July Fishing Forecast Capt. Jim Britton saltytalesfishingcharters.com

Even though we will have some brutal heat heading our way, a look back at last years fishing log makes me anxious for July to get here! For inshore fishing, this time of

get here! For inshore fishing, this time of year, get out early and rig up several top water plugs. I usually have one "walk-thedog" (zara spook jr.) style plug and one "chugger" (storm chug bug) ready to go. Redfish should go crazy for these plugs on the flats and fishing deeper areas should produce nice trout. These same plugs can also be used later in the day around bulkheads or docks for some fun ladyfish and jack crevalle action. If you cannot get out early, try the same tactics around dusk for similar results, or fish after dark for the busy trout and snook (catch and release only as the snook season is closed) bite around dock lights.

Offshore anglers will continue to find schools of dolphin. Looking for the telltale signs (birds or weed lines) in 130 feet or deeper, should be the key to filling the fish box. Bonita and blackfin tuna may also make their way into the

trolling spread. Bottom fishing reports are looking promising also. Mangrove snapper from 5 to 15 pounds are being pulled off of many different wrecks and reefs. The reefs will also hold the normal residents like sea bass, trigger, porgy, grouper and amberjack. This year the red snapper season is early and short! Offshore anglers have a 4 day season: July 10^{th} - 12^{th} and July 17^{th} . The wrecks, reefs, and live bottom areas will be crowded, so on these days be courteous, and be safe!

For those looking to fish nearshore, July will be a great month to continue targeting kingfish, cobia, tarpon, and shark. These same species should also make their way within casting distance of the pier. Surf and pier fishermen will also be able to target pompano, flounder, whiting and bluefish.

Remember sun protection and hydration, tight lines!



Quick Tips were given by Chris Davy & Jim Britton – Topic - Fishing Report – They said anglers are catching redfish, snook and flounder. There is a good cobia run, tarpon are on the beach and in the C section and Kingfish are around. Flounder are at Matanzas. You can use a top water bait or live mullet, pinfish or mud crabs for the tarpon, they don't spook like the redfish do. For the flounder at Matanzas use small mud minnows, the flounder are around the rocks by the bridge. There has been a big trout run lately, use a popping cork with a shrimp on it. Jim said that one 20" female trout will produce 17 million eggs. If you catch a female 20-23", throw it back if you can, so she can reproduce!

Announcements: Chuck Gleichmann said that the club has

been communicating to the members by Facebook and emails, so keep checking your emails and our website for updates. The VFW is not open yet, so you can donate if you want anything from the bar. Someone is here to wait on us, so please compensate her. The FWC is cutting the funding for the Kid's Clinic and will not be helping us run the clinic. The Kid's Clinic date has changed and will not be held on July 15th. It is now scheduled for Oct. 10th and we will be running it on our own. We will do an event in July, but not the Kid's Clinic. CCA Star will be on Facebook live @8:00 PM tomorrow night, the club will do it, sign on to CCA Star. Leiza will be here on 6/23-24? We will harvest redfish, 4 in St. Johns county, 4 in Flagler county, and 4 in Volusia county for tagging by CCA for their STAR tournament. Flagler has a COPS program where civilians ride around with the police, they are starting a Marine Dept. version of that and are recruiting any captains from the club that would like to ride around with them. Chuck G. has the info, check with him if you are interested.

REPORTS:

Finance Report: Fred Manzolillo said we have over \$31,000.00 in the bank, the bills are paid, we are making the payouts on the tournaments, but we are losing out on the

monies for raffles and 50/50's. To date we have 262 members, if you haven't renewed yet, see Fred.

Weighmaster Report: Chuck Radloff said updated sheets for the yearlong tournament for 2020 are on the registration table. Not all of the weigh in slips for the end of May are in yet. Lady Angler is Karen Dougherty in first place, Male Angler is Peter Bessette, who is 1 point in front of Mark Heffley. Mark won the FOM for May. The Fish of the Month for June is a King Mackerel.

OLD BUSINESS:

Spring Classic: Rita Waddell & Dana Syens are co-chairing this event. Dana is absent tonight. Rita said the name has changed for this tournament because we will no longer be in the spring season. So now, it will be called the 2020 Annual Classic. Thanking us for our patience, the event was canceled in April because of Covid-19 and has been rescheduled for August 21st & 22nd. The Captain's Meeting, which is mandatory will be on August 21st at the Palm Coast Social Club, which is right next door to the VFW. The cost will be \$65.00 until 8/10/20 and after that it will cost \$70.00 for the entry fee. Entry forms will be provided at the meetings. The weigh-in will be at Hidden Treasure, under the 100 bridge in Flagler Beach. Being it will be held in August and the heat, the weigh in times have been adjusted. The CCA is holding their STAR tournament in June, but CCA will be in attendance at our tournament and have a 6 pack of beer, a T shirt and a ticket for a drawing for an Engel cooler and a rod & reel at our August tournament for any angler that donates a live redfish to them. A tank will be provided to keep the fish alive and CCA will bring a tank to transport them, tag and distribute them for their STAR tournament.

Elections: Bill May said he is taking nominations for Club President, Vice President and Treasurer. He received three new nominations tonight and he can't say yet who those lucky people are, because he has to talk to them first and see if they are interested in running for the job of Vice President (1 nomination) and Treasurer (2 nominations). At the July 7th meeting, we will be voting on the nominees.

NEW BUSINESS

Bylaw Change: Chuck G. said the bylaw change went out to all the members by email and for those without email, it went out by regular mail. But a 501c3 can't divide the assets so they have to go to another 501c3. If the club would be dissolved now, the assets go to members, once changed, it will go to another 501c3. A vote was taken 40 yes, none opposed, so carried. Official papers were signed by Chuck Gleichmann and Carol Carter.

Kayak Tournament: Amy Krisanda said the tournament would be on June 6th, the weigh-in would be at Genung's Fish Camp in St. Augustine from 2–3 PM, fishing will be from 6 AM-3 PM. No food will be provided, please feel free to bring a lunch if you wish, with a chair and a cooler, but no plastic bottles. Water will be available, and she will provide a snack. You don't have to bring your kayak there. Prize amounts are on the website on the flyer. A funny hat contest will be held and anyone that comes wearing one will win a prize.

Surf Tournament: Chuck Riccitello said the tournament will be on June 20th it starts at 6 AM, toes in the sand, facing the ocean. The weigh-in will be from 1-2 PM, location to be announced shortly. If a location is not found, we will conduct it like the tournaments in March & April and you can go to

one of our weigh stations (check our website for our stations) weigh in your fish and make sure to have SURF TOURNAMENT marked on your weigh slip, so the weighmaster can determine it was for this tournament only. Chuck Radloff will be the weigh master for the tournament. If it is held at a specific location, there will be prizes awarded, raffles and a 50/50. See flyer for the most updated information. There will also be a kid's picture contest with a \$35.00 gift certificate, see the website and flyer for the rules. Any picture that best describes a child in our club, that is tied to our club and fishing, it doesn't have to be your child. Prize judge will be the decision maker. Childs age is 12 or under.

Any Other New Business:

Chuck introduced Larry Finch, one of the most premier fishermen on the East Coast, he works with Florida Sportsman magazine. Chuck met him at a seminar and when someone asked how far he could cast his rod out, he cast it over a High School building. He gives up his secrets, you can fish with him and he will still catch all the fish. After the break, he will be our guest speaker tonight.

BREAK

Guest Speaker: Larry "Fishman" Finch, said he loves to share his knowledge of surf fishing. You need the right tool to catch the fish, his 10 foot surf rods are custom made. The rod does the work for you, he's been surf fishing for 40 years. He teaches what he's learned and he targets Pompano fish. His number 1 bait for Pompano is a live sand flea, Pompano candy is the orange egg sack on the sand flea, and you go thru the tail of it to put it on your hook. Pompano are like snowbirds, and he will go to Jupiter, FL, following them south. In spring, they are going up north. He gets up early, in low water with a temp. of 68 degrees is perfect. March & April is the best time for a surf tournament. Pompano stay here in Florida. Go early, because when the sun comes up, they leave. Stay back on the sand, you don't need to go into the water, fish the trough at high tide, they are further out at low tide. He doesn't use frozen sand fleas, he gets his sand fleas at 16th street by Publix. He makes his own sand flea rakes and sells them. Quahog clams are his 2nd choice for bait, he uses a 1 aught circle hook. He is a natural bait fisherman, he doesn't fish, he catches, and he doesn't use Fish Bites. For the clams, hook the clam in the foot and it won't come off. You need a small or medium size sand flea. Constantly reel it in for the Pompano and don't pick it up while it's in or over the water, it can get off the hook and then you have lost it. Flagler to Jacksonville are his favorite spots to fish. He ties his own Pompano rigs, he demonstrated to the members how he ties a dropper loop. He can keep the sand fleas from 10 days to 2 weeks, you have o keep them cool, don't rinse them and keep them in sand. Larry Finch is also on Facebook, check out his site and see all the fish he catches.




