May 29th Bottom Trip

After a postponement of two weeks, the club bottom trip aboard the 90-foot Critter Fleet out of Ponce Inlet was held on May 29, 2021. After an hour and half, the boat arrived at a reef 26 miles Forty-Nine anglers were met by moderate seas and sunny skies with enough of a breeze to make the temperature throughout the day comfortable. The captain made many moves around the reefs to find active fish. Except for Red Snapper, that had to be released, few keepable fish were willing to take an ice bath in the fish box. The mates were helpful and friendly. Members did catch Sea Bass, Grouper, Vermilion Snapper, Mangrove Snapper, Mutton Snapper, Red Snapper, Trigger, Jacks, sharks along with boat load of Grunts. Some members also caught fish that qualified them in the yearlong tournament.

Recipe of the Month: Smoked Steak



- 1. Get a good piece of meat; 2" thick Ribeye or Porterhouse.
- 2. Season with Garlic Salt and Montreal Seasoning. Mix together
- vinegar, oil, butter and granulated garlic.
- 3. Let the steaks come to room temperature for an hour or so while the smoker is being readied.
- 4. Prepare the smoker for cooking
- 5. Fill your grill with natural charcoal and use an electric start or fire cubes to light. No briquettes and no lighter fluid.

- 6. Use your favorite wood for smoking.
- Heat the Grill/Smoker to at least 400 Degrees.
- Place the steaks on the grill—with lid open and spoon the vinegar and oil solution on the steak and step back. This will flame up for at least1-2 minutes; then flip and repeat.
- 9. Once you have a good sear, shut the lid and wait about 5 minutes.
- 10. Using a temperature probe, wait until the meat is at 130 degrees, take the steaks off and let them rest for 15 minutes. Ready to serve at medium rare.

Cook time-12 minutes

Offshore starting July 9th Red Snapper season opens. The season is only open for 3 days and closes on July 11th. Ensure you are targeting wrecks, drop offs and ledges

that are 60ft and on. Use the proper weight for the current you are fishing and use non-offset circle hooks. As far as bait, use pinfish or frozen sardines. Make sure you are properly venting the Red Snapper you choose not to keep. Fishing will still be in full swing for Wahoo, Mahi Mahi, and Amberjack.

For Nearshore troll with live pogies or live mullet to target Kingfish and Tarpon. There has been a lot of Bonita, use gotcha plugs, top water plugs and any live bait for consistent action. For our surf and pier anglers, you will also continue to catch whiting, bluefish, flounder, and pompano using sandfleas, fiddler crabs and live shrimp. Free-lining larger live bait or using cut bait could lead you to Kingfish, Tarpon or Sharks.

Inshore anglers, early morning Tarpon, Snook, Redfish and Trout on top water plugs or jerk baits around the oyster bars and grass edges. When it heats up switch to live bait, either popping cork and shrimp and try live mullet or cut bait. Also, you can try the seawalls and docks in the canals or along the

ICW have been holding some nice snapper, snook and flounder. Use quarter ounce jig head with live mud minnow, shrimp, or your favorite plastic bait. Also check the creek holes and creek mouth for Flounder, Trout and Redfish

Conservation and Regulation Update



Independence Day is one of my most favorite holidays. Why? I love fireworks and red snapper and July is the month for both. I'll leave the fireworks part to the people who put them on but I will take some time to talk red snapper.

By now you all know the dates, July 9,10 and 11, and if you have not done this before, get ready for the insanity that goes on offshore that weekend. I have seen 50 boats after red snapper

sink and 100 at 9-mile reef fishing shoulder-to-shoulder with total disregard for others. Keep in mind that everyone and their brother want to catch a red snapper and they show up in anything that floats. Many have no knowledge of offshore fishing, the dangers of going 30 miles offshore in a tiny boat with none of the proper equipment, so beware, be careful,

and keep the right attitude. That part out of the way, remember if you are running your own boat, make sure you have one descending device aboard and a State Reef Fish Angler Permit (FWC calls it a designation) for each angler. One fish per person per day with no size limit and you can be assured FWC, Home Land Security and the Coast Guard will be on the water and strictly enforcing the rules and running safety checks both offshore



and at the ramp, so make sure everything aboard is shipshape and up-to-date.

We got off to a rocky start with Marine Discovery Center but we still had about 10 members head down to New Smyrna to build some oyster matts on very short notice. Thanks to all for the participation and if you want a really cool day out, pay them a visit. MDC does some great things with our local fishery that you can see during your visit and even take an eco-tour on their pontoon boat. More to come with them so stay tuned.

Special Announcements – Chris: Litter Gitter Trip – The Matanzas River Keeper owns the boat, Cpt. Adam Morley takes it out with a crew of 6 people to collect trash, it launches out of Bings Landing. Today the boat went out with Elle, Brian, Jake, Scott, Becky and Lisa, Lisa said it was a highly informative trip and they collected 300 lbs. of trash, they had a good time. Elle & Brian Phillips said they learned a lot about fiddler crabs and jelly fish.

Snook Season: Is closed until August 31st.

Big Sale: See Deborah McGriff, she has Ladies Tank tops on sale for \$5.00, 2021 Classic Tournament shirts on sale for \$15.00.

Kids Clinic: Set for July 24th at Herschel King Park, we need a volunteer to run this event.

Chuck Gleichmann: 3-4 months ago, Chris Christian asked Chuck to do an issue and he worked with CCA on redfish. He took a look at the players and reached out to them. Billions of dollars are going out on restoration projects in Mosquito Lagoon and the Everglades. We want to help Flagler County, we reached out to the CCA and Whitney Labs. Guest Speaker: Capt. Jeff Patterson, Pole Dancer Charters, Ormond Beach

A lot is going on nearshore, some people follow the shrimp boats, look for birds diving down as good places to find fish. The boats dump croakers, and you can scoop up dead or dying fish to use for bait. You can get bonita, sharks, tarpon, and jacks just to name a few. He fishes the inlet and nearshore, uses a 15-16" mono leader and uses fluorocarbon. He buys Walmart leader line 30-40-50 lb. spools for \$5.00; the fluorocarbon breaks easier than the mono. When looking for pogy pods, look for pelicans near the beach, and cobia by the jetties. You can target sharks, flounder, etc., if you can catch them on the pier, they are near the beach. He also uses a 2 oz egg sinker. Bonita are not a good eating fish but they are by the beach. Wind direction, tides, and weather all play a part in whether you will have a good day or bad day of fishing, always be on top of the weather. Download one of the weather apps onto your phone. If fishing for tarpon at the inlet, freeline a live mullet or pinfish, if going after Spanish Mackerel off the beach, use a spoon or small diving artificial bait. The bait in the water will be glass minnows, so try to imitate that bait. Look for big rays if trying to catch cobias. If going after flounder offshore, go around reefs with a sandy bottom, use mud minnows as bait, they are usually on the outskirts of structures. You can catch flounder in 40-60 feet of water but right now they are spawning. If by a structure, cast toward the same area and you can get a lot of flounder from the same spot, they will eat your bait, bump the bait, it feels like a snag, but it might be a flounder, be patient and let it take the bait. He fishes within 3 miles from the beach. He uses an app called Tides for Me and for wind the app is called Windy, it is usually always on target.

- ⇒ All club members are welcome, and any accompanying guest may compete with a \$20 entrance fee paid before the angler goes fishing.
