June Fishing Report

Offshore

Starting July 8th at 12:01 am until 12:01 am on July 10th you can keep one red snapper per person with no size limit. This is from Jupiter to Jacksonville. Make sure you fish wrecks, drop offs and ledges that are 60 feet and on. Make sure you

have the right weight for the current, use live pin fish and frozen sardines. Make sure to vent the ones you put back.

Nearshore

Troll the beach with live pogies or mullet for king fish, tarpon and big jacks. You can also try big trolling plugs. Surf and pier anglers will continue to catch blue fish, flounder, whiting and pompano using shrimp, sandfleas and

fiddler crabs. Use gotcha plugs with a little piece of wire for big blue fish.

Inshore

The morning and evening topwater bite has been awesome for redfish and snook on the flats, creeks and the canals. There have been a lot of jacks in the ICW feeding on mullet and that can be really fun with topwater baits. When it warms up try deeper holes and drop offs for flounder. A live mullet or shrimp on a jig head should get you a few of these tasty critters.

Welcome New Members/Visitors/First Responders – Guests / New Members -1 new member, 2 guests
Announcements:

New Officers Introduced: Chris Christian introduced President- Cpt. Adam Morley, Vice President-Carlos Garcia, and Treasurer-Deb Maringo as the newly elected officers in the club. Pictures were taken of the new Board of Directors. Still serving are Sgt. at Arms-Ron Gorney, Weighmaster-Chuck Radloff, and new Membership Director-Quinn Bui, Quartermaster-Deb McGriff, Tournament Director-Tim Miller, Webmaster-Chris Christian, Kids Group Director-Jeff Murphy and Secretary-Carol Carter.

Reports:

Finance Report: Tim Miller said we are halfway through the year and with the Redfish Rodeo, 50/50's and raffles, we are a little ahead in the budget and everything looks good. With the scheduled events coming up, we are giving it back to the members and please let the board know if there are any events you would like to see.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month: Chuck Radloff said the Yearlong Tournament sheets are at the back table. In the lead for Lady Angler is Maria Lopez, for Male Angler it is Tim Miller. There was no winner of the Fish of the Month for May which was Amberjack. June FOM are Kingfish and Dolphin.

Tournament Director Report: Bill Zimmer said the next tournament will be on June 11-Kayak Tournament, fishing starts at 6 AM, weigh in will be 2-3 PM at Bings Landing. Fish will be Redfish, Trout & Flounder, there will be a most spots prize and a CPR division-take a picture on our official bump board and bring it to the weigh in. So far, 25 people have signed up, sign up even if you are just coming to the weigh in, we need a count for food. Tim Miller said the Team Tournament will be on June 25th, start time 6 AM, weigh in from 2-3 PM at Herschel King Park, flyer for this tournament is in your June Chum Line. This is for a 2 person team and you weigh in as a team. Sign up at the back table and sign up even if you are just coming to the weigh in. Also, during the month of June there is an Offshore Tournament from the 1st to the 30th, a team of up to 5 anglers (1 Cpt. and 4 anglers) per team, using total weight from 1 day of fishing. Rules, prizes and species of fish are on the flyer in your June Chum Line. Cpt. Chuck Gleichmann is running this – any questions – (407) 257-8233. You must text Chuck the night

before with the team name and names of each team member fishing that day. Each team must have a Club Member in it. Please make sure to read all the rules on the flyer in the June Chum Line. Chuck also mentioned that the bait shop at Highbridge is open again and under new management. It is now called the Yellow Dog and they have our scales and can weigh in your fish.

Break

Guest Speaker: Fishing in the ICW - Capt. Billy Pettigrew

Billy said he uses a Carolina Rig and the lead size matters. Tie leader on, add a fluorocarbon leader, he uses a double uni-knot. He gets up at the crack of dawn to fish the ICW, you can fish the private docks. For early morning, he uses 20-30 lb. leader, a 1 or 2 aught hook, you don't need a weight, just a hook, a minnow, pinfish and hook in the tail because the weight is in the head by the 2 anal fins if you are in shallow water. If bait is going too fast, use a split shot #3, use a #1 if it holds the fish there, with a leader and no weight. When the sun comes up, use the Carolina Rig if in a canal like in the C section, use ¼ lead on braided line add a bead with monoline tie a Polymer knot on the swivel, 12 inches on leader so it can roll around some. In fast current, use a pyramid weight. Hook shrimp – use live or fresh dead, bite the tail off, put the hook through the tail meat, if fresh dead or live shrimp, hook in the center of the head. Finger mullet or baitfish, hook in the tail. In stronger current you can hook it in the nose or thru the mouth and out the nose. You can use a popping cork for Highbridge or at deeper docks, use the Carolina rig, with double beads orange beads, one on, then the weight, then the next bead, then the Carolina rig 18" or so for around bridges. Run the cork so it sits up and down with an 18" leader to the hook, 8-9' from the swivel to the bobber, you want to get 10' to where the bottom is. Spend the extra money to get good hooks, it is worth it. Use shiners, mud minnows and pinfish for bait. He uses finger mullet and shrimp the most. If he catches 3 catfish where he is fishing, he leaves! He uses topwater and artificial in the summertime. Early in the morning along the grass line, use a top water. When the sun comes up, use paddle tails in a shrimp pattern the color of the artificial depends on the color of the water. Around oysters and grass, go with a weedless bait. DOA Shrimp is good with a weighted hook in different colors, it has 2 holes in the bottom of it and he uses Procure just squirt in the holes or put a Fish Bite on the top of the hook.

- ⇒ All club members are welcome, and any accompanying guest may compete with a \$20 entrance fee paid before the angler goes fishing.
