FROM THE HELM BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Dear Flagler Sportfishing Club Members,

Snook season is upon us, as we all are aware snook Season opens / opened September 1 st and the fishing lies have it they are around. So, before the water gets too cold for them, here are some tips that may allow you to get one in the slot.

1. Timing is Everything

Snook are most active during dusk, dawn, and especially during tidal changes. Moving water triggers feeding behavior, so focus on fishing around the high or low tide when current is strongest. Night fishing around dock lights and bridges is also highly effective, as snook are ambush predators and will wait in shadows to strike baitfish attracted to light.

2. Target the Right Locations

Snook can often be found around inlets, creek mouths, mangroves, oyster bars, bridge pilings, seawalls, and dock structures. Look for areas with structure and current, snook use structure as cover and rely on the current to bring food to them.

3. Use the Right Bait

Live bait is highly effective for snook. Finger mullet, pinfish, croaker and shrimp are all excellent choices. Finger mullet is especially effective during the fall mullet run, when snook actively feed on them.

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FROM THE HELM CONTINUED

Free-line a live bait near structure or under docks with minimal weight for the most natural presentation.

If you prefer artificial lures, soft plastic swimbaits, jerkbaits, and topwater plugs work well, particularly in low-light conditions. A favorite method is tossing a walk-the-dog style topwater lure early in the morning around mangrove points or docks, be ready for explosive strikes.

4. Tackle and Gear

Snook are strong fighters and often head straight for structure when hooked. Use medium to medium-heavy spinning gear with a fast action rod to handle their power. A 3000 - 4000 size reel with 15 - 30 lbs. braided line and a 30 - 40 lbs. fluorocarbon leader is ideal. The leader is crucial because snook have sharp gill plates that can cut lighter line during the fight.

5. Practice Catch and Release

Handle fish carefully, avoid removing them from the water if possible, and release them quickly to ensure their survival.


Annual Local Brands Expo 2025 Recap

OVERNIGHT TOURNAMENT RECAP BY PAT LAURIENTI




Congratulations to all of our winners!

FISHING REPORT BY CHRIS CREGO

Chris from Skinny Water Lures brings you this month's Flagler County Fishing Report

The inshore bite around Palm Coast has been steady, with plenty of opportunities for anglers willing to cover some water.



Redfish:

Flood tides have been bringing fish up into the grass, and sight-fishing has been productive. Reds are tailing tight in the spartina, but they're spooky—lighter presentations like the Skinny Water Lures Creature Bait rigged weedless have been key to getting bites. On lower tides, work the oyster edges and creek mouths with the SWL Paddle Tail in Smoked Mullet—a proven color that's been producing consistent slots in the 22–26" range, with a few overs.

Trout:

The trout bite has been solid during early mornings on the flats. Topwater action has been hot with the Skinny Water Lures Topwater Plug, especially over potholes and grass edges. We've seen multiple fish in the 20–24" class willing to smash a plug before the sun gets too high. As the day heats up, switch to paddle tails bounced a little deeper for a steady bite.

Snook & Flounder:

Snook have been showing up around dock lights and creek mouths—working a SWL Twitch Bait or smaller paddle tail has fooled a few quality fish. Flounder are holding tight to structure and oyster bars; slow-rolling a Curly Tail Grub has been producing keeper-sized flatfish.

Skinny Water Lures Tip of the month:

Match the hatch. With schools of mullet pushing through, darker colors like Green Goblin and Smoke Mullet are blending right in and drawing more strikes. Keep your presentation natural, and you'll get rewarded.



September's Fish of the Month is Redfish

Congratulations to our recent Fish of the Month Winner, Chuck Dykes. Chuck's Flounder weighed in at 4lbs-6oz. The August Fish of the Month was Spotted Seatrout and the winner will be announced at the September meeting.

The September Fish of the Month is Redfish. Please remember that the slot limit for Redfish is a minimum of 18 inches and a maximum of 27 inches. Don't forget to pinch the tail for all of your entries in all of our competitions, Fish of the Month, Yearlong, and CPR.

Don't forget to bring your approved Flagler Fishing Club Bump Board with you when you are out fishing. Official bump boards available to buy for \$20 at any of our club meetings. They are also available (cash only) at Hammock Bait and Tackle. If you have another brand of bump board, please see me to approve the accuracy and obtain a Flagler Sportfishing Club sticker to place on your bump board.

For our CPR Competition, all Year Long fish species are eligible and just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year. One additional ticket into the drawing is obtained for each 5 additional submissions so the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize.

CPR photos must be caught in State of Florida waters and meet FWC requirements including in season, length, and proper measuring method. Please check FWC rules to make sure you are measuring properly (i.e. nose to tail, pinch the tail, nose to fork etc). Photos not meeting FWC requirements will be deleted.

Please note that for the species yearlong tournament, if your fish is not heavier than the 6th place fish for that particular species in the Men's or Ladies' standings, there is no need to weigh-in the fish. Points are only given for places 1 through 6.







WEIGH MASTER REPORT CONTINUED

This is a table to show how the weight of your fish is calculated in the yearlong species tournament standings. The weight is calculated in pounds carried out two decimal places. Simply replace the two decimals in the standings with the corresponding ounces in the table.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the tournament weigh-ins are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station.

CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize as noted on the tournament flyers.

Upcoming/New Business

Club Changes – Mike Vickers Jr. and Ray McCall talked about needing volunteers to help run events and to help plan events to make the club better. Try running a tournament or club event!

Club Picnic & Swap & Shop – Mike said this year's picnic will be held on Oct. 18th at Herschel King Park. A chairperson or persons is still needed for this event.

BREAK

Speaker – Cpt. Mike Vickers, Jr – Topic was Boating Freedom Act SB1388. New Boating Laws. He said all boaters need to know about the changes that are now in effect. To get ALL the information on this topic, go to the FWC website and review what the many changes are.

FWC can't just stop you, they have to have probable cause. You have to have a Freedom Boater Safety Inspection Decal on your boat. You have to sign and attest that you have all the safety items on your boat when you go to the Tax Office to get your decal which is valid for no less than a year or no longer than 5 years but right now it is only a year. You can be pulled over for boat speed. Vessels under 16 ft. must have personal flotation devices a PFD that must have approved wearable Type 1, 2 or 3 devices on while vessel is running. Inside cabin is ok without it on. Fire extinguishers 5B, A,B,C,D class, type C is electrical and type D is for magnesium. Coastal waters – opening to ocean, greater than 2 miles you need a visual signaling device. A bell, whistle (like a coaches one) While in a kayak or on a paddle board, you must have a whistle. Vessel lighting above 16' you need intregrated lights. Kayaks and paddle boards must have a light. Larger vessels need higher types of safety equipment. Safety vests type 1 or 2 have to have 20 lbs of buoyancy. Type 1 can be stowed in the hatch. Type 2 vests don't have an expiration date – do safety inspection yourself. Always check the gauge on your fire extinguishers.

Type 3 – 15.5 can't be stowed in the hatch. Make sure to have a kill switch attached to your hand in case you become disabled while driving the boat.

The boater decal you have to get from the Tax Collector Office, it cannot be purchased online or through the FWC. The decal says you have safety equipment on board and the decal goes on the boat next to your registration tag. Watercraft Energy Source – is any source of energy used to power a watercraft includes gas, diesel fuel, electric, hydrogen & solar power. There are restrictions on the size of the energy source. In 2022 Lucy's Law was enacted, a girl lost her life on a chartered boat. The boat captain was not licensed, drunk and ran into a channel marker at a high rate of speed causing her death and another passenger was paralyzed for life. This act aligns boating regulations with a motor vehicle accident. The state can charge 1st to 3rd degree felony. If convicted, you can get your license suspended and it is called BWI – Boating while under the influence.

AUGUST MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Age Restrictions – there are no restrictions for jet skis or personal watercraft. You have to be 18 to rent a boat and 14 to operate after 1988 law requiring a boating safety course and you will receive an Education Card. Check out on Boatus.org at https://www.boatus.org/florida. Spend money on a radio for your boat put an MSI# in there to send a message to the U.S. Coast Guard. In case of emergencies. After 1988, you must have the Boater Card on your person. Take a boating safety course and make sure you understand all the rules on the water to keep safe.
