May 22nd Surf Tournament

First things first, I want to thank the volunteers who helped with the May Surf Tournament at River to the Sea Preserve (weigh-in location). Over a dozen people helped out, making it very easy to keep it somewhat organized and serve a variety of food choices.

The weather for the surf tournament on Saturday was nearly perfect, if you were a fish. Heavy east winds, sandy, rough water, and a dense weed mat made it very difficult to fish. Six fishermen managed to weigh-in fish, leaving 5 spots to fill from show up tickets of club members who fished.

The excellent BBQ (brisket, chicken, pulled pork, sausage, and ribs, plus sides and a banana pudding dessert) was provided by HeliHogs, an aviation and catering company out of Ormond Beach. They also generously provided a helicopter tour of the coast for three people as a raffle item. Other raffle items were a beach cart and soft fish cooler.

Recipe of the Month: Shrimp de Jonghe



Ingredients

- 1 stick butter
- 1 lb. peeled and cleaned, large shrimp
- 3 cloves minced garlic
- 1/3 Cup white wine

- 1/3 Cup chicken broth
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1 Tbs parsley
- 2/3 Cup breadcrumbs

Preparation

- Combine butter and garlic in a cast iron pan and cook until butter melts — about 2 minutes.
- Remove pan and mix in wine, shrimp, breadcrumbs, salt, pepper and parsley.
- Continue to cook for an additional 5-10 minutes: do not overcook the shrimp.
- 4. Serve as is as an appetizer or side dish!

June Fishing Report by Captain Jim Britton



Offshore anglers, willing to brave the heat, should find a nice variety of species. Bottom fishermen will be able to target grouper, trigger, and

black sea bass. Reports from local wrecks and reefs look promising for these species. Nice sized flounder should also compete for baits dropped down to these same areas. Trolling lures or ballyhoo along weed lines will produce nice numbers of dolphin this month. In the absence of weed lines, try to locate flotsam or a congregation of birds.

Nearshore waters will still be holding bait pods. The usual suspects, cobia, kingfish, sharks, and tarpon should be lurking below the bait – ready to attack anything resembling an injured pogie. Fishing from the piers or the surf, during June, will yield bluefish, flounder, pompano, and whiting. Larger live baits may also tempt free swimming cobia or kingfish from the piers, as well.

Inshore anglers will see a continued increase in the amount of sea trout and snook available. The best bite will be pre-dawn and early morning fishing. On higher tides work grassy edges with your favorite topwater or subsurface plug. When the water is lower search drop-offs or under docks by drifting a live shrimp or small baitfish for these ambush predators. If redfish is your target, fish around oyster bars during periods of high water, and try fishing the banks of the ICW when the tide drops out. June is a good month for targeting ladyfish and jacks also. While these fish are not good table fare, they can be a lot of fun, and can be caught from shore or in a boat.

Finally, I would like to thank all whom have read this report over the years. It has been my pleasure to provide knowledge from my fishing colleagues, as well as my personal knowledge. This being said, I will be turning this column over to an extremely capable friend and captain, Captain Tim Jarvis. I feel that the club will benefit from a fresh perspective and reporting style. Conservation and Regulation Update by Captain Chuck Gleichmann



Captain Tim Jarvis has moved on to the "Chum Line Fishing Report" and I have been asked to take over for him on the regulatory and conservation fronts. I hope I will be able to adequately fill his shoes from this point on.

Conservation as it pertains to fishery management and water quality are a couple of my passions, so you are going to hear a lot about that going forward. Same for regulatory issues and I plan on keeping our members informed of the ever changing legal and political issues that affect our sport. I am also going to concentrate this column solely on our home inshore and offshore waters and communities, so if you are traveling and need some input as to regulations you can give me a call, since you will no longer find it here.

Manatee speed zones in Flagler, Volusia and St Johns County kicked in on May 5th. That's old news but the new news is that our manatee population is actually increasing and on the move. The sea cows are looking for food and moving our way since their food supplies to the south are dying. I have literally bumped into manatees in places I had never encountered them in the 15 years I have lived here. Please be extra careful on the flats and in the creeks since these animals are not the brightest bulbs on the planet. Same for the ICW and the docks there. We have manatees grazing a couple of days a week at our house.

Again, old news but the new news is that our local and federal law enforcement agencies have moved beyond the "educational" stage to the enforcement stage. So please wear your lanyard any time the boat is on plane. This is a federal law and you can check the specifics on the US Coast Guard website. Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said the CPR tournament is going well. We have tournaments coming up, May 15 Bottom Trip 95' boat, Critter Fleet leaves at 7 AM, 6:30 AM is drawing for fishing spots at back of the boat. Sign-up sheet in the back, members-\$85.00 per person, regular price is

\$110.00 this includes the tip. Big fish jackpot, Calcutta, raffle prize is 2 one day passes on the boat one person will win this. Tim is selling these raffle tickets tonight. Surf Tournament is on May $22^{\rm nd}$, fishing 7 AM – 2 PM, weigh in will be from 2 PM – 3 PM at River to Sea Preserve on A1A, Heaviest fish wins and a Bonus for the largest Pompano. Mark Heffley will chair this event. Raffle prizes will be 2 helicopter trips (a \$318.00 value), a surf cart and Calcutta bag. He needs volunteers to help with the raffles, 50/50 sales, food dist. and more. Mark has been club angler for 2 years and he is training a ladies group on the pier.

- thesurfangler.com Noel has been walking the beach for 45 yrs. Jeff Rafter was his mentor 18 years ago. He said redfish are in the inlet, 40 lb. fish in the surf. Shrimp is the bait of choice because all fish will eat shrimp. Whiting, Pompano, and reds like sand fleas and in the fall use crab. Cut your bait 3/4"long to match the hatch. Fresh bait is best to use on clams, get the biggest ones you can, crack them, they have 2 parts foot and rest is the belly. Cut across the foot and you will get part of the foot and part of the belly. He gets 3 baits off one shrimp, cut off the fan on tail, take off the horn and eyes. He uses a 2-ought circle hook, go side to side through the tail and then go sideways again. Read the beach, watch the waves, and look for a runout or a riptide, the deepest through or a bowl created by the waves. Fish are in or outside of the runout. In the afternoon, after 1 PM with the sun behind you at low tide, you can see a runout wearing polarized glasses, look for darker water. Where the water breaks towards each other it will get smaller and diminish, you can also look for bubbles or silt on a calm day to find where the fish are. The best time to get Pompano is at sunrise they like the sunlight. In the spring & fall, fish feed all day long, he does not fish after 10 AM, give it 20 minutes where you are, if no fish, move to a better spot. Tackle - not all rods are made the same, carbon & graphite stores energy, fiberglass rod does not cast as far. A 13' rod with a 5 oz. sinker can go 500 feet. He fishes with mono; braid can tangle, and you lose fishing time. He uses 14 lb. mono with a 5 oz sinker and a 20foot, 50 lb. shock leader on his rods. He uses Fish Bites but because nothing in the ocean bait wise is rectangular, he cuts it into a circle like a crab would be. Put a piece of Fish Bite on with your bait. You can contact him online at thesurfangler.com - he gives casting lessons and is a guide who is currently booked up through June. 50/50 Drawing: Winner of \$100.00 was Tim Mott.
