Trigger, Jacks, and sharks along with boat load of Grunts.


Some members also caught fish that qualified them for the yearlong tournament.



June Fishing Report by Captain Tim Jarvis



Inshore

June is not too different from last month. More tarpon should be showing up this month and all through summer.

Look for them rolling in the C- section canals and deeper creek holes, the ICW and the bridges from St. Augustine all the way to High Bridge can hold some good size tarpon. Mullet, shrimp or pinfish underneath a popping cork can be a good technique for these fish. For artificial anglers try a weight less jerk bait or a mirro-dean. Snook, flounder, and redfish bite has been good at lower tides on the flats using topwater and jerk baits at first and last light of the day. Fish grass edges at higher tides for these fish using a popping cork and shrimp, live mud minnow or finger mullet.

Surf & Pier

I've been hearing reports of a mix bag of fish from flounder to whiting using jigs tipped with shrimp or clams. Try spoons and gotcha plugs for Spanish mackerel and big jacks. Pogie pods should start moving closer to the beach this month so keep your eye for them. There could be tarpon, kingfish, cobia and sharks feeding on them. Try netting some pogies and put them on a balloon float with wire leader for the kingfish and sharks and fluorocarbon leader for the tarpon and cobia.

Offshore

The Mahi-Mahi bite should be really good this month, look for diving birds and any floating debris. Troll naked and rigged ballyhoo for these fish and you have a good chance to hook a sailfish too. Bottom anglers will see a mixed bag from trigger fish, grouper and snapper. Use a knocker rig with any kind of cut bait or live pin fish.

Sponsor of the Month - Stay Put Anchors - Matt Fretwell Elections - Bill May - Bill announced that there were 8 nominees for the President's position, 6 nominees for the Vice President's position and 3 nominees for the Treasurer's position. Three people were nominated and have accepted the nominations. President is Adam Morley, Vice President is Carlos Garcia and Deb Marinco is Treasurer. By a show of hands, the members approved all of the nominees and they will begin their new terms starting in June 2022.

Affirmation of Budget Change – Chris Christian – Chris said we will be making a change in the 2022 budget if approved. Peter Bessette made a motion to add an item into the budget of \$5,000.00 to go to the CCA's Youth Scholarship program. Motion was seconded by Dean Roberts. It was voted on by the membership, approved and passed.

CCA Redfish Release - Chris Christian - Chris said we are on a list to release 20 or 30 thousand redfish in our area. \$100,000.00 to be given to the county and this will help our environment, we need to help the CCA with conservation.

New Website - Take a look - Chris Christian - Chris said to check out the new website there is a real time CPR release graph and the Year Long will be in real time, when Chuck Radloff enters it.

Bunnell Elementary School Project – Jeff Murphy is heading up a project the club has going for this school. Teacher, Tom Westley and others are taking out about 7 students fishing to help mentor them outside of the classroom. They asked us for any help we can give them with fishing equipment or funds to travel, buy bait, etc. for these children. Some members, Deb Marinco, Bill Moore and others helped donate, Howard Kriss donated a British Sea Gull Motor that Hammock Bait & Tackle bought for \$200.00, the total amount donated so far has been \$600.00 in private donations and a check will be presented to the school. If you have any fishing tackle bring it to the meetings and give it to Dave Genk, who is also involved in this, for the kids. We will check to see if we have any leftover T- shirts from our events that can be given to the kids.

Reports:

Finance Report: Tim Miller said the finances are doing well and within budget. Please renew your membership dues now if you haven't done so yet. Family renewals are up to a little over 250 memberships and by the end of the year it will probably be 300. The Redfish Rodeo made the budget and a little bit more.

Tournament Director Report: Tim Miller said, May 14th will be our Bottom Trip going out on the Sea Spirit from Ponce Inlet. Cost is \$95.00 each for members, \$130.00 for non-members, there will be raffles and a Calcutta. There are 7 spots left on the trip, 40 people on the boat. If the seas are too rough, the captain will cancel and the trip will be rescheduled. There will be a drawing for the places in back of the boat, trip is from 8-5 PM. Fish you catch on this trip are eligible for the Year Long Tournament, so get them weighed in. Tips for the mates are included in the price you paid. No braid line, no glass bottles and bring sun screen. May 28th will be our first Surf Tournament the year, it will pay the winners for 11 places, you can only win once. The weigh in will be held at Bay Drive Park, Heli Dogs will be providing the food, there will be raffle prizes including a rod and a beach cart, you can buy the raffle tickets online and you can sign up on the website. Weigh in will be from 2 - 3 PM. June 11 will be the Kayak Trnmt. weigh in location will be provided at a later time. June 25 is the Teams Trnmt. We still need someone to run this one. You can fish from a boat or shore and you need to weigh in as a team, total weight.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month – Chuck Radloff said he will need help at the Surf Tournament with the weigh in. Tim Miller got the April FOM which was Pompano, he chose a \$50.00 Hammock Bait and Tackle gift card for his prize. The FOM for May is Amberjack, FOM for June is Kingfish & Dolphin. Leading the Ladies in the Year Long is Maria Lopez, leading the Men's Division is Tim Miller.

Guest Speaker: Matt Fretwell – Stay Put Anchors Subject: Shallow Water Anchoring

Matt said they are a local company in Port Orange and that the business started out in his garage. This is a simpler way of anchoring. This anchoring can hold 3,000 lbs or listed for boats, flex anchor in current and winds, made for the flats and won't scare the fish. There is a bow or deck mounting system, the anchor goes into the mount and you are done. This keeps the boat in front of the current. You can pivot the boat with the two setups. The engine brackets are for 200 horsepower engines. Poles 8', 6' kayaks, 10' and 12' put extension pole on the top, it is 2 pieces the bushing inside prevents noise when you put it in. The handle removes to put the extension on the top. The poles flex a lot and it can attach to a pole clip on the boat. Matt works one on one with his customers to help solve their problems. A 6' pole will work with a kayak. They are also trying to come up with a universal mount for the kayak. He does online sales, you can get them at Genung's Fish Camp and Big Boys Toys. He does custom work on boats cost ranges from \$150 - \$220.00, whole set up is \$350.00. If you need more stability on your boat, you can get one for the bow and the rear. You would need an 8' pole in 6' of water. They are a continuous fiberglass roll, not mesh, it won't break down and give you splin-


