Recipe of the Month: Smoked Bluefish Spread from Carol Carter

Prep: 15 Min + chilling; Makes 3 cups
1lb. Smoked bluefish fillets or flaked smoked trout

8 oz. cream cheese, softened
3/4 cup finely chopped red onion
1/4 cup snipped fresh dill
1/4 cup lemon juice
1/4 sour cream
3 TBsp. Capers, drained
2 Tbsp. prepared horseradish
2 Tbsp. grated lemon zest
Assorted crackers, fresh vegetables and lemon wedges.

1. Scrape fish from skin if needed. Place fish in a food processor; pulse until finely chopped. Combine cream cheese, red onion, dill, lemon juice, sour cream, capers, horseradish and zest; gently stir in fish.

Refrigerate, covered, until serving.
2. Serve with crackers, vegetables and lemon wedges. If desired, top with additional red onion and dill.

2 TBSP serving:

February Fishing Report by Captain Tim Jarvis



Inshore

Spring is here and that means longer days and warmer weather. With the warmer weather the snook bite should pick up. Use topwater plugs at first light and

the last hour in the evening. Target the mangroves, bridges and docks. You can also try popping corks with shrimp or mullet around the same areas for them. We should start seeing the tarpon moving into the canals and deeper creeks this month. I like to use weightless jerk baits and topwater first thing in the morning for these fish then switch to a nice live free lined shrimp. The key is to wait for them to roll and pitch the shrimp into the boil where the fish rolled at and let it sink real slowly. 90% of the time if you have a good shrimp they will eat it.

The redfish should start moving more with the warmer water so use topwater lures or jerk baits at first light around the oyster bars and grassy edges on the flats for some exciting explosions!

Surf and Piers

March will be a good month fishing for the pier and surf anglers cause of the migrating fish from pompano, whiting and bluefish. Use shrimp, clams and sandfleas on your favorite surf rig for these tasty critters. There should be a good number of flounder moving inshore this month so try a mullet on a knocker rig for them. If you're feeling lucky try flat lining a live bait off the tip of the pier for a kingfish or cobia.

Offshore

The ledge should still produce some good wahoo fishing, high speed troll your favorite lures or a rigged ballyhoo. Troll dark color lures and rigged ballyhoo for dolphin and tuna too.

The inshore wrecks should start producing more cobia this month look for them follow big rays.

Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said the Sheepshead Tournament was very well attended, there were 65 members at the weigh in. He also mentioned that for the Spring Classic (Redfish Rodeo) we need many volunteers to make this successful and help the club. The next tournament will be the Black & Red to be held on Feb. 19th, weigh in will be from 2-3 PM at Herschel King Park, Co-chairs will be Mark & Tom Juliano. The March 26th Count the Spots tournament needs a chairperson to run it, please see Tim if you are interested.

Break

Guest Speaker: Surf Fishing – Chip Brundage “The Sinker Guy”

Chip makes sputnik sinkers, he only uses these type of sinkers, no pyramid ones. He makes it simple and easy for fishing, with the Sputnik sinker, if it clicks, buy it – long stem will straighten out faster and it doesn't get tangled in your line. He uses a Bruno rig, it is for pompano and a great rig. You can put floats on a Mortician rig and take the snoot off. Down south, they throw big floats, always put the orange color on the bottom and the yellow on the top. Beads slide on the top of an Eagle Claw 197 hook, match the beads with what's on the beach. Match the hatch with the beads. Put the bead on the hook, then put on a Fish Bite or your bait. This helps keep the fish on longer. Don't super glue it. Main bait is shrimp and he also uses sand fleas and clams – usually the sharks leave the clams alone. He salts the clams with monodine salt, not Kosher salt, he doesn't salt his shrimp. He uses a 2 aught circle hook with sand fleas, put the bead right on top of the barb. Uses diet Pepsi to harden the shrimp only when he will be fishing in cold waters. Don't use a large float over a sandbar, the bluefish will go after them. Put beads on the hook when you are over a sandbar. Most areas have sand bars and troughs, put the bait in front of the sandbar, this is called the super highway. He uses a 12-13 foot surf rod and uses effortless casting. He will use bait thread sometimes to hold bait on the hook. He has an online store where he sells the sinkers and beads. After the meeting, he met with members and sold some of his merchandise to us and answered any questions that people had.

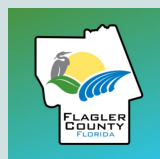


