# **October Fishing Report**

by Captain Jim Britton





Ah... cooler weather! The fish will be feeling the temperature change this month also. A look back at my last few years of logbooks reminded

that larger flounder should be showing up shortly. My logs indicated that I need to stock up on red jigheads and fishfinder rigs. When fishing in the creeks, I like to put a mud minnow or a finger mullet on a 1/4 ounce red jighead, cast up current and retrieve slowly through one of the deep holes of the creek. To target the "doormats", fish the inlets, on an outgoing tide, with a fishfinder rig and a larger mullet on a circle hook. With either tactic, wait for line to get heavy and then just come tight on your line and reel the flatties up to the boat! Inshore enthusiasts can also expect a steady sheephead and black drum bite during October. Target these fish around structure or any deeper area that has rock piles or oysters. The top water sea trout bite will also warm up as the water temperature cools down.

October will be a transition month for surf fisherman. Make sure you take advantage of the water temperatures above 68 degrees, by getting to the beach to hunt pompano and whiting. These fish will start to migrate south soon, in search of warmer water. This will probably be the last month for targeting tarpon on the beach as well.

Offshore anglers will enjoy an active bite in many ranges of water, this month. Bottom fishing on the wrecks and reefs, in the 10 to 20 mile range, will yield grouper, sea bass, and cobia. While moving from spot to spot, be on the lookout for sailfish crashing bait at the surface. A trip to the ledge will find dolphin and wahoo in the trolling spread. And for those adventurous anglers willing to trek out to the roll down, be ready to fly your marlin flag on the way home.

# Recipe of the Month: Garlic Shrimp Linguini

- Ilb fresh/local shrimp.
  Deveined and shelled.
  Put in small Ziploc bag
  with olive oil and garlic
  salt ahead of time.
  Refrigerate until
  cooking time.
- 2. 8oz of Linguini
- 3. 8 cloves of garlic cut into tiny pieces (not chopped or minced)
- 4. 1/2 medium onion—cut into small pieces
- 5. 1/2 stick of real butter
- 6. 1 Tbsp. Oregano
- 7. l cup Pasta Water

- 8. 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- Salt and pepper

#### Directions

- Cook Linguini and pour off 1 cup of the water for later.
- Keep your pasta warm in a colander in a covered pan of warm water.
- Using the pan you cooked the pasta in, pour some olive oil in the bottom on med to med low heat.
- Put the onions, butter and oregano in and cook the onions until transparent.
- Add the garlic and cook a little, add salt and pepper and pour the cup of pasta water

into the pan.

- When this has cooked a few minutes, add your shrimp.
- 7. When the shrimp is a tight "C", then they are done. DO NOT LET THIS SIT AS IT WILL OVERCOOK THE SHRIMP.
- Add the pasta into this pan and mix together with everything, Remove from the burner.
- Put on a plate and add parmesan cheese on top.

Note: This serves 2 people who eat a lot.

# **Conservation and Regulation Update**

FWC commissioners are expected to finalize new flounder regulations at the upcoming October meeting. The proposed changes address size, limit, bag limit

and closures. Here is a brief outline of the proposed changes (which are expected to be approved without change):

- 1. Increase minimum size limit from 12 to 14 in.
- 2. Reduce bag limit from 10 to 5 per person
- 3. Establish a November closure.

There are also proposed commercial changes in the works. If this proposal is approved, the commission will publish an effective date for the changes. There will be updates available on the club website, as well as, in next month's article.

On the conservation side – WE CAN ALL DO BETTER!!! Recently I was able to participate in a waterway clean-up effort spearheaded by an organization called Captains for Clean Waters. In one morning, Capt. Jim Britton and I

collected close to 20 gallons of trash by walking approximately 200 feet of shoreline on the ICW. At the ramp, both of us were discussing how we felt that we were vigilant in caring for our work environment, by picking up trash throughout our trips. We were both surprised by the amount of trash that we did not normally see from our boats. Of the trash collected, 95 % was plastic!

If we all collect a little trash it will have a cumulative effect on our waterways and our community. Whether fishing from a vessel, shoreline, or piers, have a designated trash receptacle to help reduce accidental litter and to have a place to store trash picked up along the way.
