Hurricane Ian, the Cleanup Continues

Last month I wrote about the impacts Hurricane Ian had on our area and how inspiring the helpers were with our recovery. Witnessing neighbors come together and work side by side to put the pieces back together was an important reminder of how strong our community really is.

So while we have been fortunate, it is important to remember that not all of Florida was. I am grateful to be able to assist in the cleanup efforts.





December Fish of the Month is Whiting! November's Fish of The Month was Snook.

Since there isn't a December meeting, we will probably announce the winner with one of our email notices. I don't know if anyone turned in a snook, but I caught a 12 incher.

December's Fish of the month is Whiting. Remember The whiting must be 11 inches to be entered, which is just one of our club rules.

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is continuing with quite a few entries submitted already. Remember just one entry gets you into the drawing at the end of the year. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. As announced at the last meeting, we will now be approving other bump boards to allow for fish over the 30 inches now on our current authorized boards. If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available.

DECEMBER FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN TIM JARVIS

Inshore Anglers:

Hopefully the water cleans up this month for sight fishing, if it does I like to fish the flats for redfish as they should start schooling up this month. When fishing for these fish you have to be very quiet because they can be easily spooked by stomping of feet or slamming cooler and boat hatches. Make sure you have a good pair of polarized sunglasses so you can see them from a distance. I like to use 15–20lb leader with a paddle tail or a weedless jerk bait. A live shrimp on a 2/0 circle or J hook with a split shot works really well. Try the creek holes and river banks with freelined shrimp or jig head with a shrimp and fiddler crabs for trout, redfish, sheepshead and maybe occasional pompano. There should be some sheepshead and black drum around docks, bridges and rocky banks.

Surf & Inlet:

Whiting, sheepshead and pompano will be your best bet right now. Use fiddler crabs, sandfleas and clams on a pompano rig or tip a pompano jig with any of these baits. Flagler pier is closed right now due to damages. But the inlet holds plenty of fish try to fish the beginning of each tide for trout, redfish, black drum and sheepshead. Try shrimp, crabs, mullet and mud minnows for these fish. Use the proper weight for the moving water with a knocker rig.

Offshore Anglers:

Try nearshore wrecks for amberjacks, triggerfish, snapper and grouper fishing the bottom with your favorite cut bait on a knocker rig. If the weather allows it try the ledge for wahoo and maybe sailfish trolling ballyhoo or your favorite trolling lures around 9-15 knots.

Passing of October 4, 2022 Minutes, Motion made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Tim Beebe. Minutes accepted.

Welcome New Members/Visitors/First Responders/Veterans/Active Duty – 3 Guests tonight

Welcome Annual Sponsors – Mike Vickers was present tonight from Hammock Bait & Tackle, also present was Adam Morley from Genung's Fish Camp.

Reports:

Finance Report: Deb Marinco was absent from tonight's meeting. Adam reported that the bills are paid and there is money in the bank.

Weigh Master Report: Fish of the Month: Chuck Radloff said the current standings for the Year Long Tournament are: Tim Miller in 1 st place for Male Angler of the Year and Carol Tilley in first place for Lady Angler of the Year. Mark Heffley caught a 6.14 oz Bluefish to win Fish of the Month for Oct. The Fish of the Month for Nov. is Snook. Our bump boards only go up to 28" and snook can only be 28–32 inches, so if the snook hangs over the board by only 4 inches, it is OK. Adam Morley said that starting January of 2023, if you use a commercial bump board to measure your fish, bring your board to a meeting and they will verify it and put a club sticker on it so it will be official. To do the CPR entries, you must be using either the club or an official certified by the club, bump board.

Tournament Director Report and Upcoming Tournaments: Tim Miller said the

Surf Trnmt. held on Oct. 22 nd had a good turnout, lots of fish were caught and Heli Hogs provided the excellent food. A call was put out that chairpersons are needed the 2023 year. The first tournament will be on Jan. 21, 2023, a Sheepshead Trnmt., weigh in will be at Bings Landing. The Year Long Tournament is going well – there are still some open spots for fish that have not been caught yet this year. In the CPR Trnmt, there are 21 members entered, you only need to take one photo to be entered, then you get more entries for the next 5 fish you enter, there will be 11 winners announced. Flounder season is closed unti 12/01/22. Tim said you can only keep one Redfish in Flagler county now and three Bluefish, Spotted Seatrout has to be 15–19" you can keep five total but only it can be over 19", in Volusia it is closed.

Guest Speaker: Nick Joseph – Pro Stuff Cleaner Nick demonstrated his product that is great for everything. It cleans grout, boats, boat cushions, even the sails, you can use it to clean inside your house also. Everything that you use your expensive everyday household cleaners for, you can use his product for and it will save you money. You can just spray it on, walk away and when you return it hardly needs any elbow grease to get rid of the dirt, grime or mildew – in most cases all you have to do is rinse it off with water. It will take wood back to the way it was, it doesn't oxidize, so you can use it to clean the showers and the glass does not fog up, you can use it to lift oil and rust out of concrete too. In the spray bottle you only use about point five of the product and the rest is water.

trout to the occasional shark.


