## Recipe of the Month: Grilled Florida Yellowfin Tuna with Mango-Banana Chutney

### Ingredients

(Yield 4 Servings)  
4 (8oz.) Florida yellowfin tuna steaks  
1 cup mango, diced  
1 (8oz.) jar prepared mango chutney  
1/2 cup water  
1 cup bananas, diced  
1/4 cup seedless raisins  
1 TBS olive oil  
Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

### Directions

In a medium saucepan, combine chutney and water and heat to a simmer. Add diced bananas, diced mango and raisins to saucepan; simmer, uncovered, for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Remove from heat, cover and let stand 30 minutes. Lightly oil stovetop grill and heat over high heat.

Cook the tuna steaks to

desired doneness, turning once. Cook for 2 minutes on each side for rare center; 3 to 5 minutes on each side for medium center; 5 to 8 minutes on each side for well-done center.

Serve topped with mango-banana sauce.

## January Fishing Report by Captain Jim Britton



Happy New Year to all! If you are like me, you may have resolved to catch more fish this year (and if you have followed this

report you know that my resolution is always the same!) My plan to accomplish this is quite simply to attend fishing club meetings (with new safety protocols), to gain knowledge from members and guest speakers, and to keep a fishing log (if you already keep a log then refer back to past years to aid in planning your trips). Logs can be quite basic (a simple notebook or day planner) or elaborate (professional fishing journals, smartphone apps, or other electronic media).

So far we have seen a fairly mild winter, therefore, our inshore fishing patterns are shaping up similar to last year's bite. Even though our water has not become crystal clear yet, the temperature is dropping. Therefore January should provide us with a nice sheepshead and black drum bite. Target these fish around docks, bridges, and

deep holes with structure; using fiddler crabs or shrimp. You will also find some nice sea trout patrolling these same waters. As the sun warms the flats up redfish and flounder can be targeted in the shallows with artificial baits (Fish Bites – Fight Club, Zman, and Berkley Gulp all have been working well) or live finger mullet.

If the wind will allow a trip to the ledge, January is a great time to target trophy wahoo! High speed trolling ballyhoo with dark skirts (red, purple, blue, and black combinations are popular) or noisy naked lures (also using dark combinations) should entice the big ones. The bottom bite should also heat up as the temperature drops (make sure to check the ever changing regulations for closures and bag limits). Grouper, sea bass, trigger, and cobia should be waiting for a meal. Drop down live sardines or pinfish or cut sardines or squid to see which baits will ignite the bite.

Tight lines and much happiness to all in 2021, hopefully we can all settle into a safe "new normal"!

## Conservation and Regulation Update by Captain Tim Jarvis



Gag grouper will close to recreational harvest in Gulf state and federal waters on January 1, 2021. Several species of grouper will also close to recreational and commercial harvest in Atlantic state waters and all state waters off Monroe County, will also close on January 1, 2021.

The Atlantic seasonal closure includes gag, black, red, yellowmouth, and yellowfin grouper; scamp; red hind; rock hind; coney; and graysby. A similar closure will also occur in Atlantic federal waters. For gag grouper, state waters off Franklin, Wakulla, Taylor and Jefferson counties will reopen to harvest April 1 through June 30 and Sept. 1 through Dec. 31.

All other Gulf state waters (except waters off Monroe County, which follows the Atlantic state season) and all Gulf federal waters will reopen June 1 through Dec. 31. In the Atlantic and state waters of Monroe County, the grouper closure ends April 30, and harvest will reopen May 1.

Blueline Tilefish in Atlantic state waters (including Monroe County) effective January 1, 2021, the following regulations will go into effect for recreational harvest of

- A three Blueline Tilefish recreational bag limit within the three-fish aggregate bag limit for grouper and tilefish in Atlantic waters.
- An Atlantic state waters recreational season for harvest from May 1 through Aug 31.

### Jan 5th Chili Cook-Off

All active Club members - Please bring your Chili Cook-Off Entries between 6:30 and 7:00 PM on January 5<sup>th</sup> to the VFW, along with a serving spoon/ladle and any toppings you would like to use. The Club will provide bowls, napkins, spoons and cornbread.

Judging will be held during the first part of the meeting. Prizes will be given as follows:

First Place - \$50  
Second Place - \$30  
Third Place - \$20

Deborah McGriff will be present with a big sale of sweat shirts (\$30), hoodies (\$15) and T-shirts (\$10). Please give Deb a call at 404-218-4783 to let her know what sizes you are looking for so that she can make sure they are available. You may also reserve shirts when you call.

These new regulations are consistent with those in Atlantic federal waters and could help prevent both recreational quota overages and over fishing.

In previous articles we have shared pending changes when it comes to flounder regulations. At its December Commission meeting, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) approved changes to the management of Florida's flounder fishery. The following changes go into effect March 1, 2021;

- Extending ALL FWC flounder regulations into federal waters.
- Increasing the minimum size limit from 12 inches to 14 inches total length (recreational and commercial).
- Reducing the recreational daily bag limit from 10 to 5 fish per person.
- Establishing an Oct. 15 - Nov. 30 recreational closed season.
- For commercial harvesters using allowable gear: Establishing a commercial trip and vessel limit of 150 fish from Dec. 1 - Oct. 14, and 50 fish from Oct. 15 - Nov. 30.
- Modifying the incidental bycatch limit for commercial harvesters using non-allowable gear from 50 pounds to 50 fish/trip.
- Creating a federal waters trawl bycatch limit of 150 flounder/trip from Dec. 1 - Oct. 14, and 50 fish/trip from Oct. 15 - Nov. 30.

#### Conservation Time!

Catch and release fishing helps to sustain native fish populations by allowing more fish to remain and reproduce in the ecosystem. Fish can still die after being released. This can be caused by hook injury, handling practices, and air exposure.

A few tips to help released fish survive;

- Ensure your hands are wet when handling a fish
- Using the appropriate tackle for the fish you are targeting
- Keeping the fish in the water as much as possible.

Catch and Release is the greatest conversation to recreational anglers!

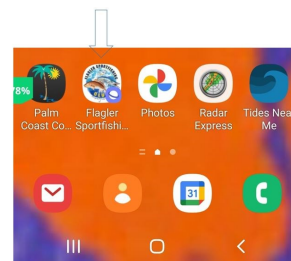
For every 5 released fish, the member will receive 1 entry in the year end drawing for prizes. All submitted fish must be with-in FWC rules for size and season. Full rules can be found on the submission page or on the member only web site. <http://sportfishbase.com/members/>

There are several important reasons for providing this type of opportunity to our club. The first is that not all anglers eat their fish and consequently will not fish kill tournaments just to weigh in a fish. There has been a noticeable decline in juvenile and adult game fish. This tournament will encourage the safe release of legal fish, thus providing more "keepers" for those who do want to harvest. Also, by compiling and sharing data, the club will be able to assist FWC, CCA, and our scientific community by providing real world data.

### Raffle Drawing –

After the tournament ends, a drawing of all eligible tickets will be made to determine winners. Members will not be required to be at the drawing to win. Winners will be responsible to collect prizes. Prizes will not be shipped.


