3. Do not force them: Let them play in the bait bucket or the live well, let them splash in the water. Remember YOU are NOT fishing.

4. Gear: Buy them their own fishing pole, tackle box, stock it with their tackle and fishing tools. Let them order the bait at the bait shop.

5. Lures/ Artificial: If they are anything like my boys were and some still are, throw it out and reel it back in (casting practice) they may catch a fish.

6. Let them do it: Casting, Baiting, Reeling, help them when they ask. Offer to help.

When I taught my boys, I wanted to fish, I wanted to catch, I wanted to eat fish. Fortunately, all three boys have survived to this point at least. They have become my fishing buddies even though they are now grown and starting their own life.

However, after reading Nick's article; I think back to the time that I truly missed with my boys and I do not want that for you. When I become a grandfather (not any time soon) I hope that I remember Nick's article and listen to my own advice.

FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.**Flagler County Fishing Report**

As the summer draws near our outside and water temperatures increase. No surprise right, just like fish we like cooler temperatures. How many times have you been outside and just wanted the shade of a tree, a breeze? Each species of fish has a temperature they like to be in. If it gets hot or too cold, they will move to change their environment. The same goes for salinity and cloudiness. Water temperature also plays an important role in oxygen levels in the water. As the water heats up, it cannot hold as much oxygen and this is why during the summer the live shrimp you buy from the bait stores, die when you place them in the water behind your house. This will also cause the fish to leave an area.

Most boat anglers have a fish finder or chart plotter onboard. These electronics typically give you a near surface water temperature. To use this feature to find fish, watch your temperature and even the slightest change may have a large impact on the fish holding in the area or biting. When the tide changes, so does the water temperature, this may only be a few degrees but it can make a huge difference. In-shore; outgoing tides will increase the water temperature in the creeks and river, as it is coming from the mud flats and marsh areas where it has had a chance to be heated by the sun. With an incoming tide you can expect a slightly cooler water to flow into those areas. Our inshore waters are not deep enough to have a thermocline which is two different temperatures of water stacked in layers. For us, this will be more prevalent off-shore.

For the shore anglers the same applies. I will offer this bit of advice to a shore angler, get your feet wet or stick in your hand. It will give you an indication of the temperature.

When the water temperatures are high, I look for the cooler waters. I also look for shaded areas as this will do two things. One it helps lower the temperature of the water. Secondly, it gives the fish that I am targeting an advantage of concealment. Another thing that boat anglers do is to find deeper water, generally deeper water is cooler. This can also work for shore-based anglers; however, you will need to do a lot of search casting. Which is to cast into the different areas you are fishing and pay attention to how long it takes for your bait or weight to hit bottom. This will not tell you the depth of the water, though it will help locate deeper areas of water.

FISHING REPORT CONTINUED

This past week the trout bite has picked up. I am getting reports from the toll bridge up to the inlet. The anglers that have been using live croaker have had the most success in the early morning or late evening with the trout. Around the inlet there have been some black drum, flounder, a few redfish and a handful of sheepshead. Just outside of the inlet I have reports of Spanish Mackerel, which should be moving over the bar as you read this report. I also have reports of tarpon on the flats north of the inlet. There has also been a report of the pompano and some larger whiting moving north from Daytona on a morning bite. I would look for the clean water in the morning before the winds pick up. As we move into the afternoon/evening thunderstorms expect the waters in the river to get dirty from the runoff.

The May Fish of the Month was Amberjack and we will announce the winner at the June Meeting.



Don't forget to bring your approved Flagler Fishing Club Bump Board with you when you are out fishing. All Year Long fish species are eligible and just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year. One additional ticket into the drawing is obtained for each 5 additional submissions so the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize.

June's Fish of the Month is Snapper (not Red)

We have a new supply of our official bump boards available to buy for \$20. If you wish to use your own bump board, it needs to be approved by the club and a sticker attached to be legal. Bump boards are available at club meetings and Hammock Bait and Tackle. Cash only at Hammock Bait and Tackle.



CPR photos must be caught in State of Florida waters and meet FWC requirements including in season, length, and proper measuring method. Please check FWC rules to make sure you are measuring properly (i.e. nose to tail, pinch the tail, nose to fork etc). Photos not meeting FWC requirements will be deleted.

****NOTICE** - The overall species Leaders and Full Point Standings are updated at the end of each month on the club website:
flaglersportfishing.com
 Then under Fishing click on YearLong Club Standings.

Please note that for the species yearlong tournament, if your fish is not heavier than the 6th place fish for that particular species in the Men's or Ladies' standings, there is no need to weigh-in the fish. Points are only given for places 1 through 6.



WEIGH MASTER REPORT CONTINUED

You can see the standings for both the Yearlong Species and Year Long CPR tournaments by going to the club web page and clicking on Fishing then Yearlong Club Standings.

This is a table to show how the weight of your fish is calculated in the yearlong species tournament standings. The weight is calculated in pounds carried out two decimal places. Simply replace the two decimals in the standings with the corresponding ounces in the table.

0.06 lbs	=	1 oz	0.56 lbs	=	9 ozs

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the tournament weigh-ins are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station. CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize as noted on the tournament flyers.


JUNE MEMBER MEETING GUEST SPEAKER GREG KUCHAREWSKI FROM PLAY HOOK-E FROM PTSD

We managed to hook a good size fish that Carson had the thrill of reeling in till the line gave way. He said, "I was going to let it go anyway."

Little did Carson know that he helped me let go of my gloomy day too. Thank you, Carson!


