Recipe of the Month: Whole Turkey (Smoked)

Whole Turkey (Smoked) (Serves 8)

- 1. Take a small fresh turkey 10-13 lbs and clean out the inside removing the organs and neck. Save this for your giblet gravy.
- la. Soak in a brine a 24-48 hours in the refrigerator or cooler. (heat up 1 cup of kosher salt, 1 box of chicken broth, rosemary, onion powder, garlic cloves, pepper corns, bay leaves, brown sugar and water). Put in a big container and add water to cover the bird. Put in the refrigerator for at least 2 days prior to cook day.
- 2. Take the turkey out of the brine and rinse off completely. Remove the plastic thing holding the legs and remove the temperature popup which is useless.
- 3. Soften some real butter and mix with onion powder, garlic powder and pepper 4. Stuff this butter under the skin of the bird with your hands (Julia Child method). if you tear the skin repair with toothpicks. Put onions, garlic inside the bird with a health amount of butter and salt and pepper. Tuck the wings under and tie the legs together to close up the turkey.
- 5. Put back in refrigerator for a day.
- 6. Take out of refrigerator on cook day let it rest while you prepare the smoker
- 7. Make an injection Chicken broth, salt,

and butter – heat up and let cool. Then inject all over the turkey

Prepare the Smoker for cooking

- 1. Using a Kamado type smoker, fill with natural charcoal.
- 2. Pick the wood for smoke and place on top of the lit fire. (Pecan, Apple, Hickory, Cherry)
- 3. Use an indirect heat stone for your grill to shield the turkey from the direct heat
- 3a. Place the turkey upside down or breast down in a rack inside of an aluminum pan also shielded with bricks so it doesn't get too hot
- 4. Heat the smoker to 225-250 degrees. Use a temperature probe to monitor the turkey.
- 5. Place the turkey on the grill. After 2 hours, flip the turkey right side up or breast up
- 6. Watch the heat and make sure it does not rise above 275 or drop below 200 degrees
- 7. After 3 hours check the temp of the turkey and take off when the breast is 165 degrees
- 8. Take off and let rest 15-30 minutes and serve

Cook Time - 4-6 hours








October Weigh Master Report

November Fishing Report by Captain Tim Jarvis



Inshore: There's still a lot of mullet around in November so keep using top water lures and jerk baits for redfish, trout and snook on the flats, creeks and ICW banks.

When the air temperature is in the low 50s in the morning and the high is in the 70s I like to wait for the sun to be at the highest point and sight cast snook that are at the top of the water sunning themselves. Use a freelined live shrimp on a 2/0-3/0 j-hook or a circle hook with a 20-25 pound fluorocarbon leader, toss the shrimp about 2-3 feet in front of them. They will not refuse that bait as long as it is alive.

For the night time anglers check the dock lights for some good trout fishing. Use a popping cork and shrimp or a weightless jerk bait and toss these baits up by the lights and hang on! Remember flounder are catch and release only until December 1st.

Surf & pier: Pompano fishing should pick up this month and they are one of my favorite fish to eat and super fun to catch on light tackle. Use your favorite pompano jig tipped with a piece of shrimp or sand flea, try to fish the trough for them. Freelining a mullet on the pier or in the surf could get you a big redfish or snook. Try sand fleas and shrimp on little jig heads for sheepshead and whiting.

Offshore: Mangrove snapper around the full moon is excellent fishing when the weather will let you get out. If there's good current you might be able to chum them up to the surface. Try to use the lightest leader you can because they can be very leader shy. I would try 25lb fluorocarbon first with a crusher jig with a cigar minnow or small pilchard. If you're fishing the bottom try a knocker rig with a pinfish or any cut bait of your choice. You have a chance of catching some trigger fish and bee liners. I like cutting up the bee liners for fresh bait.

Troll your favorite lures or rigged ballyhoo for



sailfish and wahoo starting in the 90 feet of water and work your way to the deeper water around the ledge. Troll at 10 knots but sometimes you might have to troll 15-20 knots. Good Luck and be safe!

Critter Fleet Fishing Trip – Amy Krisanda announced that tomorrow morning some of the people from the fishing club will be going on the Critter Fleet boat and if anyone would like to go, they need to call tonight to let them know you are going. Be at the boat at 6:30 AM, trip will be from 8 AM – 5 PM, cost is \$100.00 each person, \$70.00 for young adults, out of Ponce Inlet.

Guest Speaker: Cpt. Chris Davy - Chris said the way he fishes and most of the other captains he knows, do a method called the bait and wait, you drop your anchor and hit a hole, but you don't put on a shrimp and throw it out there. To find a hole, pull up Google Earth on your phone, find the hole at low tide, not high tide, you want low when the tide is coming in. You don't want to get your boat stuck and not be able to get out. Never use more than 1/8 oz jighead or knocker rig. Find water and deep holes at certain times. At the inlet you will see people lined up, when you get good holes, use good bait, hook the bait correctly. Look for the oyster beds, see if the tide is low. Usually around 20 minutes for the fish to turn on. Use mullet, croaker or pinfish for live bait. You limit yourself if you just use dead bait. He uses 20 lb. braid and fluorocarbon. When using live bait, he uses a circle hook, he uses jigheads with live mullet, shrimp (pinch the tails and put the hook through the back part-tail) and pop it. That is how the shrimp act when they are attacked. Cast 9 to 3 o'clock area. Try Google Earth to find spots to fish in. Keep a log and know what your tides are. Flounder eat pinfish. Your hook should match your bait. Adjust your weight and hooks. Don't use heavy tackle, you want skinny, small, tackle. You have to know how to cast to do artificial baits, he uses Gulp shrimp for flounder. Ease your bait across to attract fish. In the creeks you need a trolling motor, a quiet one. Between the braid and the fluorocarbon, he uses a UNI knot, leader a foot long for a knocker rig. He runs a black Sharpie marker up the braid just past the fluorocarbon to camouflage it.

Spotted seatrout will be closed to recreational harvest Nov. 1 through Dec. 31 in the Central East Region, which includes all state and federal waters from Palm Beach through Volusia counties (see map for all regions below). Spotted seatrout are one of Florida's most popular inshore fisheries. This closed season was re-established in 2020 for the Central East Region to address declining trends in the stock and benefit spotted seatrout during times when they are particularly vulnerable to harvest.
