



FEBRUARY WEIGH MASTER REPORT CONTINUED

You can see the standings for both the Yearlong Species and Year Long CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments: All fish must comply with FWC rules. New for 2024, fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station. CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize, as noted on the tournament flyers.

FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Flagler County Fishing Report - January 2024 recap

Fishing Report brought to you by Chris with Skinny Water Lures.

In the beginning of January the water and air temperatures continue to drop, but Chris from Skinny Water Lures has got you covered with some great fishing advice for these cooler Florida temps!



As the temperature drops, the predatory fish are pushing to the deeper holes to stay warm. We found targeting these deeper holes early morning while slowly bouncing or dragging a 3 inch paddle tail or curly tail grub along the bottom, had the redfish chewing. As you target these deeper holes back in the flats or small creeks, remember to work these areas slowly and as quietly as possible. With the drop in temperatures these redfish are lethargic and will be spooked easily. Mid-day, while fishing the small creeks mouths, we found good numbers of redfish sunning on top and along side the oyster bars. As the temperatures continue to drop, focus on a very slow retrieve around oyster bars and deep holes.

Mid month the bite was on fire. With the cold water temperatures we set out looking to focus on the deep holes around oyster bars in the High Bridge area. Early morning we focused on the trout bite, by tying on a Skinny Water Lures suspending twitchbait. We found areas with moving water, so that throwing up current allowed the lure to drift back towards us. We focused our retrieve on a twitch-twitch-pause method. During this winter time your twitch motion should be soft and light. Most strikes happened as this twitch bait was suspended in the water column, allowing that bait to float motionless. In the winter time and during colder water temperatures, work these style lures with a twitching motion every few seconds. Really slow down your retrieve in the winter.

As we mentioned, in these colder months the redfish become very lethargic and spook easily. If you throw a larger paddle tail or a lure with a lot of vibration or action you will tend to drive these redfish away. Keeping this in mind, we decide to downsize and throw the 3 inch SWL curly tail grub. We focused areas with deep holes and nearby oyster bars. These deep holes hold warmer water and the nearby oyster bars allow the redfish to adventure out to get bait and then dive back into the deep hole. Focus bouncing a curly tail grub on a jig-head off the bottom in the deep holes. Doing this jigging motion in the water column and allowing it to fall right back down, gives that corkscrew tail tremendous action with less vibration. Doing this technique allowed us to produce numerous upper slot redfish.

FISHING REPORT CONTINUED

Approaching the end of the month the bite became tough due to more cold fronts and rainy days. Fish become more active as the drop in barometric pressure signals feeding opportunities. The approaching precipitation often stimulates fish to feed more aggressively, making it an opportune time to fish. However immediately after rain or during a cold front, fish might become less active. The sudden change in weather conditions can temporarily disrupt their feeding patterns, leading to a potential lull in bites. Patience and adaptability become crucial as you may need to adjust your technique, lures or bait presentation to entice bites during these post frontal conditions. Understanding the nuances of fish behavior in response to weather changes adds an extra layer of strategy for success on the water during these times.

During the winter time, the speckle sea trout bite will also turn up. Focus areas with deep drop-offs or deep holes with moving water. These deep drop-offs or holes with moving water allow the trout to gather in multiple numbers. These trout will position down deep or just outside the drop-offs, waiting to ambush the bait fish as the current pushes them over the deep holes. With these winter patterns we found a suspending twitchbait is the bait of choice for trout. These trout cannot resist the twitch pause action, causing most strikes to happen on the pause. This action allows the suspending twitchbait to be a top rated lure of choice for winter time trout.

Club Meeting Minutes 01-02-2024

Meeting called to order by President, Adam Morley

Pledge of Allegiance – Presented by Ron Gorney

First Responders/Veterans/Active Duty Recognized

Welcome New Members/Visitors/Welcome Annual Sponsors – There were 7 guests at tonight's meeting. Sponsors present were Adam Morley from Genung's Fish Camp and Mike Vickers from Hammock Bait & Tackle.

Passing of 11-14-2023 Minutes, Motion made by Tim Beebe and seconded by Dean Roberts. Minutes accepted.

Announcements: Adam announced to the group that the VFW has increased the rates for our meetings here and we got a better deal next door at Club 51/Social Club. So we are moving our member meetings and Director meetings to Club 51 starting with our next Member meeting on Feb. 01, 2024. Mike Vickers explained that the cost had doubled at the VFW and we were paying to rent the room and there were poker games and Queen of Heart games going on in our room that were disruptive to our meetings. The board of directors felt we were getting a better deal and rate at the Social Club. We will still contribute to the VFW, if we wish to. Reports:

Finance Report: Deb Marinco said for the months of Nov. & Dec. the Total Income was \$3,065.00 from raffles, 50/50, donations and merchandise that was sold. the Net Year to Date-which is not final yet, was about \$2,066.58 and Proceeds of \$2,000.00. The CD of \$10,000.00 we have, will be maturing in Feb. of 2024.

Tournament Director Report & Upcoming Tournaments: Tim Miller said we finished 2023 with many good and successful tournaments, he is looking for chairpersons to run our 2024 tournaments. He has a list of the upcoming tournaments, you can fish and run a tournament. There are 11 tournaments plus the Spring Classic – we need people to run all of these.





JANUARY MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Bill and Cookie Zimmer will be chairing the Sheepshead Tournament. Bill gave us a rundown of it, the start time is 6:30 AM, fish anywhere, weigh in is at Bings Landing from 2-3 PM, prizes are listed on the flyer in the Jan. Chum Line, the cut off for registration whether you are fishing or not is the Wed. before the tournament on 1/17th. For CPR fish, bring photo and show it to the Weigh Master, Scott, to record it. Tim is still looking for what raffle items you are interested in having at the tournaments. Please let him know! The calendar dates for the tournaments are not online yet. The Feb. & March tournaments are taken care of for chairpersons.

Weigh Master Report: Scott Robertson reported to Adam that it is Jan. 2nd and Tim Miller is already ahead of him in the CPR Tournament. January Fish of the Month is Black Drum size 14-24" 5 fish per bag limit. The Nov. FOM was Sea Trout/Snook – the winner was Mark Heffley who caught a Sea Trout, there was no winner for the Snook prize. The Dec. FOM was Whiting and the winner was Karen Dougherty who caught a 1 lb 4 oz whiting and received a gift card from Hammock Bait Shop for \$50.00. There was a question from the audience on how to do the FOM tournament. Answer is: Take the fish to the weigh station, weigh it in, fill out the white & yellow ticket, you keep the yellow part and give the white part back to the bait shop employee and make sure they sign it as a witness. For the Year Long Tournament winners, Scott will send you all an email showing what the eligible prizes are, go to the site of what you want, put sizes, your name and the fish if you wish. Scott named the winners of the Year Long and the fish they caught. The Male Angler of the Year is Tim Miller and the Lady Angler of the Year is Karen Dougherty - Congrats to the both of you! Then we went on to the CPR Wheel of Winners – Peter Bessette set up a colorful wheel with the entries of CPR anglers on the stage Jumbotron. JANUARY MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Under the Membership portion – 21 or older can join the club. This was changed this year to 18 years of age now. Article 1 Sec. 2 Para. B – Expulsion majority vote of the Board of Directors serious misconduct or act alleged to be detrimental to the club. Written warning not to exceed 3 years. Para. B Can't run or nominated expulsion no less than 3 years. Afterward, they can apply to the club. In the past, it was infinite (open ended) Blue ink – moved from Para. F to Para. E Article 2 Nature of Business changed to a calendar year from May to January now. Para. B struck out – if expelled you can't weigh fish in. Article 4 removal – changed to 18 years old. Para. E Membership – Age of 19 you can become an officer if you wait a year. Vote is now one per member. Taken out independent auditor to audit, struck that out and added in – independent reviewer to review. Article 5, Section 7 Struck out was Quartermaster to obtain raffle items. Art. 8, Sec. 1 Changed fiscal year to calendar year starts Dec. 1 – Jan. 1st. This will be going out in a few days by email. We have to notify members 10 days prior to taking the votes. Mike will be absent at the Feb. 1st meeting, but he can answer any questions until the end of January or you can talk to Adam after the end of January and he will address your questions.

Guest Speaker: Tim Miller – How to fish for Sheepshead

Look for Sheepshead around pilings, you can catch them off of Matanzas Bridge, get them in the surf, at Jungle Hut where the rocks are and Marineland off the beach in the intercoastal water at High Bridge, Dunlawton rocks in the jetty, also at St. Augustine. Sand fleas are his to-go bait, they like fiddler crabs also but in the winter the crabs are usually in the ground. You can also use shrimp, frozen sand fleas are not as good as the live ones. Sand fleas are hard to find right now but when you can get them, keep them in the cooler don't put them in the sun. Some people catch them and blanch them. He puts them in a baggie and takes out a few at a time to use, if they stay out too long, they will turn black and die, so keep them in a cool place. He uses #1 O circle hooks, you don't need to jerk a circle hook. He uses Eagle Claw brand, always keep your hooks razor sharp and if they get dull, sharpen them up. He uses a split shot to keep the bait at the bottom, pay attention because the bait fish will steal your bait really fast. If you feel a slight hit, it may be a Sheepshead, he holds his rod, doesn't lie it down. You don't want a long leader, he uses 6" to a foot, you want a short leader. He doesn't use fluorocarbon, uses 30" Walmart \$1.99 line against the braid. When the current slacks, the sheepshead come out from where they are around the dock to feed. Check your bait every 10 minutes. He uses a snap swivel with a 1 oz egg sinker, barrel swivel, 30# leader (A Carolina Rig). You can use a jighead but the sheepshead will feel that jighead and swim away. You will catch big ones in Jan, Feb. & March. Fish the tides at Matanzas 1 hour before and one hour after the high tide. In the intercoastal, when the water slows down, that's the time to be there. At Matanzas the sand is always shifting.
