Recipe of the Month: Florida Stone Crab Claws with Key Lime Mustard Dipping Sauce

Ingredients

- 3 pounds Florida stone crab claws, medium-sized
- 1 cup light mayonnaise
- 5 TBS Dijon mustard
- 4 Key limes (or 2 regular limes), juiced
- Sea salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Preparation

Crack claws using a wooden hammer or a seafood cracker; remove shell and movable pincer, leaving meat attached to the remaining pincer.

Set aside and keep refrigerated until ready to use.

In a small -sized bowl combine the mayonnaise, Dijon and lime juice. Taste the mustard sauce and adjust seasoning with salt and pepper.

Serve stone crab claws with the mustard

April Fishing Reportby Captain Tim Jarvis



Inshore

Look for redfish in the creek holes at low tide and on the flats with the incoming water. I like to use a ¼ oz jig head with a paddle tail or gulp shrimp and jerk

baits cast around oyster bars and the grass edges with tree lay downs. First thing in the morning or the last hour of the evening I like to use top water plugs like a skitter walk for redfish, trout and snook. Live bait anglers can try live shrimp or mud minnows on a popping cork around any structure or grass edge. Dock lights at night should hold snook, trout, redfish and other species. Use your favorite artificial lures or a free line shrimp works great!

Surf & Pier

Spanish Mackerel should be here by now and that can be a lot of fun with light tackle and gotcha plugs. Look for them feeding at the top and cast the gotcha plug at them. Put a 2 foot wire leader on cause they have a lot of razor sharp teeth. The pompano bite should start getting better this month, use sand fleas, shrimp or clams on your favorite pompano rig. I like to tip little pompano jigs with a shrimp, sand flea or fiddler crab.

Offshore

The manta rays and porgie pods are starting to show up and that means cobia! Find the big rays and you should find some cobia, try topwater plugs or bigger swim baits and for live bait try to get porgies, mullet, pinfish or big shrimp on a jig head. Try trolling skirted ballyhoo and naked ballyhoo for dolphin. Look for the birds and any sea weed floating and you should find them and have a couple smaller rods with buck tail jigs for the schoolers.

Meeting called to order by President, Chris Christian Pledge of Allegiance – Presented by Ron Gorney Passing of February 01, 2022 Minutes, Motion made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Tim Miller. Minutes accepted.

Welcome Annual Sponsors – Mike Vickers with Hammock Bait & Tackle and Dana Syens with Commercial Coverage Insurance.

No Quick Tips tonight – Swap & Shop was held Announcements:

Sponsor of the Month – Boaters Exchange, New Smyrna Vendor Expo – We will be participating in a vendor expo on March 12 in Rockledge, FL.

Reports:

Finance Report: Tim Miller said the finances are good, memberships expire on March 31st, if you renew before that date, you get a \$5.00 discount. 37% of our income is your membership renewal. The Redfish Rodeo will be 10% of our income. Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month - Chuck Radloff said the February Fish of the Month was a 4 lb 6 oz. Sheepshead and was won by Tim Miller who received a \$50.00 gift certificate for the Oceanfront Restaurant. The March Fish of the Month will be Spotted Seatrout. For the Year Long Tournament leading for the ladies is Carol Webb and for the men it is Tim Miller. Chuck handed out the awards for the Year Long Tournament and said the categories for the fish were not embroidered on the shirts in error but if you want to have that put on your shirt, let him know and it will be corrected. Maria Lopez won Lady Angler of the year and Mark Heffley won Male Angler of the year.

Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said that the Red & Black Tournament was a good one. If you had a black drum and did not bring it in to be weighed, you might have missed out on getting a prize. Prizes for the CPR tournament were either a jacket, a shirt or a gift card. It only takes one entry to get one ticket and after that it takes five fish for another entry. This past weekend Tim said they were catching king mackerel and sheepshead at the pier and he that the CPR and the Year Long are two separate tournaments.

Upcoming Tournaments – The next free tournament will be on March 26th, Count the Spots Tournament. Amy Krisanda will be the chair on this one, \$700.00 in prizes will be awarded and check the website for the rules on the flyer, FWC rules apply, fishing starts at 6:30 AM and the weigh in will be from 2-3 PM at Herschel King Park, she will need a food count, so make sure to sign up at the back table or online if you plan on attending the weigh in.

Planning of the Spring Classic – Dates are April 21-23 – Charles Hiott –

Chuck said last year, Dana did a great job and we want to have another great tournament this year! We will need many volunteers for this tournament, the Captain's meeting will be held on Thursday, 4/21 at the Palm Coast Social Club, registration and the silent auction start at 5:30 PM, captain's meeting - that is mandatory - starts at 7 PM. Weigh in will be held at Marina Del Palma from 4 PM - 4:30 PM. Donations are needed for the raffles and the silent auctions, so if you know of any businesses that would like to donate, please ask them to do so. Peter Bes-

sette will be the co-chair on this event. All the live redfish that are brought in, CCA will distribute in our local waters for their STAR tournament. It was brought to our attention by the Vickers family that the rules of the tournament on our website were confusing.

New Members Clinic – David Genk – David said the club has a referral program that if you refer 3 new members, you can receive a nice shirt. The Clinic will be held at the VFW, with great speakers on kayak, pier and inshore fishing, 3-4 of these speakers are pro guides in our area. There will be some concurrent sessions where you can go outside and see how Johnny Johns has his kayak set up, Mike Crotts will show you how to throw a cast net to get free bait and Dana Syens will be talking about how to get the most bang for your buck on all different kinds of insurances. There will be coffee, donuts and fruit for breakfast and a nice sub lunch. Anyone wanting to attend who is not a member, the cost will be \$10.00 as a guest fee but if you decide to become a member of the club that day, the \$10.00 will be put towards your membership fee. Clinic hours are from 7:30 AM – 1:30 PM.

Quartermaster – Deb McGriff is selling leftover hoodies for \$25.00, she will not be bringing them to the next meeting. **Nominations** – Bill May is at the back of the room taking nominations for the upcoming elections at the May meeting. **Break**

Guest Speaker: Cpt. Tim Jarvis, talking about catching redfish - Tim told us he does a lot of inlet fishing and uses paddle tails or a bucktail, for live bait a 1/4 blue crab is good to use. He uses a 30 lb. leader with a knocker rig with 3-5 oz. weights and a 3 aught hook. Fish Finder saves time, if using a trolling motor, use your side scan. Go fishing at the right time, at slack tide it is best, you can catch snook, sheepshead at Highbridge. He uses a 12 lb. rod, if fishing structures, he keeps the drag tight. When fishing docks, they will be in front of the dock when the tide is low. He will use a shrimp with a jig head and a popping cork, on weekends there is a lot of boat traffic, so to fish the docks- midweek is best. When fishing for reds, go to creeks and flats. Don't jerk the boat to cast, just use your arms, movement spooks the fish. Use the sun to block your shadow and try to make as little noise as possible. At dead calm, use a DOA top water with a rattle in it. When the sun is low, throw a top water before the sun comes up. Rig it weedless when on the flats and use either artificial or cut up lady fish for bait. It is tough to catch a redfish, don't get discouraged. Chunk up mullet and put on a circle hook. Cut up croakers or pinfish to use as bait, when the water is low, it is easier to catch a redfish. Use a pull pin popper, it comes off faster, redfish hear the poppers, go over oyster beds to catch them. If in creeks, try to keep one speed on the trolling motor to keep the noise down. Fish on the last 3 hours of outgoing and incoming tides. When the tides are negative tides or on ICW, fish on the banks or docks. At Bings, you see people fishing the docks and throwing their bait in the center of the waterway. Fish straight down underneath the dock that is where the fish are.

Treasurer shall be responsible for receipt and disbursements of all funds, subject to the provisions of Article II, Section 4 hereof; shall keep accurate records of all banking transactions; shall give a financial report at all meetings of the Board of Directors and at all monthly membership meetings; shall prepare an annual budget worksheet to be reviewed by the Board of Directors; shall prepare an annual Profit and Loss Statement; shall prepare an Annual Financial Statement for presentation to the general membership. The official club books can be maintained by a third-party bookkeeper. Any inquiries concerning the budget must be submitted to the President and Board members in writing and will be reviewed to determine their legitimacy.
