Recipe of the Month: Grilled Florida Mahi-Mahi with Tropical Fruit Salsa



Ingredients

(Yield 4 Servings)

- 4 (6-8 ounce) mahi-mahi fillets
- 3 Tablespoons unsalted butter
- 6 shallots, minced
- 4 slices fresh ginger, unpeeled, minced
- l clove garlic, minced

Freshly ground black pepper to taste

Directions

Preheat grill or broiler. Arrange fillets in a grilling basket or on a broiler pan coated with nonstick cooking spray; set aside.

In a small-sized skillet, melt butter over medium heat and add minced shallots, ginger and garlic. Cook 8 to 10 minutes until golden. Remove skillet from heat.

Reserve half of the shallot-ginger-garlic mixture.

Brush fillets with remaining shallot-ginger -garlic mixture.

Grill or broil fillets 4 to 5 inches from heat for 6 minutes or until cooked through, turning once.

Transfer fillets to plates and drizzle with reserved shallot-ginger-garlic mixture combination.

December Fishing Reportby Captain Jim Britton





Gather up your fiddler crabs, clams, oysters, or shrimp — December will be a great month for targeting large sheepshead. To

catch these "striped bandits" try fishing deeper areas with plenty of submerged structure (oysters, rocks, or anything else which encourages crustacean growth). Use a small stout live bait hook and just enough weight to hold your favorite bait on the bottom. Another tried and true tactic, for attracting sheepshead, is to pull your boat up to a bridge or dock and scrape the barnacles and other small crustaceans off the pilings. Once you have created a chum slick drop down a bait and be ready for the bite! Other inshore fair, in December, will be an increased number of sea trout and bluefish in the drop-offs along the Intracoastal Waterway. For these fish try free lining a shrimp along current breaks caused by a significant change in water depth. Also, check out your favorite flat for

sight fishing opportunities for schooling redfish and black drum.

In the surf, anglers can expect the whiting bite to continue. Also be on the look out for increased numbers of flounder, redfish, black drum and sheepshead. Sea Trout and their cousin, weakfish, will be caught using hard plastic baits as well.

Offshore anglers should take advantage of days with light winds to get out to the near shore wrecks or reefs to target amberjack, cobia, and triggerfish. Also if weather allows, traveling a little farther should produce some grouper in the 80 to 100 foot range. A trip to the ledge will still see anglers rewarded with wahoo, dolphin, and black fin tuna.

During this holiday season remember those less fortunate and help when and where you can by donating your time, money, or even just some kind words and a helping hand. Tight lines and hopefully everyone will fish their way into the new year!

Conservation and Regulation Update

FWC has been busy over the past couple of weeks. Below are some changes currently in effect and a few upcoming changes.

Starting November 1st through December 31st, Spotted Sea Trout will

be closed to recreational harvest. This change includes all state and federal waters from Palm Beach County through Volusia County.

Reminder, Spotted Seatrout as well as Red Drum and Snook also remain catch and release only through May 31, 2021. This effects all waters from Hernando/Pasco county line through Gordon Pass in Collier County.

Effective November 1st the recreational harvest for Hogfish will close. This closure includes all state and federal waters off the east coast of Florida and Florida Keys. Also included in this closure is Cape Sable on the Gulf side up thru the Atlantic coast.

Recreational bag limit for King Mackerel has increased to four fish per person per day through March 16th, 2021. This includes all Atlantic state and federal waters from Miami-Dade through Nassau counties. This change remains consistent with recent changes in Atlantic federal waters to address forgone fishing opportunities in the recreational community.

Reminder, Snook fishing closes December 15^{th} through January 31^{st} and June 1^{st} through August 31^{st} . Snook for keep should remain 28-32 (Slot) inches in total length.

Recreational limit is only 1 per day and zero for any captain for hire.

Ever wonder if you are holding a fish correctly? Here are some helpful tips to remember when bringing a fish out of water

- Any fish 40 inches and up should never be removed from the water.
- Make sure your hands are wet. This is important when handling Seatrout, as they have a protective slim.
- 3. Ensure you hold the fish horizontally. You should hold the fish from underneath with 1 hand right behind the head and your other hand supporting the fish's stomach. If you hold a large fish vertically, you could damage their insides.
- 4. If you grab a fish by the mouth, do not apply a lot of pressure as you could damage the mouth (poke a hole in the lip) that could impact their ability to eat. Also watch to ensure your fingers do not enter the fish gill plate.

Special Speaker: Capt. Mike Vickers,

Jr. Topic: Reel Maintenance

Mike gave us the ins and outs of how to keep your reels maintained for the best results. The most important thing to do is to rinse your fishing rod and reel with a garden hose when you get home, all over. Do not soak the reel in a bucket if you get sand on it, the sand will go inside your reel mechanisms. Rinse them even if you did not use them. Your two number one enemies are Salt & Sand. Today's reels are not made like they use to be, we have plastics & roller bearings in today's reels. Maintenance is different between conventional and spinning reels. Bait runners are not an easy reel to maintain and it is not a simple reel. He prints out the schematics for each reel he will be working on, it helps so you will know what parts are involved. Many times when you open the reel, parts fly off and you need to know what part you may have lost. Tools he uses are - needle nose pliers, picks, crescent wrench, multibit screw driver set, Q-Tips, small paintbrush & toothbrush, Penn wrench (this is a specialty tool), box cutter, star or small Phillips head screws-you can find these tools at a hardware store. Also WD40 penetrating oil for rusty stuff & WD40 lubricating gel, Penn grease and 3 in 1 oil on conventional reels. Mike passed around many parts to the reels, so we could see what they looked like. If you are looking for parts you can go to Mikesreelrepair.com. Question was asked about the cost of a reel repair and a cleaning @Hammock Bait & Tackle and he said \$25.00.
