

45 people attended the weigh-in and I guess the food and drink were pretty good, as not much was brought back to me at the end of the day.



OCTOBER WEIGH MASTER REPORT BY SCOTT ROBERTSON

September's Fish of The Month was Redfish. The winner will be announced at the October meeting.

October's Fish of the Month is Bluefish. FWC rules for size are 12" minimum with a bag limit of 3 fish. Tim Miller won August fish of the month with a 3lb 1loz Mangrove Snapper. Congratulations Tim!

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is getting a lot of action with over 400 photos submitted. Remember just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year and the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize are. The Yearlong tournament has 250 entries at this time. You can see the standings for both the Yearlong and CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

October's Fish of the Month is Bluefish Don't forget Largemouth Bass is now an eligible species for the CPR yearlong tournament. We have set a minimum size limit of 12". I haven't seen any Largemouth Bass submitted yet so all you freshwater folks need to get busy. Please note this is for the CPR tournament only.



A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments – all fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale.

If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available.

Yellow Dawg Bait Shop at Highbridge is now open and is an official weigh station. The boat ramps there are also open so give them a visit. The Shipyard in St. Augustine is no longer an official weigh station. Please have your fish weighed at one of our other locations.

OCTOBER FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Flagler County Fishing Report - October 2023

October fishing report brought to you by Chris with Skinny Water Lures.

September started off with lots of rainfall from Hurricane Idalia. Have you ever noticed the increase of fish activity in the days before a storm? The changes in barometric pressure associated with good and bad weather will turn the fish on. Falling barometric pressure after many days of stable barometric pressure will cause



most species of fish to feed aggressively. Fish evolved to understand that low pressure means a storm is approaching and they may have to fast for many days, which is why fish bite the best right before a storm.

Once the storm is upon us, most fish have swim bladders that expand and contract based on the water pressure and barometric pressure of the atmosphere. Low barometric pressure causes these swim bladders to expand, which makes the fish uncomfortable. To decrease the air in their air bladders the fish will use the greater water pressure caused by the deep water to find a comfortable place to wait out the storm. That is why they disappear from the shallows during extreme storms and hurricanes.

After the storm has passed, these fish will return to the shallows and go back to feeding aggressively. The fish may have not eaten for days so they will leave the safety of the deep water where they were waiting out the storm and begin feeding. If you get a chance to fish several days before and after a storm, your chances of getting bites will increase.

We felt that the bite was increased on the flats during the beginning of September due to Hurricane Idalia. Several days leading up to the storm we noticed the fish were attacking small baitfish and shrimp along the banks. We focused on downsizing and threw the SWL 3 inch paddle tail, which the redfish could not resist. The early morning topwater bite was also on fire as well.

Mid September we noticed the bait fish were still plentiful on the flats due to the "mullet run". We found the fish seemed to turn off a little leading into the new moon phase. However, in the days after the new moon phase the fish turned the bite back on.

As the end of September approached, the redfish pre-spawn began. During this time you will notice the redfish will start gorging themselves on bait fish. Once the spawn starts the bite will slow down. Take advantage of this pre-spawn activity while the bite is hot.

During the last weeks of September we noticed that the redfish bite seemed to turn on a little more once the sun started poking over the horizon. The bite seemed a little sluggish early morning until the sun came up and started heating the water. Once the sun started rising the topwater bite turned on.

We found multiple reds being caught back-to-back in the same areas. Focus multiple cast in the same area before moving.

OCTOBER FISHING REPORT CONTINUED

Due to the super high tides, we found schools of redfish pushed back into the small creeks and grass flats. Target the mouths to these creeks with topwater early morning. Switch to a paddle tail midday and work closer to the bottom. After midday, we slowed things down and switched to the SWL creature bait. This creature style bait allows you to fineness fish the oyster bars and deep holes. As we jigged this bait off the bottom, we found most bites came on the down fall.

When the bite gets tough slow down and throw a fineness style bait. This will allow you to target closer to the bottom and allow your bait to stay in the strike zone longer.

As October approaches you will notice cooler weather during earlier morning and late evenings. This cooler weather will allow the water temperature to drop slightly. This slight temperature change will turn the fish bite on even more. Look for the bull redfish to start moving in as they chase the large schools of mullet.

Club Meeting Minutes 09-05-2023

Meeting was called to order by Club President, Adam Morley

Pledge of Allegiance – Presented by Ron Gorney

First Responders/Veterans/Active Duty Recognized

Welcome New Members/Visitors/Welcome Annual Sponsors – There were 2 members/guests at tonight's meeting. Sponsors present were Adam Morley from Genung's Fish Camp and Mike Vickers from Hammock Bait and Tackle.

Passing of 08-01-2023 Minutes, Motion made by Tim Beebe and seconded by Dean Roberts. Minutes accepted.

Announcements:

Adam said volunteers are needed for the By Law revision committee, tournaments, need someone to run the Oct. picnic and also need a Marketing Director.

Reports:

Finance Report: Deb Marinco said the August income was \$3,799.00, Expenses were \$3,871.59 Year-to-date net was \$12,268.28. Deb told us that arrangements are being made for the Christmas Party.

Tournament Director Report & Upcoming Tournaments: Bill Zimmer gave us a recap of the Flounder Tournament held on 8/23/2023. Sixty Nine people signed up to fish, 80 people attended the weigh in, he had great volunteers, 20 flounder were weighed in, the tournament was very successful for being held on a Wednesday and there will probably be 1 or 2 next year during the week. Tim Miller said the Bottom Trip will be on 9/16 on the Sea Spirit, out of Ponce Inlet. Cost is \$95.00 for members, \$130.00 for non-members, there will be a \$5.00 Calcutta, a 50/50 drawing and raffle prizes for a 2 ½ day trips for fishing, sign up is at the back table. Tim will draw for 6 back spots at 7:30 AM. No braid or hard liquor allowed, you can bring beer, only small coolers. He has 13-14 spots left, the limit is 40 people. The Member Classic is on 9/23, cost is \$25.00 per member, if not registered by 9/19, fee is \$30.00. Flyers on back table. This rule is different from last year – you can only win 2 positions in the same species. Weigh in is 2-3 PM at Herschel King Park. Redfish with the most spots prize is \$200.00. Fishing starts at 6:30 AM. We need volunteers to help at the tournaments.





SEPTEMBER MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Weigh Master Report: Scott Robertson said snook season is open from 9/01 – 12/14/2023, minimum length is 28" maximum is 32". You need a snook stamp if you are keeping it and if you are 65 years old or older, you don't need a fishing license, you just need to show your driver's license. 231 weigh slips have been turned in this year for the CPR. The Year Long tournament runs from Jan-Dec. with 24 eligible species, go to any of our weigh stations to weigh in. The fish weighed in will be in pounds and ounces but will be converted to decimals – if the fish is 1.5 the .5 is multiplied by 16 = 8 ounces., it will weigh in at 1 lb 8 oz. 408 photos are in the CPR tournament. The first fish you enter will get you 1 raffle ticket and for every other 5 fish you enter, you will get another raffle ticket. They must be legal fish. At the August 1st meeting, we had no winner for the July FOM to announce. The winner for July was Tim Miller with a 2 lb 8 oz flounder – he received a \$50.00 gift card. August FOM was Snapper not Red and was won by Tim Miller with a 3.11 oz Mangrove Snapper – he received a \$50.00 gift card.

Membership Report: Quinn Bui said we have 311 members at this time.

Announcements – Adam said the Local Brand Fishing Expo was very successful, we had great feedback on it and we intend to make it an annual event with improvements. If anyone has suggestions on how to make it better, let us know.

Guest Speaker: Bobby, Chris & Jessie from Skinnywater Lures

They make their own jig heads and paddle tails. Bobby said when you fish out of a kayak, it makes you slow down, a kayak is great to have in the flats. Jessie explained what was on the 2022 Blue Sideworks kayak made in Tennessee that they had on display. Check on You Tube for Roadtrip Angler. It is 4 feet wide, you can take the pontoons off of it. The front porch stores your cooler, you can stand on it. You can paddle it in the shallow water and clear the grass from underneath it. It has flex drive and a supercharger belt with a chair that turns to the side. Some tournaments only allow certain motors, so the motor is interchangeable. It has a power pole for anchoring. It is on wheels that will come up, once he is in the water. Motor has to be registered, some tournaments you can't use an electric motor. You can register your kayak at the DMV and if you buy a used one, the seller can write you a bill of sale to bring to the DMV. Most tournaments are CPR and you need to know what bump board you can use for the tournament that you are entering. Focus on drop offs and cast into oyster bars. You don't need a boat ramp to launch a kayak. Question was asked about the weight of the kayak. Answer was 170 lbs without the motor and 225 lbs at the most with the motor. Your seat has to be comfortable, bring a small tackle box, 5-6 rods, a PFD safety vest is necessary. No live wells, kayaks use rope to put fish overboard in the water – don't use steel strings – sharks can flip your boat if they try to eat your fish. If you night fish, you need lights on the kayak.
