





February's fish of the month was Sheepshead. The winner will be announced at the March 7th meeting.

March Fish of the Month is Spotted Seatrout. FWC rules for Spotted Seatrout are 15" minimum and 19" maximum length. One fish over 19" is permitted per vessel. The total bag limit is 5 fish.

Karen Dougherty won January's Fish of the Month with a 6lb 1loz Black Drum. Congratulations Karen!

The 2024 Yearlong tournaments are off to a great start. 32 photos have been submitted for the CPR tournament through February. Remember, just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year and the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize are. The 2024 Yearlong Species Tournament has 56 entries through February.


You can see the standings for both the Yearlong Species and Year Long CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

Don't forget Large Mouth Bass is now an eligible species for the CPR yearlong tournament. We have set a minimum size limit of 12". Please note this is for the CPR tournament only.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. New for 2024, fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station.

FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Flagler County Fishing Report - February 2024 recap

Fishing Report brought to you by Chris with Skinny Water Lures.

Chris from Skinny Water Lures reported that this month started off a bit slow, with water temperatures around 56-57 degrees near Bing's Landing. Despite the cooler temperatures and mostly high tides in the first week, anglers were able to have some excellent fishing days. Reports of redfish



congregating around oyster bars in the area prompted us to head out early in the morning to target these schools of redfish and trout.

Using the Skinny Water Lures 3.5-inch twitch bait with the twitch-pause method, we were able to mimic the movement of fleeing baitfish, enticing the fish to strike. Our efforts paid off with the capture of a beautiful 23-inch redfish as the first catch of the day. The fishing remained hot as we reeled in several slot redfish, with the action lasting for hours before slowing down.

In the afternoon, we shifted our focus to speckled trout in a nearby grass flat where they were known to gather. Using the SWL twitch bait, we had success catching several 17" and 18" trout. As always, the key during these winter patterns was slow retrieval for effective fishing.

Towards the end of the month, the fishing bite remained remarkably good despite the chilly temperatures. A sudden spike in outside temperatures to the low 80s sparked a feeding frenzy among the usually sluggish fish. Venturing to a new area near the 206 bridge, we used kayaks to navigate the skinny waters, braving windy conditions up to 30mph to target redfish.

Employing a 4-inch Skinny Water Lures green goblin paddle tail near the bottom, we managed to hook a substantial 27-inch redfish and several others in the 18-19 inch range. By fishing slowly along the bottom and switching to a SWL suspending twitch bait mid-day, we successfully caught additional redfish including a 28-inch and 23-inch specimen using this technique.

Persistence was key as we emphasized the importance of repeating efforts in the same areas to maximize catches. While the trout bite was slower this week, reports indicated success in areas of deep moving water. Additionally, good reports surfaced of snook being caught in the evening around the High Bridge area using Skinny Water Lures topwater lures.

As the month comes to a close, anglers are encouraged to employ slow retrieval, persistence, and the use of Skinny Water Lures for a rewarding fishing experience.

Passing of 01-02-2024 Minutes, Motion made by Dean Roberts and seconded by Tim Beebe. Minutes accepted.

Announcements: Adam announced that we need someone to run the Spring Classic, CCA will be assisting us with the weigh-in. The Club Calendars are out, get one from Quinn Bui at the side table at the back of the room. Adam also told the attendees at the meeting to please sit at the tables with the signs on them for the kind of fishing they are interested in such as Surf, Inshore, Offshore, etc. Please engage with other members and share information to help others to become more knowledgeable about the type of fishing you enjoy. CPR – you can only fish in Florida State waters. In the Year Long by the end of January, there were 40 entries so far. 32 photos so far in the CPR. In January, FOM was Black Drum – winner was Karen Dougherty, she received a \$50.00 gift card from Hammock Bait & Tackle.

Membership Report: Quinn Bui said the renewal for the 2024 memberships are past due now. We have 240 members now that have renewed or are new. Saturday, March 9th will be the Member Clinic held at Club 51, There will be a flyer in the March edition of the Chum Line or it can also be found online at our website or social media account on Facebook to get the information on it.

By-Laws – Mike Vickers is unable to be present for the vote on the updated By-Laws tonight, but we appreciate all the hard work he and his committee have done on this. Mike did the presentation at the January meeting and Adam is conducting the vote on it tonight. A MOTION was made to accept the new By-Laws for 2024 by Chuck Radloff and seconded by Dean Roberts. There were only two NO votes and the motion was passed to accept the new 2024 By-Laws.

Open Floor for Bylaw Suggestions - Adam made an open request for suggestions from the members, he got one previous request but waited to pass the By-Laws before taking an amendment to them. Tim Beebe said the wording in the By-Laws is old school as far as the household membership is worded. He said a single person is made to feel like an outcast. Each single person should be allowed to bring a guest as a family member to the weigh-ins or events. FEBRUARY MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Guest Speaker: Mark Grillo with Palm Coast Marine Repair

Mark said his repair service started three years ago, he is mobile only. He said in order to keep your outboard motors in good shape, you need to do a lot of preventive maintenance. He can work on boats on lifts in the canals, and he will come to you. Adam asked him the three things that you need to pay the most attention to. (1) Fuel – lack of usage, don't use the boat enough, lack of maintenance and the lack of anos being changed. After 60 days, the fuel will get bad. The solution is to 'Go Fishing' more. He mentioned that a study said even non-ethanol gas has 5% ethanol. Use Yamaha Addal ring free to put in as an additive. Moisture can get into the fuel. (2) Another big issue is Internal anodes in newer engines stops interior deterioration. The engine rots from anodes that were not changed. Flushing the engine helps if the water is bad. Flushing should be done for 5-10 minutes with the engine running and use the muffs. (3) Water impeller, because of sand in water from fishing the flats. Every year for inshore, change the impellers. Use the scanner to check the newer motors and you have to connect with the computers. You can use Salt Away, once a year. 
