

If you've been reading my bit, 'From the Helm,' over the last couple of months, you know I've been down in southwest Florida working the waterway recovery efforts after Hurricane Ian. The damage to the communities was, and still is, enormous.

However, the sad reality is that the disaster recovery industry is just as disheartening as the disaster itself. The recovery efforts are greatly impeded by corruption and collusion between the debris haulers, cleanup crews, and monitoring companies. I personally witnessed destruction to the fisheries beyond what the storms could ever do.

The contractors get paid by volume, not material. To increase profits, they were using small river barges with mechanical grapple claws to rip out mangroves and other organics while passing by actual storm related debris. After talking to others that have been in the disaster recovery industry for years this is apparently standard operating procedure. When I tried to report the violations I was witnessing I was "let go".

So now I'm back here in Northeast Florida and ready to re-engage with the Club and its activities. I have found a renewed passion for waterway conservation and hope to bring this fresh energy into our community, inspiring members, friends and our youth anglers to protect the natural world around us.










January's Fish of The Month was Black Drum. The winner will be announced at the February meeting.

**February's Fish of the month is Sheepshead**. We have already had some really nice sheepshead weighed in at the tournament in January. The awards for the winners of the Year Long Tournament and the CPR Tournament have been ordered and should be available for presentation at the March meeting, so please plan to attend.

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is going again with the same rules as this last year. Remember just one entry gets you into the drawing at the end of the year. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. Now you also have the option to use your own bump board once it has been approved by the Club.

If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available.

### NOVEMBER FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN TIM JARVIS

### **Inshore:**

Inshore fishing should stay pretty good for the month of February especially for sight fishing for redfish on the shallow flats and creeks. I like the last three hours of outgoing and the first three of incoming tides. Try smaller baits like shrimp and jigs with 15–20lb fluorocarbon leader and be very quiet when you target these fish! For black drum I would fish docks, bridges, deep creek holes and the inlet with live shrimp, fiddler crabs or clams. Flounder bite should stay pretty good this month, fish the creek holes and the mouth of the creek. Use 1/8 oz jig head with a live mullet or mud minnow and drag across the bottom.

### Surf & Inlet:

Use shrimp, fiddler crabs and clams for black drum and live or dead mullet for redfish. Pompano, sheepshead, trout and bluefish can also be targeted with pompano rigs, spoons and gotcha plugs. Use a knocker rig with live mullet or mud minnow for flounder. Make sure you have enough weight to keep the bait at the bottom.

#### Offshore:

The wahoo and sailfish bite should be good at the ledge if the weather allows it, high speed troll your favorite lures with darker color patterns for these fish or a rigged ballyhoo. For bottom anglers the trigger fish bite could be good with occasional cobia on the reefs and wrecks.

Snook Season opens February 1st . Slot is not less 28" or more than 32" total length Daily bag limit is 1 per harvester per day; zero captain and crew for- hire limit.

**Weigh Master Report:** Fish of the Month: Chuck Radloff said the Fish of the Month winner for Dec. was Tim Beebe, he chose a \$50.00 gift card from The Anchor Restaurant – our newest sponsor. Chuck gave us the results of the Yearlong Tournament winners, Male Angler of the Year – Tim Miller, Lady Angler of the Year – Carol (Webb) Tilley and the CPR tournament winners. Tim Miller won first prize in the CPR tournament. All the winners will be posted in the Chum Line. The awards for these two tournaments will be presented at the March 7th meeting. Two people had club records – Ryan Lukaszewski for Dolphin fish and Erica Vickers for Pompano.

**Chili Winners:** 3rd Place – Myrna Shank \$25.00, 2 nd Place – Suk Pauling, 1 st Place – Capt. James Ross. Judges were: Frank Meekins, Dwayne Martin and a new member, who left before we got his name-Thank you all for helping out.

#### Break

Guest Speaker: Chip Brundage – The Sinker Guy Topic: Surf Fishing Chip started out his talk by asking the audience what questions they had about surf fishing. The first question was "Do you need a long rod?" The answer was no, not in Flagler, you can use a 7' rod to fish the inside trough, you can use an Ugly Stik. Sand fleas are returning, the water temperature is 60–65 right now. Some fish stay around here, others go on to N.C., Pompano is a great fish to catch, you have the ability to catch reds, drum and whiting here. For whiting the bait to use is squid, shrimp, clams and crab knuckles, but don't use the squid on the beach, the fish aren't eating them here. If you are using a pyramid sinker in heavy winds, it will get blown back up on the beach. The Spudnik sinker is best in rough water. He uses two rigs, a Bruno rig named after his father and a Mortician rig, that is a double drop rig. He has videos on You Tube about the rigs and surf fishing, check them out. Pompano fish go by the rocks at Marineland. You need fresh bait and watch for where the fish are biting. He explains on his videos how to use Diet Pepsi Shrimp, use it when the water temp. is under 58 degrees. Don't use it in 78 degree temp. If you use Spudniks at Marineland by the rocks, they will get stuck. Fish at low tide, move to other spots, don't just choose one place. Throw your bait in the water that is moving.
