyster bars with these same baits, as well.

Offshore captains will be productive with trolling spreads, dolphin show up in numbers at the start of spring. Skirted and naked ballyhoo have been the bait of choice. A few large wahoos are still being caught, as well.

In the surf (much like the cobia) pompano are starting to show up in good numbers just to the south of Flagler County. Therefore, it should not be long before these delectable treats will be making their way north also. Shrimp, sand fleas, clams, and even jigs tipped with Fish Bites will all work well for an invitation to dinner! Surfcasters can also look forward to Spanish mackerel showing up in April. These fish are a lot of fun to target with Gotcha plugs, silver spoons or topwater plugs. Remember to use a heavier leader to prevent these toothy creatures from cutting you off.

Conservation and Regulation Update by Captain Tim Jarvis



Conservation Time! Did you know the sunscreen you use can have a harmful effect on water quality and marine life?

An estimated 14,000 tons of sunscreen enters our rivers and oceans every year. Effective in 2021 Hawaii and The Florida Keys will have a ban on the sale and

distribution of sunscreen containing oxybenzone and octinoxate.

So, what can you do to help all the while continuing to protect yourself while in the sun? Below are some tips and suggested sunscreen ingredients.

- Seek Shade between 10am thru 2pm.
- Use an Umbrella, Sun Hat, UV Sunglasses, Sun Shirt with UPF protection and leggings.
- Avoid spray sunscreens. Spray sunscreen leaves traces of sunscreen on surfaces around you that lead to being in the water. Also spray sunscreens are inhaled and can cause damage to your lungs over a long period of time.
- Choose a mineral based sunscreen with zinc oxide or titanium dioxide- "non-nano" size.
- Checkout haereticus-lab.org for ways you can continue to protect our land and sea.

This section provides information on Engine Cut-off Switches and propeller safety for both the Recreational Boater and Manufacturers.

On April 1, 2021 a new federal law goes into effect that

ENGINE CUT-OFF SWITCHES

requires the operator of a boat with an installed Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS) to use the ECOS link. The link is usually a coiled bungee cord lanyard clipped onto the operator's person, Personal Floatation Device (PFD) or clothing and the other end attached to the cut-off switch, but there are plenty of variations on the market, including electronic wireless devices. The law applies on all "Navigable Waters of the US".

When an operator is wearing a link while underway, the engine will cut-off if the operator is separated from the operating area, an occurrence that can happen if the operator is ejected from the vessel or falls within the vessel. The shutdown of the engine is essential for safety reasons. If the operator is ejected from the vessel, the shutdown may prevent the operator from impacting the vessel's spinning propeller, and may aid the operator in safely returning to the drifting vessel.

The law applies to "Covered Recreational vessels" which means any motorized boat with 3 or more horsepower that is less than 26 feet in length and takes effect on April 1, 2021.

Operator Requirement: An individual operating a covered recreational vessel shall use an engine cut-off switch link while operating on plane or above displacement speed.

An earlier law, passed by congress in 2018, required manufactures to install an Emergency Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS). The law passed on December 4th 2018, and went into effect 1 year later. Even though it is now a law, most U.S. boat manufacturers have voluntarily installed an ECOS on their boats for decades.

The terms Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS) and Engine/ Propulsion Cut-Off Devices are used interchangeably to denote a system that disables the propulsion engine when the operator is unexpectedly displaced from the vessel.

Why you should wear your Engine Cut-off Switch link?

A typical three-blade propeller running at 3,200 rpm can inflict 160 impacts in one second so it is critical that you are aware of what is going on around you. Be aware:

- People in the water may not be visible from the helm
- Account for passengers before starting the engine
- Inform passengers about propeller hazard areas
- Be alert in congested areas and near swimming zones
- Take extra precaution around towed watersports
- Never permit riding on the bow, gunwale, transom, seatbacks, or other locations where an occupant could fall overboard
- Children should be watched carefully at all times it only takes a second to fall overboard
- ullet You would childproof your home so think about childproofing your boat
- Establish rules for swim platform use, boarding ladders, and seating
- If someone falls overboard, STOP the boat; once clear begin recovery procedures

Warning - Never put your boat in reverse to pick someone up out of the water, always circle around going forward while keeping the person in the water visible to the boat operator at all times.

showed up for the weigh in, there was a 35 lb. and a 20 lb. Black drum fish weighed in. The CPR Tournament is going strong. One fish will get you an entry into the tournament and you get an entry for every 5 fish you enter. Tim has 50 releases and a lot of entries for this year. He said we need volunteers to run the tournaments up to the end of the year, so let him know if you are available.

Count the Spots Tournament: Bill Moore and Carol Webb will be chairing this event on March 27th flyer is in the March Chum Line. Start time 6:30 AM, weigh in at Bings Landing from 2-3 PM. Raffle Prizes include a 6 ft. Penn rod & reel, a donation was made of a Shakespeare Ugly Stick rod, tackle Bag with lures and paddle tails made up by Bill Moore. There is a sign-up sheet in the back or you can sign up online and also buy your tickets online.

Guest Speaker: Cpt. Billy Pettigrew – He travels to GA, LA and around FL in the spring and early summer, when the water is warming and the bait is running. He fishes on an outgoing or incoming tide. Uses rattle, speckled trout or bone color artificial baits. Also uses a natural paddle tail, watermelon red color, 3 point 3 hooks. Redfish will come completely out of the water to get to the bait, they shake the bait by coming up behind it. You work the bait by twitching it, when you see the fish behind it. As the tide gets higher, use a jig head and beef it up to a 8 ounce or ½ ounce jig head, match the jig head to the baits. In higher water, you want your bait lower, if the water is 18 inches to 2 foot or more he uses a jig head, mostly a red, root beer or penny color. If using Gulp shrimp, leave the tail on, so it looks natural. He uses Chatter bait on a windy day. He walked around the room, showing the audience what the baits looked like and how they were hooked
