From the Helm February 2020

FWC has been hard at work on the regulatory front with new regulations already in place and more on the horizon. January 1st brought some regulatory changes in our offshore bottom species. A number of grouper species are out of season 1/1/2020 to 4/30/2020 in Atlantic Federal waters. These are gag, black, red, scamp, rock hind, red hind, coney, graysby, yellowfin and yellowmouth grouper.

Inshore, Snook reopens February 1st, but closes June 1-Aug. 31 this year. The big news is in spotted seatrout regulations effective 2/1/2020. The area we fish has been broken down into two zones with the Flagler/Volusia county line separating FWC's northeast and east central zones. Everything south of the county line is in the east central zone; north in the northeast zone. Slot size statewide is 15-19 inches total length. You may keep one fish over 19 inches per vessel. The east central zone will

close November and December. Bag limits change as well; northeast 5 fish, and east central 2 fish. From a practical perspective, don't bring more than 2 trout back to Volusia even if you caught them in Flagler. I also suggest you all get on FWC's mailing list or download the fish rules app onto your tablet or cell phone to keep you out of trouble.

On a different subject, please give us some feedback on the Red and Black Tournament. Based on your input, we split the tournament into two divisions: power boats or paddle boats, each with their own prizes. Our aim is to get more people out there fishing per tournament without limiting how they can fish.

That's all for now. See you on the water. Chuck

As far as the inshore fishing goes, the trout bite keeps getting better. Try fishing deep holes on an outgoing tide by jigging with just enough weight to reach the bottom but not "hold "the bottom.

Artificial baits, live baits, and fresh dead baits will all work with this technique. For the redfish (enjoy the clear water while we have it!), try sight fishing your favorite flat (a mid afternoon outgoing tide will provide the warmest water opportunities). Just like hunting – stealth is essential! For the inshore slam, you can also target nice sized flounder this month. My favorite flounder bait is a red, ¼ ounce jighead with a mud minnow. Flounder is an ambush predator; therefore target them by slowly dragging the minnow through holes or around structure.

In the surf, bluefish are eating anything thrown near them! Hard plastic baits, any shiny metal with

a hook attached, or live or dead bait – as long as it is moving they will check it out. Black drum and whiting will also be available by fishing shrimp or cut bait on the bottom. Local pier fishermen will want to fish the structure with sand fleas or fiddler crabs to take advantage of the sheepshead and black drum population while the water temperatures are still low.

Offshore anglers will want to take advantage of any days where the wind is not howling. The rewards for making it to the ledge will be large wahoo! Fast trolling, dark lure combinations including black, red, and purple should allow for a full fish box. On the bottom, anglers can expect to find big schools of large trigger fish and some large cobia on the wrecks and reefs.

February will be Sheepshead.



Please let us know if you or someone you know can help fill this position. In our 2019 member's survey, you wanted to do more social events, rather than have a speaker at the meeting. Tonight we had Cpt. Jim Britton give the Quick Tips feature. There are 14 entrants for the chili cook off. The judges will be tasting the chili, and the winners will be announced before the break, then at the break, we will get to taste them. Next month, we will again have a guest speaker. REPORTS:

Finance Report: Fred Manzolillo reported that we still have money in the bank from last year and we are looking to give back better raffle prizes and more money for this year's tournaments.

Weighmaster Report: Chuck Radloff said we are making progress on Catch, Photo and Release and will be having a tournament for it. Chuck R. is still looking to present Aby Moghanaki his prize for FOM in Oct. Karen Dougherty won FOM in December with the largest whiting and received a gift certificate to Cpts. BBQ. FOM for Jan. will be black drum. January 25th will be the Sheepshead Tournament and for Feb., FOM will be Sheepshead. There are new federal regulations for bluefish of 3 per person, 5 per head boat-minimum size 14". State waters are not changing and stay at 10 per day. Effective Feb. 01, 2020, new rules on trout size limit more than 15" and less than 19" total length. May possess one over 19" per vessel included in bag limit. Volusia county south, 2 per harvester, closed Nov. 1 – Dec. 31st. Flagler County north, 5 per day, open year round. Sheepshead is staying at 8. Always check the FWC website for changes in the fish regulations. For the Year Long Tournament, you can win one species according to the rules. Winners for the 2019 Year Long are posted on our website, results are pending to make sure no one has any slips that were not reported or turned in. Feb. 4th will be final if no one contests the results. Check our website for all the weigh stations you can use and some new ones that have been added. A1A Fisheries is no longer a weigh station for the club. New additions are Salty Dawg Outfitters at Highbridge and St. Augustine Shipyard.

Spring Classic: Rita Waddell/Dana Syens are co-chairs again this year. Dana reported that last year they raised \$12,000.00 for the DAV in the tournament and they want to up that amount this year.
