




To close out I would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! Please be safe! I hope to see you at the Christmas party but if not, here's to next year.

Your club finished the year with our Red, White and Blue Tournament on November 16th . This tournament saw a respectable number of members weigh in fish. Thanks to Mike Vickers Sr. and crew, members enjoyed an outstanding lunch along with fellowship. See the Red, White, and Blue summary in this issue for results.

Your club ended the year with nine free member tournaments in which \$6,300.00 in prize money was given out. Members also took advantage of the member classic with \$2000.00 in prize money. There was a Red Snapper Tournament, along with the Spring Classic for members to partake in.

The Catch, Photo and Release Tournament is in full swing. Forty-five members have submitted 600 photos in eleven varied species. There is still time to enter a fish in the CPR tournament. Remember that fish must be of legal length and in season to count for CPR Tournament. Get your club bump board and start entering your fish for a chance at being one of the eleven winners that will win a Club Jacket, Club Shirt or Sponsor Gift Card at the end of the year. As members can only win once, the odds of winning with one fish are good. You only need to upload one released fish to be entered into the prize drawings. Then every five fish after that will get you another entry.

Next year will see ten more free tournaments. The first will be the Black and Red Tournament on January 18, 2025. (Dress Warm!) Your club is also planning a Red Snapper Tournament, a Members Classic Tournament and a Bottom Trip. Along with the Fish of the Month Contest there will be a Year Long Tournament and we will of course be continuing the CPR tournament. 

December's Fish of the Month is Whiting

November's fish of the month was Snook.

December's fish of the month is Whiting. Whiting has no FWC regulations. The winners of both November and December FOM will be announced at the January 2025 meeting.

October's FOM was Bluefish. The winner was Bill Pleskach with a 1 lb 7 oz Bluefish. Congratulations Bill!

December will wrap up the 2024 Yearlong Species and CPR tournaments. Only one more month to enter your fish for this year. Remember, just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year and the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize are. The winners of both tournaments will be determined in January, 2025

CPR photos must be caught in State of Florida waters and meet FWC requirements including in season, length, and proper measuring method. Please check FWC rules to make sure you are measuring properly (i.e. nose to tail, pinch the tail, nose to fork etc). Photos not meeting FWC requirements will be deleted.

Please note that for the species yearlong tournament, if your fish is not heavier than the 6th place fish for that particular species in the Men's or Ladies' standings, there is no need to weigh-in the fish. Points are only given for places 1 through 6.

You can see the standings for both the Yearlong Species and Year Long CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings.

There has been some confusion with the way the weight of fish is calculated in the yearlong species tournament standings. The weight is calculated in pounds carried out two decimal places. I have provided a table that you can use to convert the decimal places back to ounces below. Simply replace the two decimals in the standings with the corresponding ounces in the table.

Example: 1.31 lbs = 1 lb 5 ozs.

We have a new supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal. Bump boards are available at club meetings and Hammock Bait and Tackle. Cash only at Hammock Bait and Tackle.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. New for 2024, fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the weigh-in are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station.

CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize as noted on the tournament flyers.

Important reminder:

The rules for each tournament are clearly stated on the flyer published for that tournament. PLEASE READ THE RULES. There will be no exceptions to the rules.

FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Flagler County Inshore Fishing Report, November 2024

Fishing Report brought to you by Chris Crego with Skinny Water Lures

Overview:

The inshore fishing scene in Palm Coast, Florida has been absolutely thriving lately, with a solid mix of species making their way through the estuaries, flats, and mangroves. With cooler temperatures settling in, water conditions are stabilizing and baitfish are abundant, creating prime opportunities for anglers to get out and target a variety of game fish. Redfish, trout, snook, and flounder are all in good numbers, and the bite has been steady throughout the week.



Water Conditions:

Water temps are in the mid-70s, which is perfect for targeting a wide range of inshore species. The clarity has been excellent in most areas, with some spots in the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) seeing clearer water thanks to the lower winds. In the backcountry, though, you'll find some areas with a bit more tannin stain, which often holds fish a bit tighter to structure, making for some exciting, close-range fishing.

Species Breakdown:

Redfish (Slot Reds & Big Bulls):

The redfish bite has been strong, with fish ranging from slot-sized (18-27 inches) to some big bulls pushing over 30 inches. Most of the action has been in the early mornings and late afternoons when the reds are actively feeding on schools of mullet and shrimp in the shallows. Look for them around oyster bars, grass flats, and mangrove edges. Topwater baits like Skinny Water Lures peanuts and spook jr style have been working well early in the day, while soft plastics like the Skinny Water Lures Twitch Bait and paddle tails have been productive throughout the day, especially in the 3-4 inch range.

Trout:

Spotted seatrout have been plentiful, especially on the grass flats and deeper channels. The bite has been best in the early mornings, just as the sun starts to rise. Live shrimp, if you can find them, have been a go-to bait, but artificial lures like the Skinny Water Lures Paddle Tails, as well as SWL twitch baits, are also effective. Keep an eye on the changing tides as trout often move into the shallows to feed on baitfish during rising water and retreat back to deeper holes as the tide recedes.

Snook:

Snook fishing has been solid, especially in the warmer, shallower waters closer to the mangroves. A lot of the snook are holding around structure like docks, pilings, and mangrove roots, especially as they begin their transition toward their winter haunts. Try throwing a larger paddle tail or twitch bait, which are good choices for covering water. Early mornings are best for snook, with some fish also active during the outgoing tide.

Flounder:

Flounder fishing has seen a bit of a resurgence this month, with some nice flatfish hanging out near drop-offs, deeper holes, and around sandy points near grass flats. Live mullet or small pinfish on a jig head have been working great, but soft plastics like the 4inch SWL curly tail grub or a small paddle tail rigged on a light jig head are also effective. Fish slow along the bottom for the best chances of a hook-up.

Other Species:

While reds, trout, snook, and flounder have been the primary targets, there's still plenty of action from species like black drum, sheepshead, and mangrove snapper. Look for black drum around deeper flats and oyster bars, while sheepshead are hanging around the pilings and dock structures, particularly as they start to prepare for the winter months. Mangrove snapper have been hitting cut baits, shrimp, and small jigs in the deeper holes near the ICW.

Tackle & Techniques:

As always, light to medium tackle has been the key to success in Palm Coast's inshore waters. A 7-8 foot medium-action rod paired with a 2500-3000 series reel is perfect for throwing both live bait and artificials. For leaders, a 15-20lb Mono leader is recommended, especially when fishing for species like snook and redfish that have sharp teeth and are known for making fast, aggressive runs.

For artificial lures, look for soft plastics in natural colors like white, chartreuse, and olive green. Topwater lures are always a fun choice for reds and snook during the morning hours, and twitch baits are great for enticing trout and snook in both shallow and deeper waters. As for live bait, shrimp, mullet, and pinfish are all in abundance and are sure to attract a variety of species.

Conclusion:

The inshore fishing in Palm Coast is shaping up to be fantastic for the next few weeks, with great action for both beginners and seasoned anglers alike. Whether you're targeting reds, trout, snook, or flounder, the bite is consistent, and the weather is perfect for getting out on the water. The fishing should remain strong through the coming weeks as cooler temps bring fish closer to shore, and the fall and winter patterns set in. If you haven't already, now's the time to get out there!

Welcome New Members/Visitors/Welcome Annual Sponsors – There were 7 new members in attendance tonight. NOVEMBER MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Club picnic is free, cost is \$4,000.00. Christmas party cost we are charged is \$95.00, we charge you \$55.00, The Bottom Trip on the party boat, we put in \$2,000.00. Upcoming/New Business: Mike reviewed the Red, White & Blue Tournament and said a Calcutta costing \$5.00, total weight of the three species - winner takes all will be held. Any species that are not caught, a drawing of the Show-Up tickets will be held.

BREAK

Speaker: Capt. Lehman Norman from Local Knowledge Charters, he will talk about catching Snook. He said he grew up here in Florida and is now a charter captain. A while back, snook wasn't caught that much but now they are in our area. He uses a top water or a live shrimp as bait and fishes at night around lighted docks. He uses a trolling motor at night and marks on his phone where the snook are. When you are fishing around people's docks, make sure you don't hit the dock. He gets most of his snook in June & July, target them during slack tide. In St. Augustine on jetty, works well. Snook hit it and get it and then they run for structure. You might catch as many as 15 a year. Snook like a fresh water feed, they start out life as a small male and then change over to a female, then get bigger to be slot size. If temperature is 70 degrees, don't throw a topwater, it works better when the temperature is over 70 degrees. He uses a rapala knot, when the lure disappears, set the hook. For snook and flounder he uses a white 4" grub and ¼" jighead. The population of snook is finally coming back. He gives it 30-35 minutes to try to catch a snook, he also uses blue camo braid the most. He doesn't use swivels he puts the mono and braid together with two uni-knots, a double uni-knot or a rapala knot and he doesn't troll.
