

July's Fish of The Month was Flounder. The winner will be announced at the September meeting.

August's Fish of the Month is Snapper(other than Red). FWC rules for size and bag limit apply for each species. John Burek won June fish of the month with a 23lb 9oz Kingfish. Congratulations John!

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is rolling along nicely. You can see the standings for both the Yearlong and CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing, then Yearlong Club Standings. Remember just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

Don't forget Largemouth Bass is now an eligible species for the CPR yearlong tournament. We have set a minimum size limit of 12". I haven't seen any Largemouth Bass submitted yet so all you freshwater folks need to get busy. Please note this is for the CPR tournament only.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments – all fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale.

If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available.

Yellow Dawg Bait Shop at Highbridge is now open and is an official weigh station. The boat ramps there are also open so give them a visit.

The Shipyard in St. Augustine is no longer an official weigh station. Please have your fish weighed at one of our other locations.

AUGUST FISHING REPORT

Flagler County Fishing Report - August 2023

As the summer sun continues to shine upon Flagler County and the surrounding areas, anglers can expect plenty of opportunities for both fresh and saltwater fishing. August offers a diverse range of fish species to target, including Redfish, Flounder, Tarpon, and Snook. This fishing report will cover the fishing forecasts for the month of August, as well as the benefits of fishing during specific times of the day and the best baits and tactics for each target species.

Freshwater Fishing Forecast:

Inland waters of Flagler County, such as the St. Johns River and various lakes, offer exciting freshwater fishing opportunities. August can bring hot temperatures during the day, making early morning and late evening fishing highly beneficial. During these times, fish are more active and tend to feed more actively.

Bass Fishing:

Early morning and late evening are ideal for targeting Largemouth Bass. Topwater lures like poppers, buzzbaits, and frog imitations can be effective during the low light hours. As the sun rises, switch to soft plastics like worms or creature baits rigged Texas-style. Look for shaded areas and structure such as submerged trees and weed beds.

Saltwater Fishing Forecast:

Flagler County boasts miles of pristine coastline, providing excellent opportunities for saltwater anglers. In August, the waters are warm, and the fish are active, but the heat can be intense during the middle of the day. To avoid the hottest part of the day, consider fishing during the early morning or late evening when temperatures are more comfortable and the fish are actively feeding.

Redfish:

Look for Redfish in shallow flats, oyster bars, and around mangrove shorelines. During the early morning, topwater lures like Heddon Spooks or soft plastic jerkbaits can produce explosive strikes. As the sun gets higher, switch to live or cut bait such as shrimp or mullet, and use a Carolina rig to target them near the bottom.

Flounder:

Flounder can be found near the inlets, channels, and drop-offs. Target them during the changing tides, especially the incoming tide. Use a sliding sinker rig with live bait like finger mullet or mud minnows. Slowly drag the bait along the bottom to entice a strike.

Tarpon:

Tarpon can provide thrilling action in August. Look for them around bridges, deep channels, and nearshore waters. During the early morning or late evening, try using live bait such as mullet or blue crabs. Artificial lures like swimbaits and large soft plastics can also be effective.

Snook:

Snook fishing can be productive around mangroves, docks, and bridges. Early morning and late evening are great times to target them, especially during high tide. Use live pilchards, pinfish, or shrimp as bait, and cast near structures where snook are likely to ambush their prey.


Remember, it's essential to check local regulations and guidelines for fishing in Flagler County to ensure you're compliant with size and bag limits, as well as any seasonal closures.



Welcome New Members/Visitors/Welcome Annual Sponsors – There were 4 members/guests at tonight's meeting. Sponsors present were Adam Morley from Genung's Fish Camp and Mike Vickers from Hammock Bait and Tackle

Passing of 06-06-2023 Minutes, Motion made by Tim Beebe and seconded by Dean Roberts. Minutes accepted.

Announcements:

Adam said that Chris Christian has resigned from the Board of Directors. Peter Bessette is our new Webmaster. We still need a Marketing Director.

Reports:

Finance Report: Deb Marinco said the income for June was \$2,190.00 expenses were \$9,467.50 and year to date income was \$15,760.14. Date for special Financial Meeting will be on August 22nd at 7 PM at the VFW for members only.

Weigh Master Report: Scott Robertson said, the Red Snapper Tournament will be on July 14th & 15th. Fish have to be weighed in at one of our official weigh stations. If you weigh in at the shipyard in St. Augustine, you will have to bring the weigh slip to Scott.

There are 142 entries in the Year Long Tournament so far, submitted by 73 anglers. Tim Miller is in the lead for Male Angler of the Year and Cathy Sanders is in the lead for the Lady Angler of the Year. In the CPR tournament, there have been 258 pics submitted at the end of June. 153 pics are from Tim Miller and a few that belong to Adam Morley.

The FOM for June was Dolphin/Kingfish – John Burek won with a 23 lb 9 oz. Kingfish, he received a \$50.00 gift card from Beach Front Grille. Mike Vickers said that for the Snapper Tournament, FWC regulated that for bottom fishing, you need a venting or resuscitation descending device tool on board your boat. The device is cheaper than the ticket and the tool has to be attached to rod and ready to use.

We still need a chairperson for the Nov. 18th Red, White & Blue Tournament. Tim said we need to get people involved and get volunteers to help. He said there are Tarpon at Matanzas now. The next tournament will be the Overnight on 7/21 & 7/22, fish from 6 PM on Fri. night until 10 AM on Sat. morning, weigh in will be at Bings Landing from 10–11 AM. Heli Hogs will be providing the breakfast food, we need volunteers to help at this event. Tonight's guest speaker will be David Genk.

Membership Report: Quinn Bui said we have 290 members at this time and the new membership cards have been sent out in the mail.

Kid's Fishing Clinic: Mike Vickers said this event will be on July 29th at Herschel King Park, it starts at 9 AM. Volunteers need to be there by 8 AM, there is a lot of work to be done with registration and stations to be set up. Mike Crotts will be doing the castnet area and he needs a helper. We need help out at the dock to show the kids how to bait the hooks and cast out. Also need volunteers to man the tables to teach the kids about being in the outdoors and respecting the environment. Mike has a sign-up sheet for volunteers at the back table.

Members Clinic - to become a Fishing Expo with mini clinics and raffles open to the public. On Aug. 12th from 9 AM – 1 PM, there will be mini clinics from 10 or so pro fishermen speaking on different topics from their booths with special raffle prizes at each booth. Food fee for non-members will be \$5.00. More info will be available in the August Chum Line flyer.

Announcement – was made by Cathy Sanders – The Fishing Girl – that she will be holding a Ladies Only clinic about learning how to beach Surf Fish, see her for the time and place.

Fred Manzolillo was recognized and he had a question about the couple who were expelled from the club. He wanted to know what were the bylaws that were used in the expulsion. Adam said the question will be addressed after the break.

Guest Speaker: David Genk, speaking about Flounder Fishing

David said he had been a high school teacher and he is involved in the 'kids4reel' program to help younger generations learn about fishing and getting involved in conservation.



JULY MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Dave fishes with Johnny Johns another very successful member of the club when it comes to winning the tournaments. Dave puts a small mullet or mud minnow on a Redfish magic jighead or a big shrimp on the 8 inch hook. Sometimes he uses a Jerk Shad on the jighead. He showed us how to "flutter" your bait across the bottom of the water to attract the flounder. When you feel the flounder, when your bait stops, he uses 15-20 lb braid and sometimes you can feel the bite of the flounder, pause and raise the rod tip up. On the other rod he has the Redfish Magic jig with a paddle tail (Berkley). Take off the protective sleeve on the paddle tail bait. In his fishing bag he carries 20 lb test Monofilament line, a pair of pliers, a sharpening stone for his hooks, a knife for bleeding bluefish. He uses a loop knot but Johnny doesn't ,he uses a slip knot. The loop knot allows the bait to float freely in the water. Bait is good for spotted sea trout, flounder and redfish. He fishes off the banks. Walk along the beach at low tide to spot the rocks. You can catch flounder on top water plugs. Keep a log book of where and when you catch fish and the tides at that time. At the end of the talk, he held a Q & A to answer member's questions on how to catch flounder. It was a very informative talk.

The matter Fred Manzolillo wanted addressed was done so by Adam after our guest speaker segment. Adam told Fred that there will be a special meeting on August 22nd for Members only that will address the financial concerns and anyone who is interested should attend this meeting., 7 PM at the VFW. Adam also stated that the bylaws he was asking for were Article 1-Membership, Section 2, b-e. The vote of the board was 6 in favor to expel, 1 abstained, 2 against and 1 no vote. Fred then asked what was the issue and Adam said we are not dragging them through the mud at this meeting. There were multiple issues involved.

Adam also announced that at this time Mike Vickers is heading the committee to review the bylaws and he is looking for volunteers from the membership that would like to join the committee.

We had 64 members in attendance tonight.
