If you're like me and love to fish, boat, swim, paddle, surf, or enjoy any activity based in or around water, your help is needed!

Here is a partial list of some of Florida's recent water quality issues that restricts Floridians' ability to enjoy all of the above and negatively impacts small businesses like mine throughout the state.

- Eighty percent of our 1,000 artesian springs are polluted.
- Red tides have increased dramatically in frequency, duration, and virulence during the past three decades, causing massive fish die-offs, respiratory problems in people, and injury to local tourist economies.
- Increasingly common blue-green algae blooms cause marine die-offs, too, and are being linked to neurodegenerative diseases such as Parkinson's and Alzheimer's.
- We have nearly a million acres of estuaries and 9,000 miles of rivers and streams that are contaminated with fecal bacteria.
- No state has more acres of polluted lake water than does Florida.

FROM THE HELM CONTINUED

- Impacting recreational and commercial fishing, no state has lost more acres of wetlands than has Florida: 9.3 million.
- Seagrass beds, also important to recreational and commercial fishing, are nearly in a death spiral.

We are fortunate to be located on the Matanzas River, the last stretch of water clean enough for commercially viable oysters in the state, but the trend in declining water quality is a major concern to me and a threat to tackle shops and small businesses.

When it comes to our polluted waters, the buck stops with the state. Florida waters are in these conditions because our state government permits pollution and environmental degradation through its actions and inactions. It actively permits the destruction of vital wetlands to make way for unchecked development. Through its inactions, it fails to monitor, enforce, and, in some cases, establish water quality standards.

Special interests that wield undue influence over legislators and thus environmental policy are a big part of the problem. In 2015, for example, water district managers were ready to crackdown on agricultural pollution when they let a sugar lobbyist dictate edits to an annual report that paved the way for weaker regulations. The final policy took polluters at their word regarding environmental safeguards and held no one accountable if water quality suffered.

In 2020, looking to clean up their polluted waterways themselves, an astounding 89% of Orange County voters approved a Rights of Nature / Right to Clean Water charter amendment. Obviously, Floridians of all types understand the paramount importance of clean water to our quality of life in the Sunshine State. But ignoring this mandate from the people, and to protect special interests, the Florida legislature swiftly preempted the authority of local governments to pass such laws.

In the February issue, *Florida Sportsman* ran not one, but two articles on a proposed "Right to Clean and Healthy Waters," constitutional amendment now being advanced through a citizens' initiative for the 2024 ballot for voters to vote on. <u>This is where your help is needed!</u>

Senior Editor Blair Wickstrom writes, "It's time yet again for citizens to do the work our legislators choose to ignore...We need the Right to Clean and Healthy Waters written into the state constitution." 891,589 signed and approved petitions are needed by November 30th, 2023, to qualify for the 2024 ballot. Before that, 223,000 petitions are needed to trigger a Florida Supreme Court review. (We have petitions that can be signed down here at Genung's Fish Camp)

This amendment would establish an environmental right on par with other fundamental rights such as the right to free speech and the right to bear arms. Given how critical clean water is to Floridians, we merit this right. With it enshrined in our constitution, we can hold state government accountable when it permits pollution and degradation of our waters and aquatic ecosystems.

Go to FloridaRightToCleanWater.org to read the full text of the amendment. Be sure to browse the FAQs for additional information.

As you read, you will learn that under this law your neighbor cannot sue you for fertilizing your lawn, that there will not be a proliferation of lawsuits, and that winning a court case doesn't mean someone will walk away with wads of cash. What it does mean is that our government has to provide real remedies for polluted waterways.

Note the growing list of nearly one hundred organizations and businesses supporting this amendment. Florida Wildlife Federation, Florida Springs Council, Florida Fly-Fishing Association, Florida Scuba Divers, Florida League of Women Voters, Florida Veterans for Common Sense, Friends of the Everglades, VoteWater.org, Waterkeeper chapters, and Genung's Fish Camp are just a few.

So, if you are a registered Florida voter, print out, sign, and mail the petition (or sign one next time you're in Genung's). It takes three minutes. Get family and friends to do the same. You can mail five petitions in one envelope with one stamp.

Florida's environmental regulatory system is failing us and Florida waters. A constitutional, fundamental "Right to Clean and Healthy Waters" can bring the systemic change that is needed.






TOURNAMENT CHAIRMAN REPORT BY TIM MILLER


<u> Upcoming Events – Flagler Sportfishing Club</u>





February's Fish of The Month was Sheepshead. The winner will be announced at the March meeting.

March's Fish of the month is Spotted Seatrout. Slot limit 15" to 19" with one oversize per vessel. The awards for the winners of the Year Long Tournament and the CPR Tournament have been ordered and should be available for presentation at the March meeting so please plan to attend.

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is going again with the same rules as this last year. Remember just one entry gets you into the drawing at the end of the year. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. Now you can have your own bump board approved for use.

March's Fish of the Month is Spotted Seatrout A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale.



If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available. NOTICE - The overall species Leaders and Full Point Standings are updated at the end of each month on our website:

MARCH FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN TIM JARVIS

Inshore:

Spring is here and that means longer days and warmer weather. Use topwater plugs at first light and the last hour in the evening for snook, redfish, Jacks and trout on the shallow flats around docks and the river banks. When the topwater bite is over try jerk baits or paddle tails or live mullet, shrimp or mud minnow under a popping cork with a 2/0-3/0 hook depending on the size of the bait. The flounder bite should pick up this month in the creeks and flats, use a live mudminnow or mullet on a ½ oz jig head or your favorite paddle tail or jerk bait.

Surf & Inlet:

This month can be good for surf anglers with the pompano, whiting and bluefish migrating, try gotcha plugs for the blue fish and Spanish mackerel and pompano rig with shrimp, sandfleas or clams for the pompano and whiting. Redfish and flounder bite should be really good at the inlet this month on the turning of the tides. Fish a live mullet, shrimp or mud minnow on a ½ oz jig head depending on how fast the water is moving or try a knocker rig. The sheepshead bite can still be good this month, use fiddler crabs around the rocks.

Offshore:

March can be a good month for the kingfish and cobia off the beaches. Look for diving birds, bait and color change in the water and troll your favorite trolling lures or rigged ballyhoo for the kingfish. If you can find the big manta rays there's a good chance cobia can be following them. You can throw bucktail jigs or big paddle tails for them or any live bait you can get a hold of.

Secretary

Secretary shall keep an accurate written record of all meetings and shall make available a complete copy of the minutes taken at each monthly members' meeting in time for distribution to the membership the following month. Treasurer on a timely basis. An accurate inventory of all Soft and Hard goods must be provided to the Treasurer monthly.



It measures the fish, folds up, you can cut bait on it and it has the fish rules and legal measurements according to the FWC on the reverse. Guest Speaker: Chris Crego & Robert Craun from Skinny Water Lures (produced here in Palm Coast) This business is veteran owned. They are kayak fishermen, they used fish bites and Gulp, they talked to the locals and decided to start making their own bait, 2 years ago. They focused on details for their Paddletails, the tail is flatter and more triangular shaped than other artificial baits. This bait does a body roll, side to side and when the sun hits the flake in it, it lets the fish see it better. They are working on a new Finesse bait that will be for both fresh and saltwater. They have a Creature bait that is like a shrimp or grub in the water when it hits the bottom. Their Curly Tail Grub has a tail that is fatter and it has flake in it, this bait comes with a preloaded hook in it. The green ones are airbrushed with glitter in them that creates a flash in the water. A popular one is the blue crab, the colors are the same as on a real blue crab, they have won tournaments with this one.

There is also a mud minnow color. They are working on a scented bait for crab and shrimp. The bait stretches and they can get 7 fish with using one bait. They have a video on Dragon Tails Fishing website. They have a table set up front with the artificial bait for sale.


