November Fishing Report by Captain Jim Britton



Offshore anglers will find plenty of hungry bottom fish this month. Dropping squid or frozen sardines down to the wrecks and reefs, in 80 to 100 feet of water should yield some nice grouper and sea bass. For larger bottom fish – beef up the tackle and drop down live bait, such as pinfish or mullet. Red grouper should start to stack up in areas with patchy hard bottom in more than 100 feet of water also. On nice days between the windy fronts, a trip to the ledge may prove to be well worth the time. Trolling in November should be hot for yellowfin tuna and large wahoo!

While the area was spared major effects from the storms this year, the high winds and heavy surf seemed to shorten the fall mullet run. As the weather starts to turn cold, surf (and pier) fishing should heat up. Black drum, bluefish, flounder, and redfish will all be following the plentiful bait. Large sheepshead will also be moving into areas

that have barnacles and oysters attached to structure. Pompano, whiting and large croakers should also make a nice showing this month.

Inshore fishermen should start scouting out their favorite trout holes this month. As the water temperature drops, larger trout will get more active as they recover from their breeding season. Topwater plugs or live bait under a float will help bag your limit of trout. Redfish will fall prey to similar tactics. The flounder bite has really picked up this year also. Look for this to continue in November. Using a live mullet on a fishfinder rig or artificial soft plastics should work well to entice these fish to bite. Also inshore, black drum and sheepshead will be thick on structure in water more than 8 feet deep. I like fishing a ¼ ounce jighead tipped with a small piece of shrimp for these notorious bait thieves.

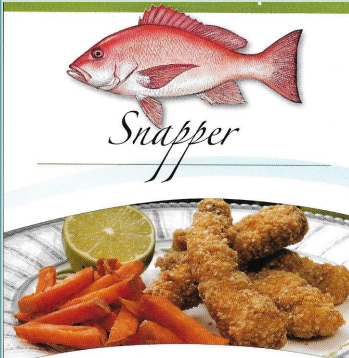

Recipe of the Month: Florida Chili-Cumin Snapper Fingers



Ingredients

(Yield 6 servings)
2 lb snapper, cut into 1 inch strips
2 eggs
2 TBS milk

1/2 tsp salt
1/2 tsp fresh ground black pepper
1/2 cup flour
1 tsp cumin
1 tsp chili seasoning
5 TBS butter
2 TBS olive oil
2 limes, halved

Directions

1. Pat snapper strips dry with paper towel.
2. Whisk together eggs and milk in a small-sized bowl.
3. Combine salt, pepper, flour, cumin and chili seasoning on

a shallow plate.

4. Coat fish strips with flour mixture; dip in egg mixture and then into flour mixture.
5. Set aside to dry for 5 minutes.
6. Melt the butter and oil together in a heavy skillet over moderate heat.
7. When butter foams, add the fingers; cook 3 to 5 minutes on each side until browned and cooked through.
8. Serve with lime halves.

Conservation and Regulation Update

As mentioned in last month's article, FWC approved the draft proposal for December consideration on **Flounder regulations**.

These changes are due to a general decline in recent years and are a result of being overfished along the Atlantic Coast.

Our South Atlantic and Gulf FWC partners have also reported a decline, and are looking to make regulation changes as well.

Effective October 26th the following changes go into effect for **Bluefish**;

Recreation bag limit will be 3 fish per person from Nassau County Miami through Dade County.

Spotted Sea Trout will be closed to recreational harvest from November 1st through December 31st in all state and federal waters from Palm Beach County through Volusia County.

For Hernando/Pasco County, South through Gordon Pass in Collier County, Spotted Sea Trout will remain catch and release only thought May 31, 2021.

Also a reminder on our **Snook** population, season is closed from June 1st through August 31st and December 15th through January 31st. Recreation bag limit is 1 per day, not less than 28 inches or more than 32 inches in total length. Snook permit and recreation fishing license is required.

Now onto Conservation, our favorite topic! Who doesn't love a green lawn?

For our friends that live along the water, it's important to remember that when using a lawn

fertilizer, use a fertilizer that is Phosphate (Phosphorus) Free. As Phosphate increases in the surface water of our ecosystem, this accelerates the aging process of the lake or body of water it has come in contact with. The aging process can result in large fluctuations in water quality and in some cases create extremely large algae blooms.

These algae blooms are detrimental to our small fish by the way of consumption of the algae, and travel up the food chain to our large animals like turtles and dolphins. The algae blooms can also create dead zones, hypoxia, and air pollution.

How to identify Phosphorus-Free fertilizer? The three numbers in fertilizer bags show the N-P-K nutrient analysis. The middle number is the phosphate (phosphorus) content. A "zero" in the middle means it is phosphorus free. The next time you are at your local hardware store, check out the Phosphorus-Free brands!

From FWC on Oct 20, 2020:

Hogfish recreational season closes Nov. 1 in Keys/ east Florida state waters

Hogfish recreational harvest will close in state and federal waters off the east coast of Florida and Florida Keys Nov. 1. This closure includes all state waters south of Cape Sable, which is on the Gulf side of Florida, and up the Atlantic coast. The Keys/east Florida hogfish season runs from May 1 through Oct. 31.

Recreational harvest remains open in state and federal waters north of Cape Sable in the Gulf.

Some people use fish bites as a bumper between the hook and the bait. Make sure to check every 15 min. to make sure your bait is still on. Use fresh clams and rock salt them (brining) to toughen them up. Genung's Fish Camp will have live baits during Pompano season. Adam from Genung's carries bait thread and he can show you how to use it to keep the bait on. Redfish are in the surf now but you have to fight through the Jacks to get to them, Snook is being caught now too. Popping corks or a scented bait works around the edges because of the water being so high. If you like oily fish, Jack Cravelle is good to eat and can be smoked. At Matanzas Inlet, Tim Miller caught a permit fish.

There was no 50/50 drawing tonight.


