## Recipe of the Month: Grilled Fish Fillets



Ingredients:
4 fish fillets
Olive oil
Salt and pepper to taste

- 1. Set up a direct heat, two-zone, medium-hot fire. When the coals are ready, replace the top grate and allow it to heat up.
- 2. Scrub and oil the grate. Dip a folded paper towel in cooking oil and oil the entire clean grate using long-handled tongs.
- 3. Rinse the fillet in cold water and pat dry with a paper towel. Run your fingers over the fish, feeling for bones, and remove them with kitchen tweezers. Very lightly oil both sides of the fillet with cooking oil. Season the fish as you like. Keep the fish refrigerated until the coals are ready—you do not need to bring fish fillets to room temperature before grilling.
- 4. If the skin is on one side of the fillet, place the fillet skin-side down first. You need to get a good sear on the fish to prevent sticking. Do not move or turn the fillets for the first two

minutes. When it's time to turn, be sure to use a wide spatula — or two spatulas facing each other—and gently roll the fillet over as opposed to flipping it. Only flip once. If you want to grill very delicate, thin fillets, lay some slices of lemon or orange on the grill first, instead of putting delicate fillets directly on the grates.

5. Fish fillets have a very small window of doneness, so don't walk away from the grill. The time it takes to grill a fish fillet varies greatly with thickness, but a general rule is 10 minutes per inch of thickness. Use a knife to check the center of the fillet when it's nearing done. For thin fillets, when the meat is consistently opaque and flakes easily, it's done. For thick fillets, you want to remove it when the middle is just slightly translucent, because thicker fillets will continue to cook for a few minutes after you remove them from the grill.

Prep time: 45 min; Cook time: 20 min Servings: 4

# May Fishing Report by Captain Jim Britton



It seems that our spring is finally here in full effect! The forecast will be much the same as April, plus more. By "more" I mean we should all be catching

more fish, plus expecting more species.

On the beach, anglers can expect more blue fish, more pompano, and more Spanish mackerel, as well as the usual whiting and occasional redfish and black drum. From the piers, the bite will be much the same. However, as the month progresses be on the lookout for a shot at a kingfish and tarpon.

Inshore Anglers it is time to dust off your favorite topwater plug. Hit your favorite flat, early in the morning, for some exciting redfishing or target creek mouths and dropoffs for speckled sea trout. After chasing the

topwater bite, anglers can target flounder as the day warms up. For the flatties, target deep holes with moving water using a  $\frac{1}{4}$  ounce jighead and a small mullet or mud minnow.

Offshore Anglers should not have to travel far for some exciting battles. Kingfish and cobia will be found on the beach and on the wrecks and reefs (make sure to have some pitch baits ready on some spinning gear). While fishing these waters, be on the lookout for sailfish as they too move in with the warmer water. Deep water anglers will be greeted by more dolphin. Recent reports have most bites coming on ballyhoo rigs. Small pink and white skirted baits are working also. An occasional wahoo or blackfin tuna may still find its way into the spread also.

Good luck on the water and remember - fishing is fun, have a blast!

# **Conservation and Regulation Update** by Captain Tim Jarvis



Florida's recreational and commercial stone crab seasons in state and federal waters will end May 2, with the last day of harvest being May 1. This annual season closure date was modified last year as part of a suite of changes that were made in response to a

long-term decline in harvest and because the stone crab fishery is likely undergoing overfishing. These changes are intended to increase the stone crab population and build resiliency in the fishery.

The following species will reopen to recreational harvest May 1 in Florida state and federal waters of the Atlantic: hogfish; blueline tilefish; gag, black, red, yellowmouth and yellowfin grouper; scamp; red hind; rock hind; coney; and graysby. Hogfish will remain open through Oct. 31, 2021, on the east coast of Florida as well as south and east of Cape Sable on the Gulf coast. Blueline tilefish will remain open through Aug. 31, 2021 and the other grouper species will remain open through Dec. 31, 2021, on the east coast of Florida and all state waters off Monroe County.

The 2021 season for recreational anglers fishing from private vessels in Gulf state and federal waters and charter for-hire operations who do not have a federal reef fish permit (can fish in state waters only) will be June 4-July 28. If you plan to fish for red snapper in state or federal waters from a private recreational vessel, even if you are exempt from fishing license requirements, you must sign up as a <a href="State Reef Fish Angler">State Reef Fish Angler</a> (annual renewal required) at <a href="GoOutdoorsFlorida.com">GoOutdoorsFlorida.com</a>. The 2021 recreational red snapper season for federally permitted charter for-hire operations will be June 1 through Aug. 2 (closed on Aug. 3).

On the Conservation side...Over the past several months I have been tagging Redfish for Whitney Lab in Marineland. Whitney Lab is conducting research on the movement of Redfish.

If you happen to come across one of these please call the number on the tag. They will ask you for the weight, length, and location of where the fish was caught. You will also receive a reward. Please make sure you release these fish to keep the research underway.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month – Chuck Radloff reported that Mark Heffley is in the lead in the men's division and Anna Pagliro is in the lead in the lady's division for the Year Long Tournament. The April Fish of the Month is a Florida Pompano. A person is needed to pick up weigh slips from our weigh stations, if anyone can help out, please let Chuck Radloff know. Chris Christian reminded everyone that when plaining in a boat, it is a new FWC regulation that you must be wearing a outboard motor kill switch. Capt. Adam Morley will be running trips on the Litter Gitter the first Tues. of the month, he can only take 6 people on each trip.

Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said the CPR tour-

nament is going pretty well, need a club bump board to enter your fish. You get a prize for entering even just one fish and then you get a prize for entering 5 fish or more. Tim has 75 fish that he has entered and have been released. Count the Spots Tournament, held on March 27th, was chaired by Bill Moore, Carol Webb & Bruce Tilley. The weather cooperated, there was good food, great prizes and a good number of fish caught. Club Bottom Trip will be held on May 15 on the boat, Critter Fleet, cost will be \$85.00, which is cheap, the normal price would be \$110.00. There will be a big fish jackpot of \$500.00 and a Calcutta, there will be a limit of 65 members. Friends can go for \$110.00 after the members. Tip is included. The club subsidizes this trip. The boat provides bait, rods & reels or you can bring your own, but no braid line is allowed, there will be no food provided, bring your own. The boat leaves Ponce Inlet at 7:30 AM, there will be a drawing on the boat for spots at the back of the boat. A small cooler of 18" overall is allowed, 1 per person, there is A/C in the cabin. Follow the speed limits, there are speed traps set up. Register w/Tim Miller asap with payment, this trip fills up fast!

#### **Break**

Guest Speaker: Tournament Angler Carlos Garcia: Carlos's topic tonight is How To Prepare for the Spring Classic. Target your species of fish, he gets bigger fish using artificial baits. On 4/24, he said the high tide will be at 8:30 AM and the low tide outgoing will be at 3:30 PM. First thing is to go to shallow water in creeks, check the tides for the creeks, Flagler should be perfect with lots of bait. In a high tide condition, look for birds and bait. He handed out buffs to the two anglers who got the answer of what to look for in the high tide conditions. If you do not see bait, move to another location that has bait. Start with a top water plug, he uses the color Chartreuse with beads on it, get on a grass line, run it parallel and walk the dog. If over an oyster bed, get close to the grass edge on top. He uses Procure on hard/soft baits and the fish will attack, recommends Bloody Tuna flavor, also Lady Fish, Mullet or Shrimp flavors. For trout, use a popping cork w/ shrimp or artificial bait as the tide goes out, look for deeper troughs to find Black Drum. Use live shrimp on a jig head for drum. For bigger fish he recommends a Penetrator hook, wait for low tide for redfish w/a big paddle tail with a weedless hook. Confidence bait is one you feel good throwing. In low water, use scents, find what works for you. If water is muddy, use jerk shad, Chartreuse color, in clear water use smelt color. In lower water you do not want a big bait, be subtle, let it sit so they can smell the scent. He does not scent the Gulp baits; they are already scented. He uses a 7-foot rod, a top water plug, 10 lb. braid, 20 lb. fluorocarbon 24" leader w/a loop knot on the hook, it goes a long way. Fish with the equipment you like.
