FROM THE HELM -BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Dear Flagler Sportfishing Club Members,

As October begins, we await the fall Pompano run and have our second Surf Fishing
Tournament of the year. As many of you know, I grew up chasing fish in the river, navigating through the twists and turns like a young adventurer on a quest for treasure. But when it comes to surf fishing, let me tell you, I had a master teacher—my grandfather. This man didn't just run the Flagler Pier; he practically owned the ocean in my eyes. If he wasn't working behind the counter, he was out in the surf, catching everything from flounder to sharks like they were mere minnows. I swear, he could hook a shark using a shoestring and an old soda can pull-tab.

Things have certainly changed since his glory days, but the essence of surf fishing remains. If you're looking to catch a big one, you'll need at least a 10-foot rod. That kind of length gives you the muscle you need to cast further out beyond the second break—where the real action is happening. Ensuring your rig is set up correctly is just as crucial. There are a variety of pre-made rigs, countless sizes of hooks, colorful sinkers, and styles that depend entirely on your targeted fish and the whims of Mother Nature.

FROM THE HELM CONTINUED

Let's begin with the basic setup: the two-drop rig. It's the simplest and very effective. You simply tie it on, add a sinker, and as the name suggests, stick on two hooks with no additional leader. This dual-hook setup allows you to experiment with two different baits at once, giving you the chance to see what the fish are biting that day. It's like a buffet line for fish, and you might just discover their favorite dish!

For those with specific targets in mind—like Pompano, Whiting, Flounder, or Bluefish—there are specialized rigs designed just for them. While they may look similar, these rigs differ in hook sizes, styles, and quantities. Some rigs may even incorporate pill floats to keep the bait hovering enticingly above the sandy bottom, making them irresistible to curious fish. If you wish to try your luck you could even tie your own surf fishing rigs.

Now, let's delve into the hooks. The type you choose greatly depends on your target species. For Pompano and Flounder, I prefer a size 1 or 2 wide-gap Kahle hook, which allows for a solid hookset. When targeting Whiting, a long-shank Aberdeen (J) style hook in sizes 4 or 6 is your best bet. Each species has its preferences, and knowing which hooks to use can make a world of difference.

The choice of sinkers is equally important and varies based on your fishing environment. Fishing over sandy bottoms? A standard pyramid sinker often does the trick. However, if you're fishing in rocky areas, I recommend a bank-style sinker. It's much less likely to get snagged because it has smooth edges.

In areas with strong currents, an almond (flat) style weight is ideal, because it has a lower profile, whereas, for relentless surf conditions, a Sputnik sinker is your best friend. Those unique wire appendages dig into the soft bottom, anchoring your rig in place.

And let's not forget about bait. If you had to pick just one, shrimp is the universal choice. Most fish that you can hook will happily munch on shrimp. However, don't overlook sand fleas, especially when targeting Pompano and Whiting; they're considered a delicacy. Clams and strips of squid also work wonders, giving you plenty of options in your bait bucket.

In the grand scheme of things, surf fishing has a rhythm all its own. The thrill of casting your line into the crashing surf, combined with the nostalgia of those fishing lessons from my grandfather, makes every fishing trip a cherished memory waiting to happen. So, grab your gear, enjoy the ocean breeze, and may the next cast bring a tug on the line and some prize money!

Remember the fishing lies start here.

September's fish of the month was Redfish. The winner will be announced at the October 2024 meeting.


October Fish of the Month is Bluefish. FWC rules for Bluefish are 12" minimum Measured at the fork of the tail. The bag limit is 3.

The 2024 Yearlong Species tournament has approximately 289 entries weighed in and the CPR tournament has approximately 498 photos submitted through August. Remember, just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year and the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize are.

CPR photos must be caught in State of Florida waters and meet FWC requirements including in season, length, and proper measuring method. Please check FWC rules to make sure you are measuring properly (i.e. nose to tail, pinch the tail, nose to fork etc). Photos not meeting FWC requirements will be deleted.

Please note that for the species yearlong tournament, if your fish is not heavier than the 6th place fish for that particular species in the Men's or Ladies' standings, there is no need to weigh-in the fish. Points are only given for places 1 through 6.

You can see the standings for both the Yearlong Species and Year Long CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings.

There has been some confusion with the way the weight of fish is calculated in the yearlong species tournament standings. The weight is calculated in pounds carried out two decimal places. I have provided a table that you can use to convert the decimal places back to ounces below. Simply replace the two decimals in the standings with the corresponding ounces in the table.

Example: 1.31 lbs = 1 lb 5 ozs.

We have a new supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. <u>New for 2024, fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.</u>

Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station.

CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize as noted on the tournament flyers.

Important reminder:

The rules for each tournament are clearly stated on the flyer published for that tournament. PLEASE READ THE RULES. There will be no exceptions to the rules.

FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Flagler County Fishing Report

Fishing Report brought to you by Captain Mike Vickers Jr, Hammock Bait & Tackle

As I sit down to write this article, another hurricane is on the horizon. Recently, I have been chatting with some regular customers about fishing, and the topic of atmospheric pressure, or barometer readings, came up. Before diving in, I will clarify: I am not a scientist. These thoughts are based on my observations and experiences. There are varying opinions on how atmospheric pressure affects fishing, with arguments both for and against it.



One argument suggests that hydrodynamic pressure (the weight of water) overshadows atmospheric pressure (the weight of air) since water exerts greater static pressure than air. It is true—at sea level, atmospheric pressure is about 14.7 pounds per square inch (psi). However, at a depth of 32.8 feet, the pressure reaches 2 atmospheres, and at 65.6 feet, it's 3 atmospheres, equating to 44.1 pounds of force per square inch. Some assert that this water pressure has no impact on fish behavior. While there's scientific backing to this, it's essential to note that pressure (force) differs from weight (mass), and all fish possess swim bladders that help them maintain buoyancy or change depths.

Another viewpoint suggests that it's not the barometric (atmospheric) change itself that affects fishing, but rather the associated weather changes. Of course, one cannot have weather shifts without changes in barometric readings. Proponents of this theory argue that falling barometers indicate approaching storms and reduced light conditions, which can trigger feeding behavior in fish. These are just two of the many prevalent arguments against the influence of atmospheric pressure on fishing.

In my experience, I believe that fluctuations in atmospheric pressure do impact fish biting behavior. When pressure remains steady, I often notice a strong bite as the fall approaches. I'm not sure if it's due to changing light conditions or subtle shifts in pressure affecting the fish, but ultimately, I'm just focused on catching them. After a few hours, as the fall continues, the bite tends to slow down—often coinciding with the onset of a storm (not your typical Florida thunderstorm), signaling it's time to head in. A similar pattern holds for rising barometric pressure; while storms can complicate things, the bite can actually improve in those conditions.

Now let's put this information to use. The surf has been producing good-sized Whiting, Sharks and Black drum on the beaches with rocks and a few Redfish. The river and canals are producing Snook and Trout early morning and at night, Mangrove (Grey) snapper, Redfish, Black drum, and Tarpon. The best fishing has been at low tide. Matanzas inlet has been busy with Redfish, Mangrove (Grey) Snapper, Black Drum, Flounder, and Trout. I expect to see this pattern continue after the Hurricane.

Speaker: Cpt. Billy Pettigrew – Tournament Fishing: Cpt. Pettigrew is with Com'n'getit Fishing Charters. He said make sure you have the necessary equipment on your boat, like a measuring board, a net, check your boat batteries and make sure they are charged. When fishing a tournament, he changes the lines on his rods and prepares all his tackle ahead of time. You need to understand the rules of the tournament. Have extra batteries and be prepared for any problems that might arise. He uses a mid-green colored braid line and he has many poles, he uses doubles with different baits or artificial baits on some he has fluro-carbon and others have braid line. He tries to scout out and pre-fish the area before a tournament. He said he is rough on his equipment and rods and reels will break. He looks to see what bait the fish are eating – mud minnows, shrimp, glass minnows, if you see birds whatever is around that area that can help you. On a jighead, hook the shrimp through the tail, they jump backwards when they get scared. Saltwater is heavier – the salinity in the water decreases and the fish go back down for the salinity. He uses a popping cork. In darker water, he uses a darker bait, he also uses a topwater bait or a shrimp lure. Around docks, he uses a paddle tail. Depending on how deep the water is he will use a weighted hook, he uses silver color in clear water. Never have your drag tighter than the line you are fishing with.
