FROM THE HELM - BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Dear Flagler Sportfishing Club Members,

We have been heard, on September 11th 2025 a small group of us (anglers) stood before the Flagler Beach City Commissioners in protest of the impending city ordinance 2025-13 Surf Fishing Restrictions.

A number of us from the club stood up and spoke to them about wanting to take part in the drafting of this ordinance. We know that it is coming, they are going to restrict surf fishing in Flagler Beach, however we have the chance to affect this ordinance. As some of you are aware we started a petition opposing (to reject) this ordinance. As of now we have a total of 492 responses, 476 to reject the ordinance, 15 in support of the ordinance, 1 prefer not to answer. I am going to allow the petition to continue until we have an approved ordinance.

I received an email from Mr. Dale Martin (Flagler Beach City Manager) thanking us for wanting to be part of the solution and wanting to assist in developing this ordinance. At this upcoming meeting I will be asking for volunteers (there will be a sign-up sheet) that will be available on a Monday or Friday (Date TBD) to sit with myself and Mr. Martin to draft an ordinance to present to Flagler Beach City Commissioners. We may also want to have a meeting prior to meeting with Mr. Martin so that we may present a draft ordinance. This is your opportunity to stand-up and have your voice heard.

October will see our Catch Photo and Release Tournament on October 25, 2025. Prizes will be awarded for the longest fish in seven species. Take photo of your fish on club approved bump board and show photo to weigh master at the weigh-in. See flyer in this issue for more information.

November will bring our final free club tournament of 2025, the Red, White and Blue Tournament. Winning fish will be Red Drum, Whiting, and Blue Fish.

The yearlong Catch Photo and Release tournament is in full swing. 33 members have released over 575 legal fish in 12 distinct species. TOURNAMENT CHAIRMAN REPORT BY TIM MILLER**Pompano vs. Permit – Know the Difference!**

While Permit aren't often caught in our area, they can sometimes be confused with Pompano at weigh-ins. Here are a couple of quick tips:

- Permit have a deeper, rounder body with a blunter head, and their tail is large and sickle-shaped.
 - Pompano are slimmer with a more streamlined body and a less pronounced tail fork.
- Knowing the difference ensures accurate weigh-ins and keeps our tournaments fair!



FISHING REPORT BY CAPTAIN MIKE VICKERS JR.

Well the calendar says that Summer is over and Fall begins, however here in North-East Florida that is not the case. While we will have some slightly cooler temperatures, there is no real change for us.

Unlike our temperatures going down slightly, our bite will start heating up. As the northern waters start cooling down the fish will once again be migrating to warmer water. We can start looking for the Pompano to start their run south, trout should become more active and the fall flounder and sheepshead bite is just around the corner.

The Redfish (Red Drum) have been the target fish of many anglers as the fall mullet run has been sporadic. This week I learned a few things about mullet.

Since I was a child, I have always thought that mullet jumped from the water to escape a nearby predator. That is not the case, they are trying to get more oxygen and to flush irritants (sand/algae) from their gills as stated by H. Dickson Hoese Department of Biology, University of Southwestern Louisiana in his paper "Jumping mullet - the internal diving bell hypothesis," Environmental Biology of Fishes Vol. 13, No. 4, pp. 309-314,1985.

Redfish are being caught in Matanzas Inlet. There are multiple ways to fish for them from the bridge or the shoreline. From the bridge I like using a 5oz-6oz egg weight with a 12"-18" leader using a 4/0 circle hook. Using this rig, I will use live or whole dead finger mullet, hooking the live mullet through the upper lip and slightly in to the boney structure of the nose. With a dead finger mullet, fillet from the tail up about mid-way through the bait on both sides of the back bone and then hooking them through the chin and out the boney structure of the nose. Doing this allows the fillets to remain attached and flutter in the current like a struggling live bait or cut it into chunks. From the shore you can use the same rig as above with the exception of a weight change. From the shore I will replace the egg sinker with a pyramid sinker if fishing from the north bank. On the south bank where there are rocks, I would use a bank style sinker as it has a rounder shape and less (not guaranteed) likely to get hung up in the rocks. The first of the outgoing tide seems to be the key to the bite; however, the turn of any tide should provide nice fish. If you are fishing the bridge I would recommend getting there early as the spots fill up fast.

In the back or mud flats our local captains are reporting Flounder, Trout, small Snook and Redfish. The docks have been holding some nice Mangrove (grey) snapper. For those of you looking for that slot snook the intracoastal bridges from Palm Coast to High bridge have been reported with slot snook using Live croaker, mullet or a suspending bait early mornings or at night under the lights.

As always, stay safe, keep the rod tip up and the lines tight and remember that the "Fishing Lies Start Here."

The September Fish of the Month was Redfish and the winner will be announced at the October meeting. In October we will have Black Drum as the fish of the month.


Don't forget to pinch the tail for all of your entries in all of our competitions, Fish of the Month, Yearlong, and CPR so don't forget to bring your approved Flagler Fishing Club Bump Board with you when you are out fishing. Official bump boards available to buy for \$20 at any of our club meetings. They are also available (cash only) at Hammock Bait and Tackle. If you have another brand of bump board, please see me to approve the accuracy and obtain a Flagler Sportfishing Club sticker to place on your bump board.

At our monthly tournaments or any other tournaments that we host, please be sure to check in with the Weighmaster by the end of the check-in time. If you come early to the weigh-in, you can place your fish bag at the weigh-in area and be sure to check in with the Weighmaster. If you have a live fish in the live well, check in as soon as you arrive so you will be placed in line for your weigh-in. You will need to stay in the area close enough to hear your name called when it is time to weigh your fish. If not, you will be moved to the end of the line. Do not go to the registration first if you have a fish to weigh-in! Go to the weighmaster first and then register your attendance. This will be discussed further at the October meeting.

For our CPR Competition, all Year Long fish species are eligible and just one CPR submission gets you into the CPR drawing at the end of the year. One additional ticket into the drawing is obtained for each 5 additional submissions so the more photos you submit, the better your chances of winning a great prize.

CPR photos must be caught in State of Florida waters and meet FWC requirements including in season, length, and proper measuring method. Please check FWC rules to make sure you are measuring properly (i.e. nose to tail, pinch the tail, nose to fork etc). Photos not meeting FWC requirements will be deleted.

WEIGH MASTER REPORT CONTINUED

Please note that for the species Yearlong Tournament, if your fish is not heavier than the 6th place fish for that particular species in the Men’s or Ladies’ standings, there is no need to weigh-in the fish. Points are only given for places 1 through 6.

0.06 lbs = 1 oz	0.56 lbs = 9 ozs
0.13 lbs = 2 ozs	0.63 lbs = 10 ozs
0.19 lbs = 3 ozs	0.69 lbs = 11 ozs
0.25 lbs = 4 ozs	0.75 lbs = 12 ozs
0.31 lbs = 5 ozs	0.81 lbs = 13 ozs
0.38 lbs = 6 ozs	0.88 lbs = 14 ozs
0.44 lbs = 7 ozs	0.94 lbs = 15 ozs
0.5 lbs = 8 ozs	1 lb = 16 ozs

This is a table to show how the weight of your fish is calculated in the yearlong species tournament standings. The weight is calculated in pounds carried out two decimal places. Simply replace the two decimals in the standings with the corresponding ounces in the table.

A reminder for everyone fishing in our tournaments. All fish must comply with FWC rules. Fish weighed in for our club tournaments must be caught in St. Johns, Flagler, and Volusia counties. Fish being photographed and released for CPR entry must be caught in state of Florida waters.

Fish brought to the tournament weigh-ins are required to be measured on the official club bump board before being weighed. Please take your fish to the bump board at the weigh table before putting it on the scale. If you weigh in a fish at a club tournament, I will enter the data in the Yearlong Tournament. There is no need to take the fish to a weigh station.

CPR photos for tournaments must be shown to the weighmaster at the tournament and must include a timestamp on the photo to be eligible to win a prize as noted on the tournament flyers.

Surf Fishing Restricted Surf Fishing Ord. 2025-13

Mike Vickers said this is a Restricted Fishing Ordinance in the first reading right now – close access to fishing. There was a complaint to the Flagler Commission Board that swimmers have nowhere to swim, they want to make an area for swimmers only. The Board will be holding meetings on the 2nd Thursday and the 4th Thursday of Sept. The next date will be Thurs., Sept. 11th at 5 PM at the town hall in Flagler Beach. Go to this meeting to protest or give your opinions. Roy Mattson, our guest speaker tonight, plans to be there and said people should be swimming while the lifeguard tower is open and swim in front of that and that is where the swimmers should be swimming for safety. Suggestion was made for the club to put out to the members, a club petition that could be filled out online and it could be presented to the Commission. We need to take action and fill out the petition.

Information – Yellow Dawg Bait Shop at High Bridge in Ormond, will be closed until 9/19/25 for repaving of the parking lot.

Snook season is from Sept. 1st to Dec. 14th, 2025. If you are 65 or older, you are exempt from getting a fishing license, you don't need the snook stamp. Otherwise, to keep a snook you have to have a stamp for it.

SEPTEMBER MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Speaker – Roy Mattson from Roy's Surf Fishing Service, www.Royssurfishing.com

Roy said he runs a Surf Fishing Challenge and asked if we would like to see something like that come to Flagler Co. for next spring. Many hands were raised. He has ads in the Hunting/Fishing magazine, that can be found at Yellow Dawg Bait Shop and Hammock Bait & Tackle. He said he will be at City Hall in Flagler to give his opinions on the Surf Anglers VS the Swimmers on Flagler Beach and suggested anyone attending the meeting to wear their club shirts. He uses a 13" Surf Caster pole and fishes 3 hours before high tide. Flounder are heavy in the inlet, use prominent fish – finger mullet for bait. Fish around the inlet and around the beach. There is good fishing with the water coming from the north – cool water. For Flounder on the bottom, use 1-1 ½ flat sinkers, 14-16" monofilament leader with Kale hook- that was the name of a hook before the circle hook came along. Go along the eyeball of the mullet to hook the bait. Use a 3 oout circle hook for reds with a 2 ft. leader and go east to the bridge. In backwaters for flounder, throw a distance and slowly bring it in. At Ft. Matanzas, left on piling, goes to the East, holes and oyster bars are there and you can get flounder. At Matanzas Creek along the docks you can get flounder. Black Drum move all along the river. Hard for boaters to fish under the Matanzas bridge. Live crab or sandfleas are good bait for Black Drum. In Matanzas River, at the 1st creek drop, there have been black drum caught that weighed near 50 lbs. West of the river in creek, there are lots of Black Drum and past Marineland in Pelicier Creek there are many Redfish, you can use sand fleas for bait. Speckled trout have moved toward the inlet because of a lot of rain. You can catch more fish with a medium to small shrimp – you don't need a huge shrimp. Board decision – he wants to hold a Fishing for Reel event. As an artificial bait, he uses Pompano Bananas. He used to run Flagler Pier. Roy brought gift bags to raffle off and everyone got a blue raffle ticket for a chance to win. Many won bags with short or long spudnik sinkers, fishbites, Pompano rigs and Cookie Zimmer & Cliff Germano won a Fishing Charter with him.

Attendance – There were 39 signed-in attendance, which included staff. Three possible new members, but they didn't turn in their applications yet.
