FROM THE HELM -BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Dear Flagler Sportfishing Club Members,

There has been some confusion on the rules for Catch, Photo and Release (CPR) and how to properly measure a fish.

The purpose of the CPR tournament is to release fish (ALIVE) that you would otherwise keep. For example, I go fishing, catch a 26" Redfish (Red Drum) instead of keeping the Redfish, I place it back in the water and watch it swim away (ALIVE). For CPR tournament before I release the fish, I place it on a Club Approved Bump Board and take a picture. Then, I release the fish in to the water and watch it swim away. This picture is then uploaded to the CPR entry on the Club's website.

The 23 species of fish that are eligible are as follows: Amberjack, Black Drum, Bluefish, Cobia, Dolphin, Flounder, Grouper, King Mackerel, Mangrove Snapper, Pompano, Porgy (includes all with exception of Sheepshead), Redfish, Red Snapper, Sea Bass, Sheepshead, Snapper (other), Snook, Spanish Mackerel, Triggerfish, Spotted Sea Trout, Tuna (which includes Bonita), Wahoo and Largemouth Bass (12" minimum).



FROM THE HELM CONTINUED

Eligible fish must be photographed on Club Approved Bump Board, safely released and within legal FWC rules for size and season. Following FWC rules and regulations means that fish which are out of season or over-sized/under-sized will not be accepted for the CPR tournament.

Now to properly measure a fish, you will need a tape measure or bump board.

- 1. Ensure the fish is as flat as you can get it.
- 2. Ensure the fish's nose starts at zero (0) inches.
- 3. Depending on the type of fish, which is determined by the tail, measure the fish. a. Hard-tail (Fork Length) which is measured to the fork of the tail such as:



- i. Pompano/Permit Family
- ii. Jack family
- iii. Bluefish
- iv. Bonefish
- v. Tuna family
- vi. Dolphinfish
- vii. Cobia
- viii. Wahoo
- ix. Mackerel Family
- x. Trigger and Hogfish
- xi. Billfish (including swordfish) start starting at the tip of the lower jaw
- xii. Tarpon

xiii. Grouper (Snowy, Warsaw/ Speckled Hind, all other grouper not listed as a soft-tail.)

xiv. All Shark species

b. Soft-tail (Total Length) which is measure to the longest part of the tail when pinched together. Such as:

i. Drum Family (Red/Black) ii. Trout Family iii. Flounder iv. Sheepshead v. Porgy Family vi. Snapper Family vii. Grouper (Black, Red, Scamp, Gag, Yellowfin/Yellowmouth viii. Black Sea Bass ix. Tripletail

I hope this helps you avoid taking a fish that is over/undersized. I will be conducting a demonstration of how to measure different fish during the quick tips portion of our meeting on September 5th starting at 7:00pm.

Remember the fishing lies start here.



September's Fish of the Month is Redfish



**NOTICE - The overall species Leaders and Full Point Standings are updated at the end of each month on the club website: <u>flagersportfishing.com</u> Then under Fishing click on YearLong Club Standings.



August's Fish of The Month was Snapper (not Red) .The winner will be announced at the September meeting.

September's Fish of the Month is Redfish. FWC rules for size are 18"to 27" with a bag limit of 1 fish.

Tim Miller won July fish of the month with a 2lb 8oz Flounder. Congratulations Tim!

The CPR (catch, photo, release) tournament is getting a lot of action. Remember just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year. You can see the standings for both the Yearlong and CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings. We have a good supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

Don't forget Large Mouth Bass is now an eligible species for the CPR yearlong tournament. We have set a minimum size limit of 12". I haven't seen any Large Mouth Bass submitted yet so all you freshwater folks need to get busy. Please note this is for the CPR tournament only.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed.

Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you ever have a problem weighing in at one of our weigh stations, you can call me and come by my home, if I am available.

Yellow Dog Bait Shop at Highbridge is open and is an official weigh station. The boat ramps there are also open so give them a visit.

The Shipyard in St. Augustine is no longer an official weigh station. Please have your fish weighed at one of our other locations.





FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Flagler County Fishing Report - August 2024

Fishing Report brought to you by Chris with <u>Skinny Water Lures.</u>

Hello, fellow anglers! Chris here from Skinny Water Lures, bringing you the latest fishing report as we dive into August. The fishing scene has been quite lively this month, and we have some exciting updates to share regarding redfish, snook, and more!



Early August

As we kicked off the month, hot days were coupled with the typical afternoon showers. While the redfish bite initially slowed down, early mornings brought some thrilling topwater action. Focus your efforts around flooded grass areas and oyster bars, as redfish have been actively feeding until midday. As the sun reached its peak and the water began to heat up, many anglers found success fishing in deeper holes. Changing strategies to bouncing paddle tails in those cooler drop-offs was key to maintaining the bite.

In the Bing's Landing area, the snook bite was on fire! With upper slot snook being caught throughout the day, early morning and late evening proved to be the prime times. Anglers had great luck using topwater lures during dawn and dusk, while midday fishing required a shift to paddle tails in areas with moving water and solid structures.

Mid-August

After weathering a few rough days from Hurricane Debby, we observed significant tidal swings that reshaped our fishing conditions. The post-storm low tides exposed muddy flats and mangrove edges, concentrating baitfish and making redfish more accessible in shallow water.

Redfish Feeding Behavior: With the aggressive feeding pattern displayed by redfish during low tide, anglers started finding success on the flats and in shallow pools. Early mornings and late afternoons were the best times to spot tailing redfish hunting for shrimp, mullet, and crabs.

Best Locations: Targeting muddy flats, potholes, and structures like mangroves and rocky points increased catch rates significantly.

FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Key Techniques:

- **Bait Selection:** Live shrimp, cut mullet, and live crabs were top choices. Always aim to match bait size with the local forage for the best chances.
- **Lures:** Skinny Water Lures' soft plastic paddle tails and topwaters in natural baitfish colors were hitting well. A slow retrieve during early mornings and just before sundown yielded positive results.

Speckled Trout

The upper part of the month has also been promising for speckled trout. Concentration in strategic spots has made targeting easier as the tide recedes.

• **Best Locations:** Channels, drop-offs, oyster beds, and marsh banks were great spots to land trout.

Techniques:

• Lures: SWL suspending twitch baits in bright colors and paddle tails worked effectively. Don't miss out on early morning topwater action as it's prime for strikes.

End of August

As we venture deeper into summer, the weather continues to heat up, and so does the fishing. Early mornings remain the most productive times to hit the water.

- **Fishing Highlights:** Incredible early morning topwater bites have been reported, especially around island points and grass flats. Look for tailing redfish and ambushing snook targeting baitfish.
- **Midday Strategy:** As the sun rises, pivot your approach to incorporate paddle tails and curly tail grubs that reach deeper waters, where fish seek refuge from the heat.
- Juvenile Tarpon: We have also received exciting reports of juvenile tarpon around the old SeaRay canal—these fish are a thrill to catch!

Tips for Success

- **Timing Is Crucial:** Fish during the cooler parts of the day, like dawn and dusk for better action.
- Adapt to Conditions: Always be prepared to change up your gear and techniques depending on tidal patterns and weather conditions.

Remember to hydrate, wear sunscreen, and enjoy the beautiful waters. The month ahead looks promising, so gather your gear and get ready for some action-packed days on the water.

Ice Cream Social – This event will be held tonight Mary Phillips and Matanzas H.S. student, Sean will be our volunteers to dish out the ice cream. Ice cream was obtained by Deb Marinco. Thanks for all your help in making this event possible.

Speaker: Capt. Mike Vickers, Sr. will discuss Flounder Fishing and also show us how to fillet a flounder.

Capt. Mike said that watching Salt Life Videos and that some of the videos are fishing down south. Flagler County is the toughest county in Fla. to fish in. The guys on TV spend 3-4 days of filming to catch fish. He said, Cpt. Tim Jarvis, Cpt. Mike Vickers, Jr. and Cpt. Jim Britton grew up fishing here and they know the area very well. Book these people, they know how to fish here, so use them. He spent 4 hours fishing and got 5 flounder. He used artificial bait, if you use live shrimp, the mangrove snappers will get in the way of you getting to the flounders. He only uses 3 fishing poles on his boat and one of them is the first pole that Mike Jr. had made for him, a 6 foot Gator pole and he uses a small jig head on it. After he filets the fish, he will display his poles so you can see how he has them set up and take any questions then. When looking for good fishing equipment he picked a Penn rod and reel to use when he took clients out on a charter trip. The Penn is hard for the clients to break and destroy. He said he went to Mosquito Lagoon and in 18" of water, caught 7 fish using Gulp shrimp. He went fishing this morning and caught a redfish and 5 flounder and the one he will be fileting is over 5 pounds. He said when the tide is in your face, you will catch more fish, he uses jerk bait with a jig head. He said Flounder are waiting with the tide in their face, waiting for bait to come to them. Don't fish against the tide. If by the oyster bars, use a float to keep the line off the oysters. Two hours before & after the falling tide, the fish move with the water. Cut bait will bring pinfish that make noise, so the pinfish will attract redfish, which is good. When using Gulf shrimp bait, work it fast, jerk it up 2 times and let it drop. When putting on the Gulp bait, hook it so it is level with no curves in it. Linda Vickers assisted Mike by standing in front of him with a white board that showed what he was doing and the projector screen was down so it was being shown on the screen and people in the back of the room could better see it.

<u>FILLETING THE FLOUNDER</u> – Always have good gloves, Mike Jr. demonstrated by using the very sharp fillet knife when he sliced at the gloves that they would not be penetrated. Your other tool of course would be a very sharp filet knife. You can buy both the gloves and knife at Hammock Bait & Tackle shop. A flounder has 4 filets on it, a white and a dark side. First, cut off the tail. The white side is thinner, so start with that one. Have a line down through, that is the backbone, cut the string across the tail then cut a C shape. Cut on the back bones straight across, take the tip of the knife and lay it on the backbone, drag along backbone, to follow the rib cage. Get all the way down past the rib cage and go along sideways, stay out of the belly of the fish, it makes a nice filet. Do the other side the same way, let the knife follow the bones sideways to get the filet, you can hold the fish up and see the bones. Let the knife follow the skin and pull it away, no bones, no skin.
