Recipe of the Month: Crab Salad

August Fishing Report by Captain Tim Jarvis



Offshore: Kingfish, Cobia, and Sharks. Slow troll with live bait on wrecks, reefs and ledges. Always look for birds and bait on top of the water. If you prefer

to Bottom fish try finding some good current and put out a few chum bags for mangrove snapper, mutton snapper and an occasional kingfish. Try drifting over wrecks and ledges, using a double rig or a knocker rig.

For Nearshore and our surf and pier anglers you will continue to catch whiting, bluefish, flounder and pompano using sandfleas, fiddler crabs and live shrimp. Free-lining larger live bait or using cut bait could lead you to Kingfish, Tarpon or Sharks. Reminder for Bonita, use gotcha plugs, top water plugs and any live bait for consistent action.

Inshore; I like to target Tarpon early morning in the creeks and canals. Use a live shrimp, croaker, pinfish, mullet, or pogie underneath a popping cork. You can also try using an artificial. I like to use a mirrodine top water lure or a jerk bait. Snook, Redfish and Trout on top water plugs or jerk baits around the oyster bars and grass edges on the flats. When it heats up switch to live bait, either popping cork and shrimp and also try live mullet or cut bait. Fish the banks around the inlet for a mixed bag everything from snapper to tarpon. I like to free line a shrimp, croaker, or mullet for any of these species or a quarter ounce to half ounce jig head with a shrimp, croaker or your favorite live or artificial bait.

Club Meeting Minutes 07-06-2021

Meeting called to order by President, Chris Christian

Pledge of Allegiance – Presented by Ron Gorney

Passing of June 1, 2021 Minutes, Motion made by Peter Bessette, seconded by Tim Miller

Welcome New Members/Visitors/First Responders – Guests / New Members 7

Welcome Annual Sponsors: CCI – Dana Syens and Clymer Funeral Home – Kevin Clymer. Chris Christian mentioned to the members to look on the back of their membership card for our sponsors. CCI handles all kinds of insurance, Clymer handles your plans for the future. He also said that if anyone is not getting our club emails or your Chum Line, please check your spam mail. If nothing is in spam from the club, let us know and we will try to help you get the emails to you. You should be receiving the Chum Line around the 1st of the month and the Fishing Line around the 20th of the month.

Special Announcements – Chris – Kid's Clinic is scheduled for the 24th of July, it was cancelled last year due to Covid-19. Fish Florida furnishes us with the free fishing rods for the kids, we have about 150 rods for this year. We teach kids to fish; we chum the waters, and the kids fish off the dock at Herschel King with shrimp. Last time we had the clinic, the kids caught fish and had a great time. Volunteers be there by 8 AM to help set up the stations and get ready for a fun day. There will be a free rod for the kids who complete their stations and free hot dogs for the kids and Mom/Dad. See Betty to sign up as a volunteer for this.

Finance Report: Tim Miller said the balance in the checking account is all good and we have engaged with a CPA firm for an audit. We are looking at outsourcing the bookkeeping to keep up with the check book. The finances look good, the 50/50 and the raffle amounts are looking good also.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month – Chuck Radloff reported the results of the Year Long Tournament, Leaders - Ladies-Lauren Oakwood and in second place is Deborah McGriff, Men-Mark Heffley and in second place is Aby Moghanaki. Mark has advised us that he will be moving out of the area for about one year. FOM for June winner was Laura Oakwood with a 48 lb. King Mackerel and Charles Hoyt for Dolphin fish. July FOM will be a Flounder that measures 14". August FOM is Snapper (anything but Red Snapper) Chuck mentioned if anyone is doing a State Reef Fishing license online to be careful on what boxes you check. So far for the first year of CPR we have 194 fish registered. The Red Snapper Tournament will be from July 9-11th. The weather should hold 3-4 ft waves and you do not have to sign up, they can be any size and you can only keep one. Awards were presented for the June Offshore Tournament – Mike Crotts won for the most species-3rd place, Charles Hiott, most species 2nd place, Tim Miller, most species 1st place. For Heaviest fish – 3rd place Chris Christian- Dolphin fish-3 lb. 9 oz, 2nd place Michael Brandon -Amberjack-13 lb., 10 oz and 1st place Lauren Oakwood-King Mackerel-48 lb. 3 oz.

Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said the CPR tournament is going well. The Team Tournament went over well, Frank Meekins made some great food, all the spots were filled for the fish prizes and there were 69 people at the weigh in. Need input on how to make the Kayak Tournament better. August 21st will be the Trash & Trash Fish Tournament at Bings; we need a chairperson for this event. Upcoming Red Snapper Tournament this weekend and the Overnight Tournament has been changed to

July 16-17th, Gary Fisher will be the chairperson for this tournament and Ernie Morris with the DAV will be helping him. The weigh in will be from 10-11 AM on Sat. morning at Bings Landing. Flyer with all the info was in your July Chum Line, helpers are needed for selling the 50/50 and raffle tickets.

DAV Check Presentation – The Spring Classic Captains meeting was held at the VFW in April. There were silent auction items, raffle items, bags and shirts for the classic anglers, Dana Syens and Peter Bessette were the chairpersons on this, Jeanie Bessette ran the silent auction, friends of Rita Waddell came down from Kentucky to participate and help us out, we had volunteers from the DAV, along with the many other volunteers who freely give of their time for this most charitable event. Dana spoke and said the money that is raised goes to the Disabled Veterans and it stays here in Palm Coast, Flagler County. She requested that whoever takes over the tournament next year to continue to support the DAV. Ernie Morris of the DAV spoke and told us that this money covers the upkeep of their building, helps provide transportation to doctor's appointments for the veterans, and many other things that they need. Senator Waltz came down to help them open up after Covid-19. They train people to help the veterans to obtain the benefits that they deserve and help their spouses in time of need. They provide help for the young veterans who are now returning with PTSD problems. They helped our members, Bill May and Gary Fisher get benefits they deserved. The DAV is a non-profit organization. They are always looking for people who want to help out, you could answer the phones, be a driver, a non-compensated employee, or a service sponsor who helps the guys get their compensation. You do not have to be a veteran to be a volunteer with the DAV. The big check for \$12,000.00 was given to the representatives of the DAV tonight and Danielle Anderson was present to take a picture for the newspaper.

Break

Guest Speaker: Capt. Kevin Duckworth-Niteline Charters – Cpt. Kevin has been in business for about 2 yrs., he has done around 75 trips a year and does family fishing trips for 6 people. He told us to fish the dock lights, activity from small fish will attract the larger fish. Look for green water or bright LED lights shining down on the water, porch lights help attract the bugs that the small fish go after. A trolling motor is the best to use, slow down and sight fish, so you can actually see what fish are there. If people ask you to not fish their docks, then leave. When casting around docks, make a clean cast, it may take using lighter equipment. He uses a 7 ft rod, 15-pound braid and a 20-inch fluorocarbon leader, with a cigar float and a 2-ought hook, if fishing for sea trout you should downsize the hook to fit the mouth of the fish. He also freelines shrimp with split shot. When fishing deeper water for snook or tarpon, he uses a Penn Battle rod & Penn equip., a size 1-6 ought circle hook with split shot, take the tail off of the shrimp and use a float that has a swizzle in a bright color the fish can see. Baits -best luck with live shrimp, mullet or pogy, 2nd best is Gulp 4" paddetails in white or chartreuse. Tides are critical, look at incoming and outgoing tides. Plan trip around outgoing tides and look for bait activity. Time of fishing from 8-8:45 PM the bite gets better the later it gets but it is tide dependent. He fishes to about 1-2 AM. Safety is important, watch the water ahead of you!


