04/21 & 23 Redfish Rodeo Classic by Charles Hiott

The Captain's Party Thursday April 21st was a hit, and the tournament on Saturday the 23rd drew a record number 102 anglers. Club volunteers, DAV, CCA, COPS, and an experienced team of leaders from the Flagler Sportfishing Club Board brought countless hours of planning together to make it a success.

As Co-Chairs, Peter Bessette and I followed the lead of Club President Chris Christian and dazzling documentation created by Betty Christian to fill in the blanks, cementing a successful, well executed operation. The dedication and determination of contributors Mike "Eveready" Crotts, Chuck "The Raffler" Radloff, Peter "Never Sleep" Bessette (who designed our tournament logo), assisted by many Flagler Sportfishing Club members, was admirable. Ron "50/50" Gorney collected a sizable sum, The Raffle Girls were relentless, Quinn "The Cooler Queen" Bui raised plenty, and the Check-In team, Carol, Tim, Man, Deb, and others, were on cue for arriving anglers Thursday and Saturday! A special thanks to Cookie Zimmer and friends, along with Betty, providing exhaustive efforts to put together a beautiful silent auction. Finally, DAV had many contributors helping at the Saturday check out and weigh in while COPS had officers on site Thursday and all of Saturday afternoon. It takes a large team to put on an event this size.

The Captains Meeting and Silent Auction were held at Palm Coast Social Club. They did a great job hosting with excellent food and beverage. Many auction items were on display and bidding on fishing charters, spa packages, fishing gear and tackle, a trolling motor, and an anchor system was active until the 7 p.m. at the Captain's Meeting. Anglers registered, picked up their bags and shirts, signed off on the rules, and enjoyed the excitement.

The Tournament morning was gorgeous with easterly winds pushing hard. competition raced away from Bings and Moody 100 Landings as the horns blew at 7 a.m. Redfish, Trout and Flounder were targeted for record payouts to anglers. Coastal Conservation Association provided an independent weighmaster to allow the 2 to 4 p.m. weigh-in process to go smoothly. Club members & fishing tour PROs Carlos Garcia and Shannon Willer, as well as Club Sponsor Rob Watkins kept the fast paced weigh in moving. The format this year was a team event, allowing one winner per species per boat, the total weight of the top two in slot fish. We felt this allowed more diversity, trying to spread the prize money, and it was well received.

No Kill Tournament: We are proud that CCA was on hand to preserve beautiful, live redfish for quick release back into our local habitat. 27 Redfish were tagged and released for research. While the weigh-in winners were tallied, raffle winners pocketed plenty of prizes. Everyone was happy and on the way home by 5!

April Fishing Reportby Captain Tim Jarvis



Inshore

With the weather warming up in May, you'll want to get out early for some exciting topwater action. Fish the flats and creek mouths for redfish,

trout and occasional snook. Look for big jacks feeding at the top of the water around sea walls and rocks on the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) and in the Palm Coast canals. Check the creek mouth and creek holes for flounder. Try a live mullet or live mud minnow on a ¼ oz jig head. Artificial anglers try gulp shrimp or your favorite paddle tail.

Surf & Pier

The tarpon, king fish and occasional cobia will start showing up this month and sometimes come close enough that the surf and pier anglers have a chance at them. A good time for this is when the bait pods are close to the beach. Try floating a live mullet or porgie with a balloon for these hard fighting fish. Whiting, flounder and occasional black drum are still being caught, fish the trough with shrimp, sand fleas or fiddler crabs.

Offshore

King fish, cobia and tarpon will be close to the beaches and on the inshore wrecks. Troll your favorite lures or a live porgie. If you find the big rays there might be some cobia with them, try big swim baits or any live bait you have. Deep water anglers can troll rigged ballyhoo or your favorite lures for dolphin, wahoo or sailfish.

Announcements:

Sponsor of the Month – CCA, make sure to sign up the young anglers in your household for the Star youth program May 1 – Sept. 1^{st} . The child can win a scholarship prize.

Cooler of Joy & Raffle Tickets being sold in the back – The Cooler of Joy value is \$500.00 worth of booze in there. You can also pre-register for your raffle tickets for the Classic Redfish Rodeo

Nominations for Officers – Bill May - Bill May is in the back of the room taking nominations for the upcoming election. Absentee ballots will be mailed out to anyone who needs one. Elections will be held at the May 3rd Members Meeting.

Reports:

Finance Report: Tim Miller said the finances are good. Please renew your membership dues now, the grace period will expire at the end of this month and any fish you have entered into the Year Long Tournament will not count. He said there are rumors that some people do not like the 50/50 and raffles being sold. But without these sources of income, we would have to raise the dues by \$15.00 if we do away with the 50/50 and, if we do away with the raffles that would raise your dues by another \$10.00. We appreciate all of our members and continue to try and keep your dues amount to a minimal. Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said the CPR is starting off with a bang, there have been 78 fish submitted so far this year. You only need one legal fish to be in the drawing to win a jacket or a gift card. Recap of the Count the Spots Tournament. held on March 26, 2022 at Herschel King Park -Amy Krisanda chaired this event and did a great job. As usual, Frank Meekins cooked the food and did a great job with that. Amy thanked all the volunteers that help out also. Tim is now taking reservations for the Bottom Trip to be held on May 14th at Ponce Inlet going out on the Sea Spirit, a 65' boat, price is \$95.00 a person which is a reduced price for the club, if you booked the trip yourself for the full day, it would cost you \$130.00 – yet another good deal for our members. In June, there will be a month long Offshore Tournament. He needs someone to run this event, you bring your fish to a weigh station. Whomever runs this gets to make up a flyer and set the prize amounts (within the club guidelines, that is). There will be no free tournaments held this month because of our big pay tournament, the Classic, being held on April $23^{\rm rd}$, so sign up for this one, it has big prize payouts.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month – Chuck Radloff said the March Fish of the Month was a Spotted Sea Trout won by Michael Brandon he accepted a \$50.00 gift card for his trout from Hammock Bait & Tackle. Tim Miller is in the lead for the Male Angler of the year and Maria Lopez is in the lead for Lady Angler of the year, with Sabrina Willis in 2nd place. Some offshore species have been getting weighed in now.

Upcoming Tournaments – Redfish Rodeo Classic – Peter Bessette - Peter said that for the Rodeo Classic, the mandatory

Captain's meeting will be held on Thursday, April 21st at The Social Club which is located right next door to the VFW bldg., the club will be open at 5:30 PM for the silent auction, raffles, 50/50 tickets and Cooler of Joy tickets, the Cpts. meeting will start at 7 PM. Signup sheet for this event is at the back table. Price will be \$155.00 per team, after 4/10 the price will be \$160.00 per team. Fish will be live Redfish, Trout and Flounder - Reds must be brought in by boat. The Pro's sign up is to fish two days, waiting to see what happens and how it goes. Volunteers are needed, a sign-up sheet is at the back table. Anglers have to arrive by boat, they have 38 docks at Marina Del Palma. Chris is doing a flyer for the Social Club events, bring your friends, many prizes and silent auction items - there are 5 Captain Charter prizes worth \$450.00 each. NOTE: There have been changes to the Classic that were made after this meeting. Please refer to the Chum Line and the new Classic flyer to see changes to how many people on the team per boat, new weigh in location and times, please make sure you have the most current info on this!

Guest Speaker: Catching Spotted Sea Trout – Peter Bessette

Peter said at first light, go out on your boat, with a trolling motor and stand on your cooler to sight fish the area. He uses a floater that is a wooden plug he got at Hammock Bait & Tackle, it is a homemade item that he thinks maybe the store may only have one more left. The man that makes the plug is not making it anymore. He uses a MR17 for his sinker, it has a rattle in it, a 6 pound test, and 20 pound leader attached with a fisherman's knot. Cast, retrieve and keep on retrieving, pop it along, if you get misses, slow down. Put on a shrimp with a mullet, a 3.0 hook and split shots - the mullet gives it weight for under the docks, throw it against the tide to come toward you or reverse and go with the tide. Pre-fish, get an app to match the tide to that day and use it on the day of fishing. You can cover a lot of area with top water plugs. When the sun comes up in 1 hour after that, the fishing may stop and you may have to use fresh bait. A 4 oz. hook weedless, a 9 $\ensuremath{\ensuremath}\amb}\amb}\amb}}}}}}}$ he uses is white and red. You don't need big tackle, he uses a Diawa 3000 7 medium action rod. Rig rods with different equipment, a popping cork, 20 lb. leader is good for reds. Pitch your bait under trees and retrieve it, a visual game, slow, don't rush. He has a day and nighttime tackle box, uses white paddle tails, purple and gold, day or night ones. If the water is dirty, don't use the fluorescent yellow color, use gold and silver paddle tail. He uses a black one in the summer, night fishing under the dock lights, also a ruby paddle tail. He uses a corkscrew weedless 3 or 4 aught, cast, twitch it up like a shrimp, bounce it off the bottom and pop it just like jerk baits. There was a question from the audience about the difference in tides, answer was there is a 1 hour difference from the Matanzas Bridge to Bings and from Bings to the Hammock Toll Bridge is 3 hours. He likes fishing the beginning of the outgoing tide. In the canals he uses paddle tails and jig heads only under the docks. 50/50 Drawing: Winner of \$130.00 was Bob Cyr. Con-
